



Dieffenbachia Care and Handling Guide:

1. Light:

Dieffenbachia thrives in medium to bright, indirect light. It can tolerate lower light levels but may grow more slowly.

Avoid exposing the plant to direct sunlight, as this can scorch the leaves.

2. Watering:

Keep the soil consistently moist but not waterlogged. Water when the top inch of the soil feels slightly dry.

Allow the water to drain freely from the bottom of the pot, and empty the saucer to prevent water accumulation.

3. Soil:

Plant Dieffenbachia in a well-draining, peat-based potting mix. Ensure the soil has good aeration.
