## REFLECTIONS FROM Fr. MATTHEW

#### **COME, HOLY SPIRIT, COME**

As we come to the end of the Easter season, let us reflect on the transformative journey undertaken by Jesus out of love for us. Last Sunday on the ascension of the Lord, we reflected on the completion of the earthly ministry of Jesus and the entire history of salvation and how He accomplished this through the paschal mysteries. Before his ascend to heaven he promised us the Holy Spirit to fill us with the power of the Lord. Throughout the last fifty days of Easter, we soaked in stories of the resurrected Lord who still had some teaching and revealing to do. Now, on this solemnity of Pentecost, Jesus turns the work to his disciples. Jesus' mission continues through us today as we take on the preaching and praying, the forgiving and healing. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we—the disciples of today - are called to carry on the saving work of Christ.

On this Pentecost Sunday, we remember how the Holy Spirit came to the disciples. And how the Spirit transformed them and gave them the power to spread God's word. It reminds us that the same Spirit is present in our lives today. The Holy Spirit gives us courage, helps us remember God's presence, and calls us to live as witnesses of God's love. Through the Spirit, God breathes life into us. He gives us the courage to speak His message to the world. He gives us strength to be prophets. He inspires us to comfort those in need of care. This transformation is especially clear on Pentecost. Initially, the disciples were scared and hidden. But when the Holy Spirit came upon them, they were changed. They spoke boldly about Jesus, even in the face of danger. This courage comes from knowing that we are not alone. God's Spirit lives within us. We share in the relationship between the Father and the Son. This unity gives us the strength to carry out our mission.

It is easy to forget that God dwells within us, especially when we face challenges or feel alone. This is why it is important to pray for the Holy Spirit to stir within us again. We need to experience moments of intense realization that God is in us. The Holy Spirit calls us to be active witnesses in the world. This means living out the love and truth of the Gospel every day. We show God's love through our actions and how we treat others. Each act of kindness or moment of truth-telling is a reflection of God's love. We are not just telling others about Jesus; we are showing them His love in action.

#### **Eucharistic Revival**



On the morning of Pentecost, the Apostles gathered with Mary and prayed behind locked doors, waiting for the Promise of the Father.

When we receive the Eucharist, Jesus brings His Spirit to abide in the depths of our hearts. If we allow it, the Spirit of Truth will guide us

into tranquil waters, where we can be transformed. Let us prepare for each Eucharistic encounter in the same way the apostles prepared for Pentecost, by devoting "themselves with one accord to prayer, together ... with Mary ... all in one place together" (Acts 1:14, 2:1).




