To date, the Lassen County COVID-19 (novel coronavirus) total tests are as follows:

0 - Known cases

118 - Negative

5 - Pending

123 - Total Tests

Governor Newsom announced details on how California plans to modify the Stay-at-Home order in the future. "These modifications are based on science, health and data, and will happen in 4 stages", the Governor explained. The California Resilience Roadmap has 4 stages:

Stage 1 – Safety and Preparedness

- Where we are currently
- Continue to build out testing, contract tracing, PPE, and hospital surge capacity
- Making essential workforce environments as safe as possible

#### Stage 2 – Lower Risk Workplaces

- Gradually opening some lower risk workplaces with adaptations
  - Examples: retail, manufacturing, offices (when telework is not possible), and more public spaces

#### Stage 3 – Higher Risk Workplaces

- Open higher risk environments with adaptions and limits on size of gatherings
  - Examples: Personal Care (salons, gyms), entertainment venues, and inperson religious services (churches and weddings)

### Stage 4 – End of Stay-at-Home Order

- Re-open highest risk environments and venues once therapeutics have been developed
  - o Examples: concerts, convention centers, live audience sports

Dr. Kenneth Korver, the Lassen County Health Officer, sent a letter to the Governor requesting to let our county reopen using the **Lassen County Recovery Plan** created locally. If the Governor approves, we will act swiftly to reopen the county. The Incident Commanders, Sheriff Dean Growdon and Barbara Longo, and the Public Information Officer, Richard Egan, will be hosting a live Facebook question and answer forum tomorrow (Thursday, April 30<sup>th</sup>) at 6:00pm. The panel will provide an update and answer questions as they are submitted on Facebook.
