

PROMOTION POLICY – IX

Promotion of class IX students will be based on annual examination and internal assessment.

ANNUAL EXAMINATION

There will be annual examination of 80 marks for each subject. To be declared pass, a student has to secure 33% marks out of 80 in each subject. The examination will cover 100% of the syllabus of class IX.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

A student has to secure 33% marks out of 20 marks in each subject. The details of computation of marks in internal assessment are given below:

Note: Periodic written test of 10 marks has been split into two parts: -

5 MARKS FOR PEN PAPER 5 MARKS FOR MULTIPLE ASSESSMENTS

As per CBSE, It is mandatory for the child to secure 33% in internal assessment to be eligible for appearing in theory examination.

In order to be declared pass, a child must score an aggregate of 36%.

COMPARTMENT EXAMINATION

Candidates offering 5 subjects and failing one of the five subjects of external examination shall be placed in compartment in those subjects provided he/she qualifies in all subjects of internal assessment.

In order to be declared “Successful” in Compartment Examination, a student must secure at least 33% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the compartment examination, provided that a minimum of 33 out of 100 marks must be secured in total i.e. marks of Compartment Examination plus marks of Internal Assessment.

In case a child fails in one subject, he/she is allowed to appear for a compartment exam in that subject at a gap of minimum 15 days between the declaration of result and the conduction of Re-exam.

A re-compartment exam may be given to the child in case he/she does not pass in the 1st compartment exam.

A student shall be declared fail in case he/she does not qualify the re- compartment exam.

GRACE MARKS

Grace marks up to maximum 10 in all shall be awarded to a student to enable him/her to reach the minimum required of 33% of marks in each of the subject. The 10 marks may be spread over three subjects with not more than 5 in each subject.
