



7. REQUEST CHIT POLICY IN REGARDS TO LEAVE AND LIBERTY: Special request chits for leave shall be submitted to the personnel office 4 working days prior to date of commencement of leave; except in the case of scheduled leave periods, in which case all chits shall be submitted at least 15 days prior to the commencement of date desired. Leave chits shall be submitted via the chain of command to the Executive Officer. Special request chits for special liberty and standby will be thoroughly screened by division officers prior to final approval by the department head. It must be remembered that special liberty is for personnel who merit special recognition by virtue of sustained superior performance.

8. UCMJ:Art 139 Redress of injuries to property.

Whenever complaint is made to any commanding officer that willful damage has been done to the property of any person or that his property has been wrongfully taken by members of the armed forces,, he may, under such regulations as the Secretary concerned may prescribe, convene a board to investigate the complaint. The board shall consist of from one to three commissioned officers and, for the purpose of that investigation, it has power to summon witnesses and examine them upon oath, to receive depositions or other documentary evidence, and to assess the damages sustained against the responsible parties. The assessment of damages made by the board is subject to the approval of the commanding officer, and in the amount approved by him shall be charged against the pay of the offenders. The order of the commanding officer directing charges herein authorized is conclusive on any disbursing officer for the payment by him to the injured parties of the damages so assessed and approved.

If the offenders cannot be ascertained, but the organization or detachment to which they belong is known, charges totaling the amount of damages assessed and approved may be made in such proportion as may be considered just upon the individual members thereof who are shown to have been present at the scene at the time the damages complained of were inflicted, as determined by the approved findings of the board.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS: Article 4202 SORM: ALARMS, BELLS, and GENERAL ANNOUNCING SYSTEMS

1. No person, without proper authority or without due cause, shall tamper with, operate, or otherwise disturb any contact maker used to sound the general or chemical alarm.
2. The general announcing system (IMC) shall not be used without permission of the officer-of-the-deck, except in emergencies. The use of this system shall be held to a minimum, consistent with the efficient operation of the ship and shall be restricted to matters of general importance. Words shall not be passed for officers or enlisted men except in emergencies or when their immediate presence is necessary for the proper operation of the ship or important equipment. Care shall be exercised so that only necessary circuits are used when a word is passed.
3. No person shall ring the ship's bell without permission of the officer-of-the-deck, and then only to indicate the time, as a fire alarm, or as a fog signal when at anchor.
4. Boat gongs shall be sounded only by direction of the officer of-the-deck to indicate the prospective departure of officers boats and the arrival and departure of visiting commanding officers, flag officers and the command officer.

2. SAFETY REGULATION: Article 4302 SORM: BOATS:

1. When embarked in a boat, the senior officer (including commissioned warrant and warrant officer), eligible for command at sea, has authority over all persons embarked therein, and is responsible under all circumstances for the safety and management of the boat (U. S. Navy Regulations, 1948, Article 1331).

2. No passenger in a ship's boat shall modify the orders of the officer of the deck to the coxswain of the boat without due cause, and in doing so, such person shall assume full responsibility for the consequences of his order.

3. The coxswain, or boat officer when assigned, shall be responsible to the commanding officer for the enforcement of these boat regulations.

4. No ship's boat shall be loaded beyond the capacities established by the commanding officer and published in the boat instructions, without specific permission of the command duty office and then only in emergencies.

5. No person shall smoke in a ship's boat under any circumstance.

6. Except in an emergency, no person other than those specifically designated by the engineer officer shall:

a. Operate or attempt to operate a boat engine.

b. Test, remove, or charge a boat's battery, or tamper in any way with the boat's electrical system.

c. Fuel a ship's boat.

7. No person shall be assigned as a member of a boat crew unless he is a qualified swimmer, has demonstrated a practical knowledge of boat seamanship, rules of the nautical road and boat safety precautions, and has been duly qualified for his particular assignment by the first lieutenant.

8. All persons in boats being hoisted in or out, or suspended from davits, shall wear vest-type life jackets.

9. No person shall board a boat from a boat boom unless another person is standing by on deck or in a boat at the same boom.

10. All members of a boat's crew shall wear rubber soled canvas shoes when embarked in a ship's boat.

3. ARTICLE 138, UCMJ: Complaints of wrongs: Any member of the armed forces who believes himself wronged by his commanding officer, and who, upon due application to that commanding officer, is refused redress, may complain to any superior commissioned officer, who shall forward the complaint to the officer exercising general court-martial jurisdiction over the officer against whom it is made. The officer exercising general court-martial jurisdiction shall examine into the complaint and take proper measures for redressing the wrong complained of; and he shall, as soon as possible, send to the Secretary concerned a true statement of that complaint, with proceedings had thereon.

