The Director of Community Social Services, Jenna Aguilera, would like the public to know that "as the month of April nears its end, our work to prevent child abuse does not. It is imperative to say that in times of crisis and economic insecurity, rates of child abuse and neglect increase." She notes that reports to Lassen County's Child and Family Services have declined during the COVID-19 pandemic but "when children stay at home, they are isolated from places where adults often look out for their safety and well-being including schools, child care facilities, places of worship and other public areas."

We remind all adults and community members to be aware of their responsibility to protect children. You are essential to keeping our children safe during this time. Lassen County has created flyers for you to find information on how to recognize that a child is unsafe and respond. These resources are designed for essential workers, school professionals, and the general public. You can find them on Lassencares.org.
