
End of season remarks from Capt Miguel

The 2023 sailing season is coming to an end but I would like to say a few words about what we accomplished at No Salt Sailing. We started the organization November 2022 and had four sessions with Veterans onshore and on sailing vessels. Boat owners from Montrose harbor made their vessels available to train the Veterans and all of a sudden we had a fleet ranging from 25 to 34 foot sailing vessels. At the beginning of the season, Jester was our main vessel and at some point Aeolus and Agnus joined the fleet and they will become part of the winter training program. The feedback from the Veterans that attended the training sessions was very good and we thank them for being a part of this community. A special thank you to Laura Sparks who fed us with a big smile, making sure that everyone was taken care of and providing wonderful meals. I will probably forget someone but thank you to the Corinthian Yacht Club for all the support and for making available the boat house for the onshore classes. To all the skippers, photographers, volunteers and everyone who contributed to make our dream come true, a heartfelt thank you. We will stay in touch over the winter. Keep checking your email because the winter program will be out soon.

Winter Program:

The season may be coming to an end but we will be busy during the winter. As previously mentioned our fleet has three sailing vessels now, Jester, Aeolus and Agnes, and they need to be taken care doing maintenance to the engine, wood work, electric system and so on. This is a program that will keep us busy for a few months and we will need all hands on deck in order to get all the vessels ready for next season. Sooner than later an email will be sent to all of you with the winter program and asking for your collaboration to get the job done.