4. FAMILY SEPARATION ALLOWANCE: All eligible personnel (E-4 over 4 and E-5 and above) who have not already done so, report to personnel not later than 1600 today to fill out FSA forms.

5. SOUND POWERED PHONES: Never leave the telephones adrift or exposed to the weather.

6. SN/FN/Military Leadership exams; Will be given 6 April 1971. Division Officers insure all required entries and recommendations are submitted to the personnel office prior to 1600, 1 April 1971.




13. PAINTING IN UNVENTILATED SPACES:

6. REDRESS OF INJURIES TO PROPERTY ART 139 UCMJ.

(a) Whenever a complaint is made to any commanding officer that willful damage has been done to the property of any person or that his property has been wrongfully taken by members of the armed forces, he may under such regulations as the Secretary concerned may proscribe, convene a board to investigate the complaint. The board shall consist of from one to three commissioned officers and for the purpose of that investigation it has the power to summon witnesses and examine them upon oath, to receive depositions or other documentary evidence and to assess the damages sustained against the responsible parties. The assessment of damages made by the board is subject to the approval of the commanding officer, and in the amount approved by him shall be charged against the pay of the offenders. The order of the commanding officer directing charges herein authorized is conclusive on any disbursing officer for the payment by him to the injured parties of the damages so assessed and approved.

(b) If the offenders cannot be ascertained, but the organization or detachment to which they belong is known, charges totaling the amount of damages assessed and approved may be made in such proportion as may be considered just upon the individual members thereof who are shown to have been present at the scene at the time the damages complained of were inflicted, as determined by the approved findings of the board.

7. GENERAL REGULATIONS: Article 4203 SORM:

ALCOHOL AND NARCOTICS: In ships to which no medical officer is attached, all alcohol, alcoholic beverages, and narcotics shall be in the custody of the alcohol and narcotics control officer, except small quantities of necessary narcotics which may be issued to the leading petty officer in the medical department. The bulk alcohol and narcotics shall, if possible, be kept in a three combination safe or, if this is not possible, under lock and key. All transactions between the bulk custodian and medical department representative shall be receipted for. Issues from the working stock in the sick bay shall be covered by prescription. Narcotics and alcohols shall be inventoried monthly by a special inventory board appointed for this purpose.

It is forbidden for anyone other than those specifically authorized personnel to have in his possession, consume or introduce on board this ship or any of the ship's boats, any alcohol, alcoholic beverages, narcotics (including marijuana), or other dangerous drugs not classified as narcotics but unfit for self medication.

8. SAFETY REGULATIONS: Article 4303 SORM:

CLEANING AGENTS. Under no circumstances shall any person use gasoline as a cleaning agent. No person shall use alcohol as a cleaning agent without specific permission of his head of department, and then only in accordance with material maintenance instructions. Paint thinners and similiar agents shall be used only in the paint locker by persons specifically assigned to duty therein. No person shall use chlorinated solvents (carbontetrachloride and trichlorethylene) for any purpose whatever without permission of proper authority, and then only when the space in which they are being used is continuously and adequately ventilated.

No person shall be assigned to operate or adjust electrical and electronic equipment unless he has demonstrated a practical knowledge of its operation and repair and of all applicable safety precautions and then only when duly qualified by the head of department having cognizance over such equipment. No person shall hang anything on, or secure a line to, any power cable, antenna or other electrical or electronic equipment. No person shall paint over or otherwise destroy or mutilate markings, nameplates, or other identification on any electrical or electronic equipment.

(OVER)

No person shall approach closer than two feet to a radar or radio transmitting antenna, unless it has been deenergized, and then only to make an authorized repair or adjustment to such antenna.

3. 

Since there will be no outgoing U.S. Mail until after our visit it is permissible to start referring to our stop there in letters to home. The below press release is quoted for information and subsequent POD's will contain specific questions and answers relating to the Communications Facility to be constructed on DIEGO GARCIA.

"The government of the United Kingdom and the Government of the United States announced today, 15 December 1970, that construction will commence in March 1971 of an austere Naval Communications Facility on DIEGO GARCIA Atoll in the Chagos Archipelago, British Indian Ocean Territory. The facility is being built under the terms of a bilateral agreement between the U.K. and the U.S., signed in December 1966, which makes the islands of the British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) available to the U.S. and U.K. governments for defense activities for 50 years. The facility will consist of communications, and minimum necessary support activities, including an airstrip. Construction of the facility will be accomplished by the United States. Units of the U.S. Naval Construction Force will build it. Both the British and American Flags will fly over the facility and the United Kingdom will assist in its manning.

The facility will close a gap in the U.S. Naval Communication System. It will provide communications support to the U.S. and U.K. ships and aircraft in the Indian Ocean. It is expected to be completed in less than three years."

