Progress Notes Narrative:

Supervised agency face to face visit from 4pm-6pm was supervised by Valerie Bell, RA (reasonable accommodation staff). This visit began at 4:17pm due to the father's later arrival. The father requested extended time with the child to make up for his lateness, however RA explained that RA was not in the position to make that decision but that the agency generally extends additional time when the child arrives late.

The child as observed with previous visits appeared to be excited to be visiting with her father. The child was dressed in a striped short sleeve t-shirt and flowered printed leggings and sneakers. RA observed no visible marks or bruises as the child was moving all four limbs with no signs of pain or discomfort, neither did the child verbally express any concerns of pain. RA noticed a red mark to the left side of her cheek and after inquiry the child stated that the mother had kissed her and that the redness was remnant from her lipstick. (RA later confirmed this with the mother to be true). RA is also noting that the child Margaret hit her left knee on the table during the visit in that the child attempted to leap on top of the table to grab a book and hit her knee. The child began to cry a little as the father comforted her calmed her down. Once the child was calmed RA attempted to assess the knee for any physical injury but the father seemed to be agitated by this. He was saying that he did not see a need and indicated that she bumped her knee lightly and that it was nothing serious. RA explained that it was RA's responsibility to account for any injuries that may have resulted during the visit, however, the father was unable to pull the child's pants leg up over her knee. Later while in her mother's presence, RA explained the incident to the mother and the child pulled up her pants legs and no mark or bruise was observed to the child's knee and neither was their any concerns to her walk.

EVENAFTER INJURY WALKS FINE

Incidentally, RA brought it to the father's attention that RA noticed that he seemed a bit irritable today in that he raised his voice earlier at the RA, after the RA attempted to explain to the father who was feeding the child a Nathan Cheeseburger that when feeding, he should ensure that she takes smaller bites to prevent choking because it appeared that she had taken such a large bite out of the sandwich that she was unable to chew her food properly because she jaws were full, her mouth could barely close and she was clearly having problems swallowing the food. RA pointed this out to the father that it was evident that the child was having some difficulties swallowing and was fearful of her choking. The father shouted, "what do you want me to do, you should tell her mother to teach her how to eat". RA responded by saying that because he was actually feeding the child and allowed her to take such a big bite while he was holding the sandwich, that he just needed to encourage her to take smaller bites to avoid choking. RA then attempted to check -in with father by asking "was he okay?" The father looked at RA and said "am I okay?" and rolled his eyes and turned his head in the other direction. RA allowed ample time to pass before revisiting father's behavior and explained that RA was only checking in with him earlier to see if she had offended him in some way because he seemed a bit snappy. It was at that moment that the father seemed to recognize the interaction and stated that he was having a bad day and that he would talk to RA about it later. RA apologized for him having a bad day but explained that RA did not appreciate him taking it out on her. FA stated again that he would explain his behavior later. RA stated that if his actions were case related, that RA would unfortunately not be able to speak to him about it. Surprisingly enough, the father blurted out that "the mother attempted to have him arrested today and that he was having a bad day ". RA did not respond.

FA subsequently stated to the child that RA was right about her needing to take smaller bites and began to talk with the child about how to eat properly.

BM reported that sometimes SC Margaret get on SC Joe bed when he is playing his video games to watch or to play with him. CPS asked BM do SC Joe hit SC Margaret. BM reported that she does not discipline SC Margaret nor does Joe. BM reported that SC may fall on her toys or other things. BM reported that she is tired of BF calling in cases on her. CPS explained to BM we do not know who called the case in BM reported that she knows BF called the case in. BM reported that there are no concerns in her home. BM reported that everyone goes to school, and if they miss a day she brings in a note.

When Mr. Malek arrived for the visit, CPS brought the child Minni to her father and asked if he would like the visit to be in a private cubicle. Mr. Malek chose the private cubicle for the visit. Both father and child were excited to see each other. The father apologize for arriving late due to being at Family Court filing papers regarding his ongoing case.

