To date, the Lassen County COVID-19 (novel coronavirus) total tests are as follows:

0 - Known cases

86 - Negative

8 - Pending

94 - Total Tests

The California Governor Gavin Newsom commended the progress in flattening the curve allowing the entire state time to increase our preparedness for the health care delivery system. However, he does recognize that these actions have come with a cost. Our local community has felt the impact dealt to the economy, unemployment/poverty, and our overall daily lives.

The Governor wants to lift the stay-at-home order but only using a gradual, sciencebased, and data-driven framework. On a local level, we recommend Lassen County residents to continue to follow the stay-at-home order until it is removed.

The Governor has established a road map outlining six main indicators that will signal modifying the stay-at-home order. California's six indicators for modifying the stay-at-home order are:

- 1. The ability to monitor and protect our communities through testing, contact tracing, isolating, and supporting those who are positive or exposed;
- 2. The ability to prevent infection in people who are at risk for more severe COVID-19;
- 3. The ability of the hospital and health systems to handle surges;
- 4. The ability to develop therapeutics to meet the demand;
- 5. The ability for businesses, schools, and child care facilities to support physical distancing; and
- 6. The ability to determine when to reinstitute certain measures, such as the stay-at-home orders, if necessary.