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS: Article 4207, BULLETIN BOARDS - For the purpose of this article, the term "division officers" shall include all ship's division officers and all other officers in charge of personnel embarked in this ship but not regularly assigned to a division of the ship. All division officers shall maintain a bulletin board prominently located in a readily accessible space assigned to their division, and shall post thereon immediately, all applicable directives and orders, including the plan of the day, which affects the personnel of their division. 5. DIEGO GARCIA - QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:

Q. Where is Diego Garcia?

A. Diego Garcia is centrally located in the Indian Ocean, approximately 960 miles south of Ceylon, 1070 miles northeast of Mauritius and 1,710 miles west of Cocos, its coordinates are 70° 25' East, Longitude at 7° 15' South Latitude.

Q. What is the purpose of the facility?

A. To close a gap in our worldwide communications system and to provide communications support to U.S. and U.K. ships and aircraft in the Indian Ocean.

Q. What is meant by a communications facility?

A. An activity outfitted to provide communications support to ships and aircraft.

Q. Will ships be able to use the facility at Diego Garcia?

A. Turning basin accommodations will be sufficient to provide for sea borne replenishment of the facility.

Q. What will be the depth of the channel and turning basin?

A. The depth of water will be sufficient to accommodate the replenishment ships.

Q. How long and what is the purpose of the runway?

A. The 8,000 foot runway is for support of logistic aircraft.

Q. HOW MUCH WILL THE FACILITY COST?

A. As currently planned, construction of the facility will cost about \$19 million.

Q. Is the U.K. sharing construction cost?

A. No. The principal requirement lies with the U.S. and the U.S. is funding the project.

6. SEVENTH FLEET ANNIVERSARY: on 15 March 1971 the U.S. Seventh Fleet will celebrate its 28th year as the greatest seagoing peace keeping force in the world. It is certainly significant that as on many other anniversaries the occasion is observed at sea engaged in a hot war. During the nearly three decades since Seventh Fleet was established, the waters of the Western Pacific have been mostly troubled, but without her stabilizing influence, there might have been many more hot wars. Born of the southwest force and world war II in 1943, Seventh Fleet quickly gained stature and renown with its magnificent performance in one of the greatest naval engagements in history--The Battle of Leyte Gulf in the Philippines. Since then the officers and men of the Seventh Fleet have distinguished themselves in combat time and again in: limited wars such as Korea and Vietnam. They have been called upon to lend a hand in highly explosive situations such as the shelling of Matsu and Quemoy by the Communist Chinese. Even today we live with the Soviet Navy in a sensitive balance of sea power aimed at keeping the sea lanes open to the world. Though these many years of adversity, it has been the U.S. Navyman himself who has breathed life into these steel gray ships and aircraft and given the fleet--its personality ---its identity. Through their stamina, resourcefulness and moral courage, these men--many of them younger than the fleet itself--have enabled this fleet to sustain the cause of freedom and security both here in the western Pacific and at home. I am convinced more than ever after many years of service in this part of the world, that we have never had better men in the fleet than we have today and it is with the deepest sense of personal pride that I serve today as commander Seventh Fleet. 8. DIEGO GARCIA - QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:

Q. Who will command the facility, an American or British Officer?

A. An American Officer.

Q. What are the terms of the agreement under which this facility is being built?

A. The facility is being built under the terms of a Bilateral Agreement between the U.K. and the U.S., signed in December 1966, which makes the islands of the British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) available to the U.S. and U.K. government for defense activities for 50 years.

Q. Will nuclear or CBW weapons be stored at the facility?

A. It is the policy of the United States neither to confirm nor to deny the presence of such weapons.

Q. What are the possibilities of confrontation between U.S. and Soviet Naval Forces in this area, since the Soviets seem to be bargaining for bases elsewhere in the Indian Ocean area?

A. No more than any other location where units of both forces operate.

Q. Does this imply a U.S. build-up in the Indian Ocean?

A. No.

Q. What is the expected reaction from Arab, African, and other States which border on the Indian Ocean?

A. Neither the modest size of this facility nor the support activities planned there should provide grounds for concern among the countries bordering on the Indian Ocean, who have been informed regarding this subject.

Q. How many U.S. and U.K. military personnel will be permanently assigned to Diego Garcia?

A. About 275, including a small number of U.K. personnel.

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS: CARD GAMES AND GAMBLING. Article 4208
 No person shall:

1. Gamble for money with playing cards, dice, or other apparatus on board this ship.

2. MEMORABILIA AND TRIVIA: MONTICELLO crossed the equator and International Date Line simultaneously while enroute from Pearl Harbor to Sydney. USS CHARLESTON crossed the equator and Greenwich Meridian, precisely on the opposite side of the world, enroute from Monrovia, Liberia to Diego Garcia.