The father brought food and beverages and lay it on the table. This food consist of a Nathan Cheeseburger, a can of Soda range flavor and a carton of Horizon milk. The father brought another pack of slime/potty and tells the child , he will bring her much better toys/things on his next visit and she deserve the best. He then turn to CPS , shaking his head, saying he wants to buy her so much things but the child mother has caused so much damaged between him and his father and he shook his head without finishing his statement.

CPS then inquired of the BF if he is currently participating in services. CPS discussed mental health evaluation , DV and Parenting with father. CPS asked the father for his medical insurance information to refer the father for services. The father told CPS he did 3 evaluation and he send the documents along with all his services he did to the courts, hence the reason he was late for the visit.

The father then directed the subject to the mother and said because of him, BM and children were able to get services.

CPS told the father to attend to his daughter as she wants to play hide and seek with him.

The father and daughter played hide and seek for a while, until CPS received a text from the mother stating Joe wants to use the bathroom. CPS asked the father to move to the playroom for a few , then he can return to the area. The father took the food and cellphone and important stuff and CPS escorted him and SC to the playroom.

The SC began playing with another girl child with dolls and a doll house. The father stoop next to the child while she was interacting with the other child and kept rubbing her back , her hair, her arms, the child just kept on playing and did not react to the father touch.

The father then cam and stand near the entrance and was looking towards the cubicle that he was in prior. CPS asked him what's wrong as the bathroom is opposite the cubicle and the child Joe was in the bathroom. The father tells CPS the reason why he's looking over there it's because he don't trust Joe because he takes things. CPS then said to the father, that he took his valuable stuff, no need to be staring over there like that. The father said well even if it's nothing valuable over in the cubicle , he still don't want Joe to take his bag.

CPS was then alerted by a text from the BM Joe has returned to the room, simultaneously Mr. Malek alerted CPS , Joe went back to his mother. CPS asked the father if he wants to return to the cubicle, to which he asked Minni and she said she wants to remain in the playroom. The father then lay on the floor next to Minni while she continued to play doll with the child.

CPS did not redirect the father from laying on the floor, he never got up until CPS announced 5 more minutes before the visit ends. The father got up and watch the time and told the child the visit is going to end and he will be there next week.

The child got up from playing walk to the back of the room looked at the other children playing, then came to CPS ready to be escorted to her mother. The father told the child her love her, and gave her a kiss and hug, then CPS took the child to the mother.

CP mentioned that from her last visit with the previous counselor, they spoke about SC Joe going into alternative schooling to learn a trade instead of a traditional High School and was wondering if she had thoughts concerning that. CP said that she will follow up with BM about having the CHN in school on a regular basis.

As well as, his concern that Minni made a comment surrounding she wants a toy gun to shoot her BF as she does not want to come for visits with him. CPS validated the BM concern and asked her to speak to her therapist about her feelings and thoughts to learn skills to help her through this ordeal.

BM gave CPS a copy of Minni first visit with Bright Point for MH evaluation on 1/31/20. BM explained that was the first part, she has to schedule the Psychosocial intake for Minni as well.

BM reported she received cash benefit today 2/3/20, and will now be able to do her laundry.

BM then showed CPS a flyer for the free event for families that she plans to take the children to on 2/5/20. Joe and Minni chimed in with excitement about meeting the character and receiving some of the freebies from the event.

CPS observed the CHN faces, arms and feet which was free of an suspicious marks, bruises or lacerations.

CPS provided the BM with travel fare, 4 metro card, to which she signed for them. CPS also had the BM signed HIPPA's regarding the children. CPS then took Minni to her BF.

Minni was excited when she saw her father, she ran to him saying "Daddy". The BF took the SC to the Playroom.

BF brought food for the SC consist of Milk chocolate macadamia nuts cookies , Mill that was poured into a 1 liter bottle and pickles and cheese. The BF also bought a toy which consist of a Monkey family, four people an mommy, daddy, brother and sister. CPS observed the BF had a toy that was in a box where appeared to be magnetic pieces, he showed the toy to the child and told her, he's sorry he brought the toy, it's not something she will like and he know she likes homes and little people with trees. BF told the child next time he will bring her a toy that consist of a trees and a home.

