OVER \$53,000 AWARDED to LOCAL NONPROFITS

At its annual Awards Presentation, the Ottawa County Community Foundation awarded over \$53,000 in community grants to thirty-two local nonprofit organizations. The community grants program addresses the current and emerging needs of local residents in the fields of education, social services, physical and mental health, safe and positive living environment, natural resources, and the arts.

The Foundation acknowledged the work of so many organizations that meet pressing needs in the community and conduct effective programs throughout Ottawa County. We applaud each organization's efforts. Find a list of 2021 grant recipients on page 3.

Joy Roth Little Tiger Award in Memory of Our Founder

Words could not express our sadness at the sudden 2020 loss of our president, mentor, and friend—Joy Roth. Joy was the spark plug that launched the Foundation in 1999. Her passion for the mission of OCCF and her boundless energy grew it into the vibrant Community Foundation that it is today with over \$11 million in assets and 95 established funds. The OCCF Board decided they would create a special recognition in memory of Joy.

During the annual Grant Awards Presentation, the inaugural *Joy Roth Little Tiger Award* was presented to honor her legacy. Board Member John Madison remembered Joy as an avid fan of the Auburn University Tigers football team and described how she was known by her family and friends to be somewhat of a "little tiger" herself. Thus the *Joy Roth Little Tiger Award* was created to recognize similar champions who go above and beyond to give back to the community. The 2021 award was presented to Bistro 163, a "pay it forward" restaurant in Port Clinton. The award included a \$500 grant and a framed certificate. The staff and team of volunteers at Bistro 163 have served over 25,000 meals throughout the county since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic and continue to do so.

Small Businesses Benefit from Innovation Grants

Thanks to a very generous \$62,000 grant from the Burton D. Morgan Foundation, the Ottawa County Community Foundation

(OCCF) was able to partner with the Ottawa County Improvement Corporation (OCIC) to bring the Regional Incubator for Sustainability and Entrepreneurship (RISE) Small Business Innovation Grant program to Ottawa County in October of 2020.

This grant program focused on assisting existing entrepreneurs to grow their small businesses. Applicants proposed innovative and strategic investments to help them pivot and adapt despite the public health pandemic that devastated the local economy. A RISE Selection Committee, composed of seven representatives from the OCIC, OCCF, and partnering organizations and businesses, selected the grant recipients.

The RISE grant program turned out to be a great success with \$63,485 awarded to 23 businesses, with grants ranging from \$1,000-\$3,500. The grants supported projects such as capital improvements, technology enhancements, and training and education for marketing initiatives.

A sample of businesses that were awarded grants:

- *Bar-B-Que Traveler* (Lacarne): transforming a delivery truck into a food truck and a new website for ordering
- Christy's Corner Café (Elmore): display freezer and supplies for carry out
- Clinton House (Port Clinton): fence and wrought iron furniture for outdoor seating and creation of beer/wine garden
- Coastal Swing (Catawba Island): patio construction, fencing, and outdoor lighting
- Lake Erie Islands Nature & Wildlife Center (Put-In-Bay): producing Explorer Packs (tote bag, binoculars, compass, etc.) and marketing materials
- *Lilly & Gert's* (Port Clinton): specialty cameras and related equipment to prepare online inventory and website content design
- Put-In-Bay Watercraft Rental (Put-In-Bay): additional kayaks and GPS units
- R Coffee Corner (Catawba Island): outside digital sign to increase visibility
- *Radiant Remodeling* (Oak Harbor): Smart TV's for training installers in the warehouse and showing new products in the showroom
- Whimsy & Blue (Elmore): computer, video equipment, and microphone to expand social media platforms and outreach
