118 Scholarships Awarded in 2022

The Ottawa County Community Foundation (OCCF) annually distributes scholarships to deserving students pursuing educational endeavors to further their career goals. In 2022, OCCF awarded **\$164,822 in scholarships to 118 young people**. A list of the scholarships and the 2022 recipients begins on page 3.

Thanks to generous donors, more than 46 endowed scholarship funds have been established, and the Foundation also holds several non-endowed scholarships that

are available for a limited number of years. Scholarships are given each year according to the specific requirements established by the fund donor.

"We rely on the guidance department staff to help connect students with the many scholarships that are available to those seeking further education," said OCCF Scholarship Chair Dave Slosser, who partners with local guidance counselors at each of the county high schools. Slosser adds, "It's important for high school seniors to work closely with their high school guidance department."

It is anticipated that, this year, more than 125 individual scholarships will be awarded, with a value ranging from \$400 to \$3,500.

Three Unique Scholarships

While the majority of OCCF scholarships are designated for graduating high school seniors, three unique scholarships are available to students fitting the specific criteria established by the donor.

- Donald & Joan Loeffler Second Chance Scholarship supports Ottawa County adults seeking to further their education to obtain or continue employment.
- Ian Huffman Memorial Scholarship assists with study abroad/international experiences for college students who graduated from high schools in Ottawa, Erie, Lucas, Sandusky or Wood Counties.
- Stone Lab Scholarship supports local teachers and high school students taking summer courses at The Ohio State University Stone Lab.

DID YOU KNOW?

New scholarship funds may be created at any time, or an existing scholarship fund may be transferred to the Foundation. The two scholarship options are described below.

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FUND

- Requires \$25,000 to establish
- · Invested permanently and provides scholarships from annual earnings
- Donor establishes criteria for student eligibility, such as graduating from a specific high school, pursuing a degree in a particular field of study, attending a specific post-secondary institutions, and/or residing in a certain geographic area

NON-ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FUND

- Suggested \$1,000 minimum donation
- Scholarship is given on a one-time basis, or over several years, until the gift is fully utilized
- Donor establishes criteria for student eligibility, similar to an endowed fund

Scholarships Changing Lives

n May 2017, Port Clinton High School graduating senior Hannah Roberts saw her life move forward in a very significant way with the award of the James W. Longe scholarship (\$12,250 total), administered through the Ottawa County Community Foundation. The scholarship, established by Mr. Longe's son in 2004 as a permanent endowment fund generating multiple scholarships each year, was distributed in annual increments to Hannah as she earned a bachelor's degree in biology from John Carroll University (2021). She now attends the University of Toledo College of Medicine and Life Sciences and expects to graduate with a Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree in 2025.

"I had big, daunting dreams of being a physician, which were terrifying to my younger self. It meant so much to know that members of the community recognized the work I had done academically, to that point, and believed in what I wanted to do with my future ... Grateful is truly not great enough of a word," Hannah says, of the scholarships she received.



Advanced education is expensive. Across Ottawa County, hundreds of students seek financial aid as they take their next step into adulthood. Organizations, families and individuals may set up OCCF scholarship funds with specific parameters to help area students with limited resources to pursue their academic and career goals.

"Hannah's story, one of many across the county, is a sign of the generosity of her community, and a perfect illustration of what can happen when a young person is given support to pursue his or her dreams," says OCCF Executive Director Shea McGrew. "We are here to help facilitate that through our scholarship program."

Hannah notes she has chosen a profession reliant on scientific study but rooted in altruism and compassion, adding, "I've chosen a profession with the very spirit of my hometown. Ottawa County and the Ottawa County Community Foundation ... I owe so much of what I am to you. Your emotional and financial support has served as a constant reminder that my hometown believed in me."

Hannah is interested in practicing in the Port Clinton area, after medical school, and upon completion of her residency.
