#### REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

#### "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." (Mark 9:2-10)

On this second Sunday of Lent, Jesus invites us to go with him to the mountain, to be with him in prayer and reflection, and to witness his glorious transfiguration. Both the Gospel and the first reading, invites us to reflect on themes of faith, obedience, sacrifice, and transformation. They encourage us to examine our relationship with God, to deepen our trust in His plan, and to embrace the call to conversion and renewal. Engaging with these themes can inspire us to live out our Lenten practices more fully, with an eye towards the Easter promise of resurrection and new life.

Abraham displays incredible trust in God and in God's ability to fulfill promises in new, mysterious ways. Abraham's readiness to sacrifice Isaac and Jesus' submission to His Father's will during the Transfiguration both exemplify profound obedience rooted in trust and love. These readings challenge us to deepen our own obedience to God, trusting in His goodness and guidance even when His plans for us are not immediately clear.

Transfiguration experience foreshadows Jesus' resurrection by revealing His glory before His suffering and death. Jesus' dazzling appearance and the divine voice affirming His sonship provide a glimpse of His divine nature and the glory that will follow His resurrection. This event anticipates the victory over death and the promise of new life, encouraging believers to hold onto hope through the trials of life. The cross is a scandalous and integral part of Jesus' narrative. We cannot jump to resurrection without journeying through the pain of the cross.

We are reminded that sacrifice is not a loss but an act of faith, love, and obedience to God. Through Abraham's willingness to sacrifice Isaac and God's ultimate sacrifice of Jesus, we learn that true sacrifice involves trust in God's plan and can lead to greater blessings and deeper relationships with God. These readings invite us to consider the sacrifices we are called to make in our own lives as expressions of faith and love.

# The "Holy Trio" of Fasting, Prayer, and Almsgiving An Examination of Conscience for Lent

Jesus "went off to the mountain to pray." (Mark 6:45)

- Are these subtle –or not so subtle– ways that I have ignored my relationship with God?
- Have I made time every day to meet God in prayer? Do I read, reflect, and act on his work in Scripture?
- Have I given priority to God on Sundays and holy days by attending Mass and making a special effort to seek Him?

Return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, weeping and mourning." (Joel 2:12)

- How much do I rely on the Lord for fulfillment, compared to the security I seek from money, possessions, or other relationships?
- Are there areas of myself that I am holding back from God—secret parts that I don't want to expose to His light and His love?
- Are there any unhealthy attachments in my life that are keeping me from giving my whole heart to the Lord?

#### "Give alms from your possessions." (Tobit 4:7)

- Have I been a good steward of the gifts God has given me? Do I use them for His glory?
- Am I contributing to the work of the Church and of organizations that serve the needy?
- Am I doing what I can to stand up against injustice and to protect the unborn and those who are poor and marginalized?
- Are there situations in which I resist giving the "alms" of forgiveness to someone who has hurt me? Is there anyone I need to forgive or whose forgiveness I need to ask for?