3. MAIL: A small amount of incoming mail is expected to be received from the Charleston when they arrive at Diego Garcia.

4. AIR BEDDING: Operations and Supply Departments air bedding on the 01, 02 and 03 levels aft today commencing at 0800.

5. SAFETY REGULATIONS: LIFE LINES, Article 4307. No person shall:

1. Lean, sit, stand on, or climb over any life line on this ship either in port or when underway. Personnel working over the side in port may climb over life lines when necessary, but only if they are wearing life jackets and safety lines.

2. Dismantle or remove any life line on the ship without specific permission of the First Lieutenant, and then only if temporary life lines are promptly rigged.

6. UCMJ: Article 79. Conviction of lesser included offense. An accused may be found guilty of an offense necessarily included in the offense charged or of an attempt to commit either the offense charged or an offense necessarily included therein.

7. DIEGO GARCIA HAPPENINGS: USS VERNON COUNTY (LST1161) arrived on 10 March 1971. An advance party of 4 officers and 96 enlisted men have been working on warping tugs, channel marking and survey, reconnaissance and other necessary advance work required prior to our arrival on D-Day -1. MONTICELLO expects to arrive Friday, 19-March at 0800 and VERNON COUNTY will come alongside shortly thereafter to transfer the deckhouse and skagit winch onto the warping tug utilizing MONTICELLO cranes. We hope to respot our load in order to swim out the desal barge, causeway section and fuel barge on Friday. On Saturday, 20 March (D Day) USS CHARLESTON (LKA113) an Atlantic Gator arrives. CHARLESTON has the boats required by us for the rest of our offload. While at Diego Garcia we will be under the operational control of COMSECONDFLT (Atlantic Command). Hopefully we will get underway not later than the morning of 22 March for the next leg of our trip. Utilizing the equipment we are carrying, the airstrip at Diego Garcia will be made operational by July by NMCB-40. The entire facility is scheduled to be fully operational by March 1973.

8. DIEGO GARCIA - QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:

Q. How large is Diego Garcia and how much of it will be included in the facility?

A. Diego Garcia is an irregular V-shaped atoll, roughly 14 miles in length and 5 miles in width. The width of the island surrounding the lagoon varies between 300 and 7,200 feet. The facility will occupy approximately one-half of its 5,700 acres.

Q. What will happen to the population of Diego Garcia?

A. The population consists of a small number of contract laborers from the Seychelles Island group and Mauritius Island engaged to work on the Copra Plantations. Arrangements will be made for the contracts to be terminated at the appropriate time and/or their return to Mauritius and the Seychelles.

Q. Will this facility be used to support operations in Vietnam or Indo China?

A. No such use is contemplated.

Q. When will the facility be in full operation?

A. Probably March 1974.

Q. Will other facilities be built in this area?

A. No others are contemplated.

Q. Will the facility be open to commercial ships and aircraft?

A. No. However, International Law requires that assistance be given to ships and aircraft in distress.

Q. How will this facility be supported?

A. From CONUS logistic bases.



NOTES AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1. STAMP COLLECTORS PHILATELISTS, CACHES COLLECTORS: USMCICELLO has received authority to issue a special cachet commemorating participation on D-Day, 20 March 1971 at DIEGO GARCIA. The cachet which was designed by CAPTAIN SPANGENBERG consists of an outline of the Indian Ocean with a star at the location of DIEGO GARCIA directly over which is inscribed U.K. - U.S. Communications Station. Across the bottom is a silhouette of the ship with USS

MONTICELLO (LSD 35) inscribed beneath. The inscription across the top reads D-DAY AT DIEGO GARCIA ATOLL, BRITISH INDIAN OCEAN TERRITORY 20 March 1971.

Those collectors who desire a cachet submit your name and the quantity desired to the Ship's Office prior to 1000 today. The cachets will be made available prior to noon so that you may address them and get them into the ship's post office so that they will be cancelled with the MONTICELLO postmark dated 20 March 1971.

Also, those collectors who would be interested in obtaining a cover with the four stamps, currently used on DIEGO GARCIA (the cost of which would be about \$1.00 U.S.) submit names and a dollar to the ship's office prior to 1000 today. This last offer is dependent on the availability of the stamps on the island from the plantation overseer.

2. MEMORABILIA AND TRIVIA: Since leaving San Diego on 8 February 1971, MONTICELLO has steamed 11,927 miles and with the currently anticipated return ship we have approximately 11,400 miles to go so we are over the half way point in distance as well as time!

3. SUN EXPOSURE: All Hands are cautioned to be extremely careful about their body exposure to the sun. Disability due to sunburn is unexcusable. 7. UCMJ ARTICLE 80 - ATTEMPTS:

(a) An act, done with specific intent to commit an offense under this chapter, amounting to more than mere preparation and tending, even though failing, to effect its commission, is an attempt to commit that offense.

(b) Any person subject to this chapter who attempts to commit any offense punishable by this chapter shall be punished as a court-martial may direct, unless otherwise specifically prescribed.



4. NATIONAL WEEK OF CONCERN FOR POW/MIA: The President has proclaimed the week of 21-27 March as a National Week of Concern for Prisoners of War and those Missing in Action. Seven years ago the first U.S. Prisoner still being held by the enemy was captured in Vietnam. There are presently 372 Navy/Marine Corps prisoners and missing in Southeast Asia. 

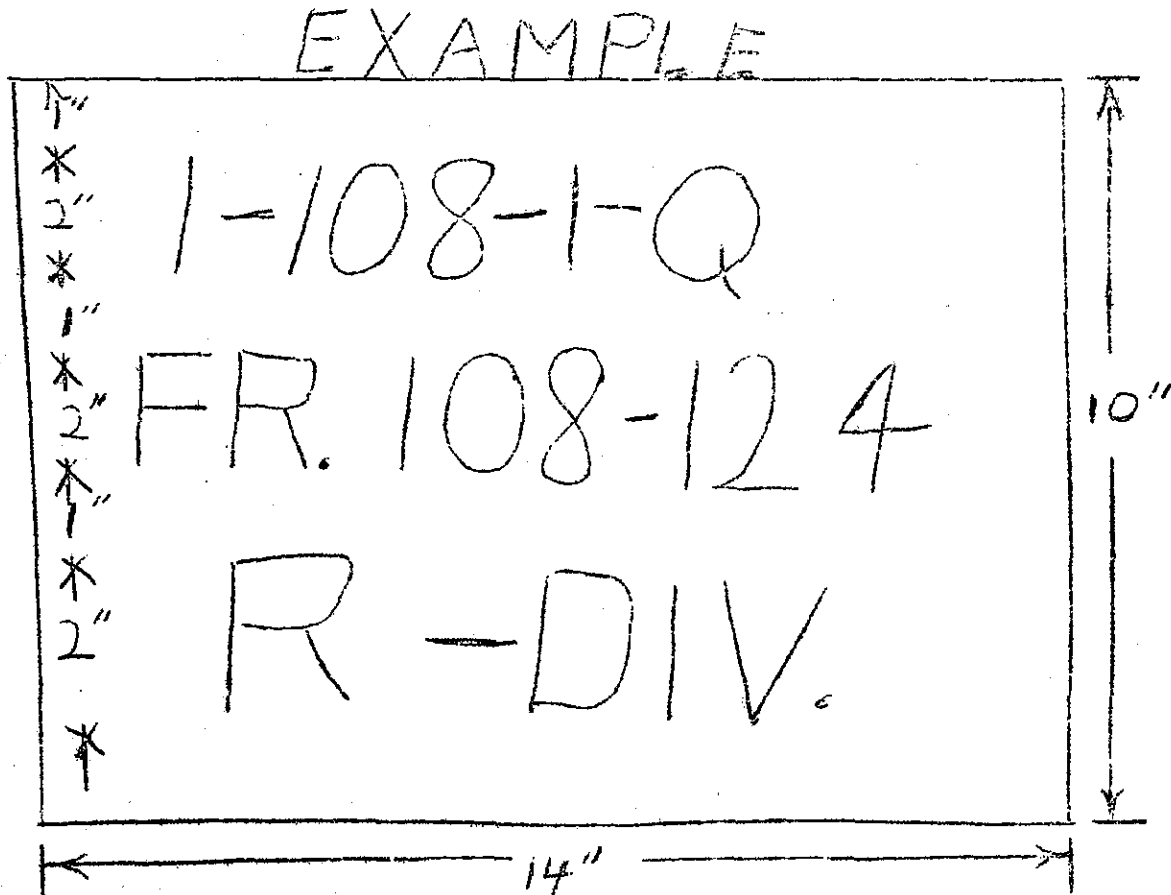



ANNOUNCEMENTS AND NOTES:

1. General Regulations Article 4212 SORM Disrespectful and profane language. No person shall:

1. Use contemptuous, disrespectful, or insolent language or gestures directed towards his superior officers or towards any person in authority.
2. Use profane, obscene, or vulgar words or gestures on board this ship.

2. Safety Regulations: Article 4311 SORM TOOLS:

1. Constant danger from electric shock and physical injuries from flying particles is present when using portable pneumatic or electrically powered tools. The rigorous use which electrically powered tools received and the metal construction of the ship increases the possibility of shorts and groundings and presents a constant hazard to the safety of personnel using such tools.

