To date, the Lassen County COVID-19 (novel coronavirus) total tests are as follows:

0 - Known cases

115 - Negative

5 - Pending

120 - Total Tests

The Lassen County COVID-19 Incident Command and the Lassen County Public Health Department continue testing residents of Lassen County. Healthcare providers determine if residents need to be tested based upon symptoms and guidelines provided by the State/Federal government.

In our live Facebook Question and Answer forum, residents asked our panel about what happens to the results of test administered on Lassen County residents in healthcare facilities in other communities. The panel explained that the results are received by the Lassen County Public Health Department when Lassen County residents are tested outside of the county in other testing facilities. In an attempt to provide additional transparency, the following is a compilation of testing facilities that have sent the results of tests completed outside Lassen County:
