

CRITTER TIME IS HERE... (PESTS INCLUDED!)

Funny how we tend to forget the summer critters while we complain about winter weather— especially this year with the seemingly non-stop rain. Check out our total Seems like we went from muddy muck to waist high

grass overnight. And... warm weather critters are arriving right on schedule.

This should be a bumper year for rodents and snakes with all the grass and seed.

SNAKES: We love most snakes and have a lot of varieties. Luckily the only ones to worry about safety-wise are rattlesnakes- and they're easily identifiable. Just look at the head and tail.

Rattlers have BIG heads...because those jaws are where they keep their poison sacs. They have rattles, even baby rattlers have a

"button"— the start of their first rattle section. Another rattle develops every time they shed. The ends rattles may break off, but there's always a section or more left. If the tail comes to a nice smooth point, no

problem. Otherwise steer clear.

SQUIRRELS & RODENTS: Warmer weather means ground squirrels get to making big families. They'll come in droves to feed at bird feeders or pet stations. Moving those helps a lot.

TRAP & DO NOT USE RAT POISONS: A single feeding of rodenticide is lethal for a squirrel, but it takes up to a a week for the squirrel to die. While they're slowly (and painfully) dying,

they continue to feed and become super saturated with poison. Prey animals that eat them will also be poisoned: hawks, owls, bobcats, even family pets. We live in the country, and sometimes have to do some unpleasant things. The only way to way to control rodent invasions—without harming other wildlife—is trapping. Squirrel•N•Ator traps are especially effective. They are live-traps that come with a "dunking tray." Snap traps are best for rats and mice. I like the easy-set plastic snap traps and use peanut butter as bait.

YELLOWJACKETS: Wasps, especially Yellowjackets, can make life miserable. Start with wasp traps. They really do work. However, if you can find their nest, they make a special wasp control spray that will foam into the nest and wipe it out. Do this at night and with great caution. I've been a beekeeper most of my life and been stung hundreds of times, I still think Yellowjacket stings are the worst.

The reusable kind of wasp traps are best (mine are probably 10 years old). The commercial bait that comes with them works well— and so does a scoop of dog or cat food. Anything the little boogers would normally go for. Find the right spot to hang the trap and you'll probably fill it multiple times. Just a few feet can make a difference in whether they'll come, so be persistent. Hang it where you see them and adjust as needed.

ANTS: Until last year I'd always had luck mixing borax with sugar and some water. I'd leave the dissolved solution anywhere they'd come to scout... for three days. By then they'd taken it back to their nest, and no more ants.

Then came last year when the teeny-tiny black and reddish ants arrived in droves. I dutifully made up my borax solution— with only minimal success. I could kill them on contact with about any kitchen cleaner, but wiping out the nest is the final answer. So this is another year, and we'll see how it goes.

DEERHORN VALLEY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION...

The DVCA meets monthly on the third Tuesday. An optional potluck lunch precedes each meeting and DVCA is always open to new ideas and

participation. They're a truly great group of neighbors and friends. Here's a recap of the May 16th meeting held at President Susie Norton's home.

FIRESAFE COUNCIL: Deerhorn is now part of the expanded Rural San Diego Fire Safe Council that has applied for a Calfire onemillion\$ grant that would include clearing 250 miles of roads (60%) private). DV residents mostly live along private easements and have been grading dirt roads like Mother Grundy for years on their own. This has left sunken roadways at risk of flooding and deterioration due to the lost dirt and rock. If funding is granted it may be used to add material and restore road height (and safety) to our major dirt roads.

FIRE GRANTS: Work paid for by the Sunrise Powerlink Grants (\$2500/household) must be completed by August 4th. If you did NOT apply/receive this year's grant for Defensible Space or Structure Hardening, you can still apply for a Priority Vents Grant through August 11. Remember: Embers are the most common cause of homes lost to wildfire. The \$2500 amount will cover both vents and installation for most homes. Details: SunrisePowerlinkGrants.com

Why did the cows cross the road?

It all started as a 4H project. By the way, what happened to Jamul/Dulzura's 4H Club? I loved supporting them and buying a lamb or pig (not alive, of course) from them.

John Austel has an Animal Science degree and 3 sons, now adults, that were kept out of trouble as teens by raising animals as their 4H projects. The boys were fascinated by photos in the family home showing John as a Cowboy when he was young. They had a regular clientele of friends to buy shares of the "stockers", and dreamed of being ranchers & cowboys, too. John and Liz were adamant, that if their boys really wanted to raise cattle for beef year-round, they needed to study the bloodlines, keep the herd hormone free, and make sure the feed was pesticide free. Do it Right, or don't do it. At that time, they were living on Proctor Valley Road and keeping the cattle at the Ivanhoe Ranch.

Some background on Hollenbeck Canyon Wildlife area and Rancho Jamul Ecological Reserve: These areas, now owned by California Department of Fish & Wildlife, were grazed by cattle for 150 years, mostly by the Daley Family. The original intent of CDFW was to rehabilitate the land and restore many of the native species. Unfortunately, once the cattle were no longer grazing, non-native grasses and species took over; not a desired result. Highly flammable grasses became the norm. Tracie Nelson, Manager of the RJER at the time, looked for solutions, including attempting to plant sectioned-off areas to attract specific birds and butterflies. The projects became too labor intensive.