2. No person shall:

- a. Be issued or use portable electric or pneumatic tools unless specifically authorized by his division officer and then only after he has demonstrated a knowledge of the tool's operation and of the safety precautions incident to it's use.
- b. Use a portable electric or pneumatic tool for any purpose other than those specifically authorized by proper authority.
- c. Use a portable electric tool unless the tool housing is grounded to the ship's metal structure, either through a grounded type receptacle and plug or by direct connection to the hull.

3. All persons using pneumatic or electrically powered wire brushes, chippers, sanders, or grinders shall wear goggles.

3. UCMJ: Article 83 Fraudulent enlistment, appointment, or separation: Any person who (1) procures his own enlistment or appointment in the armed forces by knowingly false representation or deliberate concealment as to his qualifications for that enlistment or appointment and receives pay or allowances thereunder; or (2) procures his own separation from the armed forces by knowingly false representation or deliberate concealment as to his eligibility for that separation; shall be punished as a court-martial may direct.

4. CONTEMPLATING RETIREMENT?: If you are within 18 months of retirement you need the revised Navy guide for retired personnel and their families (NAVPERS 15891C). This publication is intended for distribution to each career navy man about 18 months prior to retirement or transfer to the fleet reserve. If you are in the category contact EM1 BRADFORD, command counselor for your copy.

5. NUCLEAR CHALLENGE FOR NAVY MEN: Personnel qualifying for the Navy's Nuclear Power Program receive training as nuclear power-plant operators. Personnel Eligible ET, IC, EM and MM in pay grades E-2 through E-6. Must be a U.S. citizen and meet security and reliability requirements. Age not more than 25 years of age on class convening date for nuclear power school. Time in Service Total active service not to exceed 4 years at time of class convening date for nuclear power school. Education High school graduate or GED equivalent. Service Obligation Agree to extend if necessary in order to have a minimum of six years active obligated service from the date of enlistment and have a minimum of 36 months obligated service at class convening. Married or Single GCT + ARI of 115 or better. Program Elements One year extensive training in theory and fundamentals of nuclear power plants and nuclear power plant maintenance and operation. In addition Class "A" school of rating and submarine training for selected Volunteers.

9. BIRTHDAY GREETINGS: Best wishes to shipmate, YN3 ELIOT who celebrates his 22nd birthday today. Many happy returns.

10. THEFT & DESTRUCTION OF GOVERNMENT PROPERTY: ALL HANDS are alerted to be on the lookout for persons stealing or destroying government property, for example; removing ship's entertainment and IMC speakers or removing fire fighting and damage control equipment. Both of these cases of theft and/or destruction could have dire consequences in the event of a fire and the word not getting to everyone since IMC speakers are missing. USE YOUR HEADS.

14. HONG KONG VISIT: Our next liberty port is HONG KONG, a British Crown Colony, in close proximity to Communist China. We are presently scheduled to be there from 0800, 2 April until 0800, 8 April. Each day between now and then there will be a series of notes in the P.O.D. concerning our HONG KONG visit. Read them carefully, understand them completely, carry out the instructions contained therein implicitly.

15. CONDUCT IN HONG KONG: Any incident of misconduct ashore in Hong Kong by Naval Personnel provides a readily exploitable opportunity to the Chinese Communists who would like to see us excluded completely from that port. In view of the nature and tempo of operations in the Far East, the loss or serious restriction of our privilege to visit this port would seriously affect morale. Additionally, since we are guests in Hong Kong, it is mandatory that the conduct of personnel be exemplary.

16. TERMINATION OF VISITS TO HONG KONG: Commander Seventh Fleet will not hesitate to terminate Hong Kong visits and order a ship out of port in the case of a serious incident of misconduct ashore or when the overall performance of personnel ashore falls below the expected high standards.

17. OFFENSES IN HONG KONG: If an incident involves an offense which is normally prosecuted in the Hong Kong courts, the serviceman is subject to Hong Kong jurisdiction and U.S. authorities will not attempt to smooth over such a case. Their courts do not hesitate to adjudge a prison sentence should it be warranted by the offense. They are particularly harsh on personnel convicted of carrying a firearm or possessing, using or selling marijuana or drugs.

1. FUEL STOP: The purpose of our brief stop in SINGAPORE today is to take on fuel and provisions. There will be no liberty while anchored in SINGAPORE. The ship expects to get underway at 1600 this afternoon for VUNG TAU, RVN.

2. TIME CHANGES: Note carefully that there are two time changes today of a half hour each. This is necessary since SINGAPORE is on an unusual zone time. BE ALERT.