The child did not respond, she remain seated next to her father. The father then told the child he brought his own gadget to open the box with the toy monkeys and took out a nail clipper and proceeded to cut the toys out of the box.

The toy monkey was out of the box and Minni was happy, she said to her dad let's play. The BF told the SC she can play with the toy at home in her tree house. CPS got up and got a little doll house and placed on the table for the child to make her game more fun. The child play a game with the dolls in the doll house, then she got bored and said to her father she wishes she had a pool for the dolls. The BF then took an empty glad container he had in his bag and poured water into the bowl and said to the child "here goes the pool Minni".

The BF then named the monkey dolls, Mommy, Daddy Joe and Minni, and created a came that the family was in a pool. BF now got the opportunity to engage the child in family day at the pool, and telling her that's what they used to do as a family and soon they will engaged in those activities. Minni is curious to know what time in her life they went to the beach in as a family. She asked the BF "I was a baby". The BF told the child when she was 2. Then after the playing with the family swimming in the pool, they began to make the family jump from on top of the play house into the water. BF took up the mummy monkey and told the child " mummy has big stomach and is afraid of heights , I don't think she will jump", the BF then took Joe monkey and said "Joe is heavy, lets make him jump, he proceeded to make the monkey jump from the roof and he made a huge splash the water. The BF laughed and said " Joe is too heavy, he can't jump", let him sit by mummy who just pass gas" and he laughed because it was so funny to him. BY this time water was spilled on Minni clothes , the table and floor. CPS asked the BF to clean up the spill to prevent Minni or another child slip, to which he did. The BF commented, "it is always going to be a water game on these visits with Minni"

During the play with the monkeys, CPS did not hear what BF whispered or said to Minni, she began to describe what was inside her home, saying " Mommy got a microwave, blender, toaster " CPS interrupted that specific conversation and re-directed Minni to not speak about her home but her school. CPS asked the BF to not encourage games with the child where she is obligated to speak about her home life including BM and Joe. The BF was a apprehensive, but he refrained from speaking about the BM and SC Joe. CPS kept a close eye on BF as Minni told CPS , BF is whispering in her ear that he's going to take her away from BM.

The BF offered the child a bite in the pickle, to which she had a bite and took a sip of the milk.

Two families then came in the playroom and joined the water game, the children parent did not want them to engage in the water as their clothes got wet. The water spilled again the BF cleaned up again and could not end the game. Not until another family came in and the child father had a bag of toys he took out for his daughter and Minni walked over to interact, the BF took the water and threw in a trash. CPS then received text from the BF stating his stand on being referred for a mental Health assessment.

WHY WOULD THIS HAPPEN IF MINNI IS SO HAPPY TO SEE DADDY?

Ms. Ingoglia reported, that when she told Minni to come and get ready for the visit, the child " began freaking out, rolling on the floor crying she does not want to go to the visit. The mother stated, she told the child she has to go, or else the mother will get in trouble. The mother stated, the child continued to be on the floor and her brother Joe then pick up Minni asking her to cooperated with their mother, that's when Minni move her head forward unto Joe's face and sustained a small pink circular mark on the left side of her forehead. The pink circle was approximately half the size of a pinky finger nail. The skin on the child forehead was not cut or swollen, CPS took a picture of the child forehead. The child Joe confirmed what the BM reported, when CPS asked him what happen.

CPS took the child to the father inside of the playroom, the BF and SC was excited to see each other. The BM had told CPS the SC did not eat lunch as they were rushing to get to the visit. CPS told the Bf he should feed the SC first before engaging with the toy he brought to the visit. The BF then went into one of his bag and brought out a blue towel, in it was turkey breast in a container. CPS asked the BF why he wrapped the turkey in the towel, to which he sated for it to remain warm. The Bf went on to say Joe and the mother are liars, and Joe is dangerous, in the past he would throw Minni when he is upset. The Bf insist that Joe did something to Minni after she headed him in the face. BF was going on talking, CPS told the BF, he's saying these negative things about Joe and BM in the presence of Minni and he should stop. CPS then asked CPSS11 to come and talk with Mr. Malek about his behavior, to which she did.