John needed to move his cattle from the Ivanhoe Ranch. He met with Tracie Nelson, CDFW Officials, USDA, NRCS and a group called the Rangeland Management Advisory Committee (who advises the Board of Forestry, the final decision maker) and came up with an agreement to try cattle grazing on a small section of the RJER. This area had been a Burrowing Owl Habitat, but they slowly disappeared after the cattle were gone. Non-native plants and grasses had moved in, and the ground squirrels & other burrowing critters moved out. Time to bring in the Cows, which he did. The cattle foraged on the non-native thatch, trampled organic matter into the soils, and guickly restored advantageous habitat for burrowing critters. The San Diego Zoo developed a "Head Start" program with some Burrowing Owls given them from another part of the County where they'd lost their habitat. Tracie acquired 18 owls in 2017. Within 1 year, there were over 100. This helped convince State Officials that "managed grazing" was a viable option. And John increased his herd.

How does it work? The Austels get paid nearly 75% of hard costs for prescribed targeted grazing. This is a regenerative, science-based, sustainable program, so it means John keeps daily track of where his 2 herds of Cow-Calfs and Yearlings are and how much is being grazed. Soil quality and endangered species are tracked by engineers from the Resource Conservation District and the California Department of Food and Agriculture. Each geographically different section of the two properties must be treated uniquely, depending on its environmental makeup.

Why should you care? Jamulians main benefit to targeted grazing is Wildfire Fuel Reduction. Cal Fire is onboard with this project. Car fires are the greatest wildfire risk along SR 94, so the first place the herds graze is along the highway. This corridor also helps fire-fighters access fires. Targeted grazing is safer, more economical and healthier for the environment than controlled burns. January, 1997, I called 911 to report an unattended fire the size of a garage at 9:30PM on the far east end of Hollenbeck Canyon. Santa Ana winds were blowing. This was supposed to be a "controlled burn" and it nearly destroyed homes in the Harper Ranch area and burned to the very edge of Rancho Jamul Estates. Targeted grazing would have made stopping this wildfire easier.

John and Liz now have 21 paddocks to rotate between the herds, on both sides of SR 94. Every month or two when the thatch density and grass height dictates, Liz, John and their sons get to play Cowboys moving cattle while on horseback, the old-fashioned Cowboy way. This occasionally includes moving a herd from Rancho Jamul Ecological Reserve to Hollenbeck right across SR 94! They do have traffic control with stop signs and safety vests to modernize the process. And when you see them, you'll know just why the cows cross the road!









From the Desk of Dr. Salas - OGMS Principal

THE ECHO VALLEY FIRE 1986 OR 87

I had no more than been issued my 'Turnouts' and attended a few Thursday trainings when I had my first Wild land Brush fire experience... My family and I had been attending a wedding down in Balboa Park and on the way home around 3 Pm noticed smoke coming from the area of Millar Ranch road on the north side of Mt. Miguel.

My County pager had gone off indicating a fire in Echo Valley, Proctor Valley Rd....As we got closer to Jamul the fire appeared to be crossing over to the land to the east of Mt Miguel...

By and by we got to the staging area at the Jamul Liquor store parking lot at 94 and Jefferson where volunteers were loading up on our 'hand me down' apparatus..

I saw my engine waiting for crew and jumped out of my truck with my turnouts leaving wife and then baby Mike to go home and wait for a call to come get me... turns out that call would be around midnight when the fire had moved on to devour 6,000 acres of the Daly Ranch.

In those days 'rookies' like me, rode on the back tailboard of the fire engine... We had a safety strap to hold us on but we still held on with both hands to a cross bar on the hose bed as the engine made it way down Proctor Valley road to the site of the fire...The Echo Valley community consisted of about a dozen ranch style homes on about 3-5 acres each with a lot of horse corrals and out buildings... The fire was 'towering' above the homes in the brushy area to the west of Echo Valley.

Our mission was to let the fire 'blow through' then put out roof and eve fires as they occurred. We did not have water enough to 'wet down' anyone's house or outbuildings. An adobe home with a red tile roof was one of the first to go... they had had plants and bushes growing right under the eves and when the bushes caught fire, the overhanging eves and roof caught fire as well..

When we got there the tile roof had just fallen to the floor below and the house was a total loss but for the adobe walls still standing.

One fact I do remember vividly was that those homes that had Rainbird sprinklers on the roof and ample wild land clearance, (no bushes) around the perimeter, did not suffer any damage...

We put out many 'eve' fires that afternoon and most homes were saved... not so with out-buildings though... Many out-buildings were lost as were many animals stuck in their pens as the fire blew through... a sad day to be sure. There was no way to stop or even slow down that fire with the equipment we had... I never saw an 'Air Tanker' or water dropping helicopter like you see today as a first responder... we just had to let it blow through and put out spot fires as we could.

Along about midnight the last 'eve' fires had been put out and we headed back to for the staging area to go home or be picked up by our families...The message here is:... Be Prepared... Clear your brush while it is green... Have an evacuation plan for your family with a pre- arranged place to meet in case you cannot go home.... Pack a 'Go Bag' with important papers, photos and medication... Be alert.... Listen to news reports... Register your cell phones for Emergency Alerts... and heed Official warnings to evacuate....

That's my story and I'm stick'n to it... Dave Beekman, JVFD