3. UNIFORM FOR ENTERING PORT: Bridge Personnel - Tropical White Long. Quarterdeck Personnel - Tropical White Long. All others topside. OFFICERS/CPO'S - Tropical Khaki Long. ENLISTED OTHER than CPO's - Clean Dungarees with shirts and white hats.

4. WORKING UNIFORM UNDERWAY: During working hours underway the working uniform as a minimum will include a T-shirt. Dungarees shirts may be worn topside and will be worn in the main engineering spaces. Properly hemmed dungaree shorts may be worn topside but will not be worn in the main engineering spaces.

5. LEAVE IN THE STATES: Requests for leave to commence upon our return to SAN DIEGO must be in the Personnel Office 15 days before the commencement dates as required by MONTICELLO INST 1050.1C therefore submit your leave requests in sufficient time so that they will be screened and into the Personnel Office by 11 April 71.

8. SENSELESS DAMAGE: Sometime last night an unknown immature shipmate slashed the outdoor movie screen. In addition, other malicious mischief has occurred during the past few nights. This conduct cannot be condoned and should not be tolerated if observed. The ultimate losers in this senseless pattern of misconduct could be any or all of us. Consider the possibility of a serious fire or other catastrophe and certain individuals losing their lives because the word couldn't get to them because the IMC speakers had been stolen or other individuals trapped and unable to protect themselves because the fire fighting and damage control equipment had been stolen. THINK ABOUT IT AS EVERYONE OF US HAS A DIRECT CONCERN IN THE END RESULTS OF THIS JUVENILE BEHAVIOR.

10. NOTES ON OUR FORTHCOMING HONG KONG VISIT:

(a) Visits to Communist country ships not allowed: U.S. Military personnel are sometimes invited to visit onboard ships of Communist block countries in WESTPAC ports, for the purpose of their obtaining information and for propaganda favorable to their cause. Decline politely if invited. COMSEVENTHFLT Instructions direct all U.S. personnel not to make such visits.

(b) Incidents in Hong Kong: The presence of a Chinese Communist press in Hong Kong means that even a minor incident is likely to be publicized, with the consequent possibility that the serviceman's family and friends in the U.S. will hear of his misconduct. The CHICOM political and intelligence apparatus will be alert to exploit any incident as an opportunity for blackmail. Even without CHICOM encouragement, local residents involved in incidents may sue or make exorbitant demands for payment for damages or injuries.

(c) Rallies, Demonstrations and Parades: Communist Party Organizations and other anti-U.S. factions will schedule and conduct demonstrations in protest of U.S. actions and policies in the Far East. SEVENTH Fleet personnel shall remain clear of all demonstration areas, unless it becomes necessary to pass through these areas in order to reach a given destination. In such cases, the area will be transited as quickly as possible. In no case will personnel engage in discussions or any other activity with the demonstrators. Extreme care must be taken to avoid any actions in the area of a demonstration which might be taken as provocative. Personnel are not to take photographs of any stage of a demonstration.

11. THE FOLLOWING PRESIDENTIAL PROCLAMATION IS QUOTED FOR THE INFORMATION OF ALL HA 5:

The white house national week of concern for Americans who are prisoners of war or missing in action March 22-27 1971. By the President of the United States of America "A Proclamation". The first American still being held by the enemy was captured in South Vietnam on March 26, 1964. Now, with the seventh anniversary of that event approaching, the number of Americans missing in action or known captured in the Vietnamese conflict has grown to about 600, most of these men are officers and enlisted men of the army, the navy, the air force, and the marine corps, some are civilians. Even in captivity, they continue to serve our nation in the highest sense of honor and duty to country. We owe them, in turn, no less than our strongest support and our firmest pledge that we will neither forget them nor abandon them.

This government has made and will continue to make strenuous efforts in behalf of these Americans who are prisoners of war or missing in action. In the face of the enemy's callous indifference to the plight of these men and their families, we have sought to focus the attention of the world on the barbaric attitude of North Vietnam and its agents throughout Indochina. We have conducted vigorous diplomatic efforts to resolve the prisoner of war problem on a purely humane basis for the prisoners we hold as well as for our brave men held prisoner.

The Geneva prisoner of war convention of 1949 sets forth the minimum standards for humanitarian treatment applying to all prisoners of war. Some 125 nations including all of those involved on both sides in the Southeast Asia hostilities have acceded to the Geneva Convention and have pledged to observe its humane standards, and on a moral plane above and apart from these formal rules, all civilized peoples are subject to the basic humanitarian standards long established in international law and custom.