Mr. Malek calmed down and began to engaged the child with the game. After playing 2 rounds of the game with the child, the child said she did not like the game it's to difficult. The BF apologized to the child and promised that he would bring a toy that she will like on the next visit.

The child then asked the BF to play "hide & seek" to which they did for about an hour, then the child got tired she sat on the chair with her thumb in her mouth. The Bf then asked the child if she wants to watch a movie on his computer. The child then said " daddy can we watch movie under the short table, and make it dark, like how we use to a do at ???? house". CPS did not quiet get who house Minni was referring to. CPS then looked at the BF for his response, the BF then said " Minni daddy forget the tapes home, lets look at pictures instead". The child then got of the chair and asked her father to get a picture to show CPS. The BF went on his phone and pulled up pictures and the child asked the BF to show CPS a picture with her face painted including her tongue. The child was smiling and very proud of her picture.

The next activity was body/face painting with a blue ink pen the child found in the BF bag. The child wrote drew on the BF arms face and tried to stick him in the eyes with the pen, she though that was funny. The Bf told the child " watch my eyes, the pen is sharp", yet she continued to draw on his face and poking the top of his eyes that was shut closed by now.

Minni then asked CPS to return to the Playroom, CPS agreed. The child played on two little horses in the playroom, then with the kitchen set.

The child then took her father and out of the playroom and began to play tag out in the waiting area . The child was running and the Bf was trying to catch her. The played tag until 3pm and CPS announced 20 more minutes left before the visit ends.

he father and the child eventually went back into the playroom. The BF asked the child what would she like him to bring her on the next visit. The child told her father a "Lego with couch and chairs". The father then went on his phone and goggled Lego videos and showed the child a clip of a father and son engaged in Lego, until CPS told it's time to go to her mother. The BF hugged the child and told her he loves her and the child reciprocated.

CPS took the child to mother and brother and they left before Mr. Malek as they had another appointment to attend.

CPS advise the father to clean up the space, which gave the mother and children ample time to leave without being notice.

The children was observed with out any suspicious bruises, marks or lacerations on their bodies. Minni had a small bruise on her forehead which was explained how she got it.

The children was well dressed in clean appropriate clothing for the weather.

For example on Monday night the mother and the two subject children were playing a video game amongst themselves. The played 6 rounds of the game and kept on loosing. Joe decided to end the game as its late and to convene the following evening. According to the mother Minnie had a "complete meltdown" because she wanted to remain playing until she win at least one game. Bm said the child made a statement she wants to harm herself. CPS safety plan with the mother, telling her to put all knives and medication out of the reach of Minnie and keep a close watch on her behavior. Also BM must inform the child therapist about her comment and they can explore with the child.



CPS delivered a box of non-perishable food to the mother which she was grateful for. CPS also text the mother information for free Food Bank Personal Shopper Home Delivery [REDACTED]. The Bm was thankful for the information. The mother stated, while she has food stamp, she is unable to make trips to the grocery and stand on line, due to not having any PPE especially for Minnie. CPS got creative and demonstrated how the mother can use a plain teeshirt into a mask for Joe and herself, not sure Minnie will be able to keep that covering on her head and face. The mother suggested contact her Bf and asked if he can buy Minnie a face mask and gloves. CPS told the mother she will look into that, since he contacts CPS asking about what he can do on his end.

CPS spoke with Joe, he showed CPS his tablet. Joe stated last Friday he got the assistance how to maneuver his tablet including contacting his teachers for assistant when faced with a challenge academically. Joe reported last Friday he has been doing his Maths, and Monday he continued the pattern, only today Tuesday he has not done anything because he felt tired. Joe agreed to do something later that day.

PS spoke with Minnie who was happy to show that she too has a tablet and has been doing an art project on it. Minnie told CPS if she played games as well on her tablet ans spoke to her therapist from school.