In view of the continuing disregard of this convention and basic humane standards by North Vietnam aimed its agents - - Their refusal to identify all of the Americans being held, to permit impartial inspection of their camps, to release the seriously sick and wounded prisoners, to provide humane treatment, and to permit prisoners to correspond regularly with their families --and in view of their adamant refusal to consider negotiation regarding the release of prisoners, the congress of the United States has, by house joint resolution 16, requested the President to designate the period beginning march 1, 1971, and ending March 27, 1971, as national week of concern for prisoners of war missing in action.

Now, therefore, I, Richard Nixon, President of the United States of America, do hereby designate the period March 21, 1971 through March 27, 1971, as National Week of concern for Americans who are prisoners of war or missing in action. I call upon all the people of the United States to observe this week in heartfelt prayer, and in ceremonies and activities appropriate to voice deep concern for the prisoner and missing men, to inspire their loved ones with new courage and hope, and to hasten the day when their ordeal may end.

In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand this nineteenth day of March, in the year of our lord nineteen hundred seventy-one, and of the independence of the United States of America the one hundred ninety fifth Richard Nixon.

6. FREE MAIL PRIVILEGE: In order to be entitled to the free mailing privilege, mail must meet the following conditions:

1. Consist only of first-class letter mail, including postal cards and post cards and sound recorded communications having the character of personal correspondence.
2. Must bear in the upper right corner of the address side in handwriting of the sender, the word "Free" (except for mail to foreign countries)
3. Must bear a complete return address. For mail addressed to foreign countries:
 - a. Don't write Free in the upper right hand leave blank and turn into your friendly postal clerk.
4. The Free mailing privilege does not extend to:
 - a. Circular letters, mimeographed.
 - b. Merchandise, pictorial matter.
 - c. Newspapers, advertising mail.

7. SELECTIVE TRAINING AND RETENTION PROGRAM: This program offers the enlisted Navy man the opportunity for guaranteed assignment to class "A", "B" or "C" school. This reenlistment incentive further offers the career minded enlisted man the advantage of guaranteed advancement in his chosen rating. The end result guarantees assignment to class "A", "B" or "C" school as appropriate and automatic advancement to pay grade E4 or E5 under certain conditions. Time in service is at least 1 year but not more than 3 years for pay grades E3 and E4 and at least 1 year but not more than 42 months for pay grade E5. Service obligation is 6 years reenlistment upon acceptance into the program. Battery marks as required for the school requested. Waiver of 10 points on combined test score requirements or 5 points on a single test score is authorized. Assignment to school will normally be affected within 12 months after receipt of school request by the Bureau of Naval Personnel.

8. AUGUST SERVICE WIDE EXAMS: Must be ordered on 24 May 1971. Department heads submit all recommendations to the personnel office not later than 10 May 1971.

9. CONDUCT IN HONG KONG: Any incident of misconduct ashore in Hong Kong by Naval Personnel provides a readily exploitable opportunity to the Chinese Communists who would like to see us excluded completely from that port. IN view of the nature and tempo of operations in the Far East, the loss or serious restriction of our privilege to visit this port would seriously affect morale. Additionally, since we are guests in Hong Kong, it is mandatory that the conduct of personnel be exemplary.

10. TERMINATION OF VISITS TO HONG KONG: Commander Seventh Fleet will not hesitate to terminate Hong Kong visits and order a ship out of port in the case of a serious incident of misconduct ashore or when the overall performance of personnel ashore falls below the expected high standards.

11. OFFENSES IN HONG KONG: If an incident involves an offense is normally prosecuted in the Hong Kong courts, the serviceman is subject to Hong Kong jurisdiction and U.S. authorities will not attempt to smooth over such a case. Their courts do not hesitate to adjudge a prison sentence should it be warranted by the offense. They are particularly harsh on personnel convicted of carrying a firearm or possessing, using or selling marijuana or drugs.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1. DIVINE SERVICES: Whenever practical, facilities shall be provided for each man to observe religious worship of his choice in accordance with the dictates of his church. Divine services shall be conducted each Sunday on-board this ship, if conditions permit, for persons of any and all religions. Special services peculiar to a religion will be held if appropriate arrangements can be made. No person shall create a disturbance or conduct himself in a disrespectful or irreverent manner during divine services. All persons who do not desire to attend divine services shall keep clear of the area in which services are being conducted and refrain from work, sounds, or actions that would interfere with the services.

2. WORKING ALOFT: All division officers shall ensure that their personnel are instructed in all applicable safety precautions and are fully qualified before permitting them to go aloft for work on the mast or stacks. He will notify the engineering officer of the watch to avoid lifting safety valves while men are aloft. He will determine that sea conditions will not endanger men aloft. He ensure that men going aloft are equipped with safety belts and safety lines and that they will be properly tended and supervised. Ensure that all tools, buckets, paint, pots, and brushes are secured by lanyards when used in work on mast and stacks.
