The Blue Knights® International Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club, Inc., is an International fraternal organization comprised of law enforcement officers and their families who are also motorcycle enthusiasts.

Headquartered in Bangor, Maine, the Blue Knights® operates under an international constitution and bylaws within an organizational structure of an international board of directors and eleven regional conferences, each conference including a number of local chapters. The Blue Knights® promotes safe and responsible motorcycling and sponsors fund raising in support of numerous charities.

The inception of the Blue Knights® came in April 1974 when a Bangor Maine, police officer had the idea of forming a motorcycle club for people in law enforcement. Since then, the club has grown to become the foremost and largest international law enforcement motorcycle club. Today, there are over twenty thousand Blue Knights® worldwide in six hundred in six hundred chapters in the twenty-nine countries and one commonwealth.

SAFETY MESSAGE

Mike Manen, Safety Officer



Well folks this is my first article as the new Safety Officer. One thing I know is I am not a writer, but I will do my best. Most of you, if not all, have vast more riding experience than I, so I'm going to start with the basics, mainly for my own benefit. I took the following out of the Blue Knights Safety Manual.

THE SIMPLE STUFF a) Check your bike beforehand. Proper maintenance is a pre-requisite for a day of safe riding. Check oil and tire pressures before you leave home. Check electrical systems to ensure all signal lights are working.

- b) Have what you will need for the ride with you. Remember water or fruit juices, proper clothing to encompass any inclement weather changes and a cell phone if you have one. Don't forget tools and a first aid kit.
- c) Have a full gas tank and empty bladder!
- d) Show up for rides 15-30 minutes before the pre-ride briefing so you don't miss important information or keep others waiting.
- e) Ride Safe, Be Courteous, Have Fun.

PRE-RIDE BRIEFING Fifteen minutes prior to departure, the Lead Road/Ride Captain will give a pre-ride briefing to go over the route and review group riding communications and safety topics. Be patient and give your full attention. Group riding communications and safety topics must be covered at the beginning of each group ride. This may not be your first group ride, but it could be for the person riding in front of or behind you! This pre-ride briefing is for safety. Ask questions, don't be bashful and make certain you have all the information you need regarding the ride. If you're a new rider or new to the group this may be a good time to inform the Road Captains what they need to know about you and your riding limitations. They will be happy to accommodate you e.g. If you prefer to ride up front or in the rear of the group.

I usually spend the evening prior to the ride doing a little cleaning on my bike, which also gives me a chance to do an inspection. Occasionally I'll find small items that left unchecked could turn into larger items on the road. In closing I guess the part of the boy scout motto fits here "Be Prepared".

One more thing I noticed, and I think its kind of ironic. The author of the Safety Manuals Road name is "Crash".

Picking a Riding Partner

No one in any motorcycle training session I took ever mentioned riding with a partner. It is one of those things you can do without and still be a good rider. If you like riding with someone else to keep you company and share the adventure of the open road, I will caution you that the wrong partner can ruin a good trip.

Types of partners

For the sake of clarification, I would like to divide "partners" into two categories: **Pillion** and fellow **Riders**. Pillion partners ride on your motorcycle on the passenger seat. The rider and passenger are in close contact all the time.

Fellow Riders are on a separate motorcycle and accompany you on the road. Riders may lead or follow, but travel as a team.

Pillion Partners

If you have a spouse or "significant other", that person would be the logical choice to be your Pillion partner. Before you decide to take him or her on a long trip, I recommend you determine if your partner will enjoy the adventure with you. I was once on a "day ride" where a spouse jumped off her husband's motorcycle at a lunch stop and berated him in front of his friends. She didn't like the passenger seat comfort, or the wind or group riding. It was an embarrassing way to find out she was not a good Pillion partner.

If your prospective Pillion partner has never ridden on a motorcycle before, a short introductory ride will help decide if this is "fun". I recommend you resist the temptation to show the maximum performance of the motorcycle, and keep the ride low key. A pleasant, smooth ride will go a long way to gaining confidence.

If your partner likes local rides, suggest an over-night ride to a destination around 100 -200 miles. Pick two days that sunny, mild and calm. Figure an average of 50 miles of travel for each hour of riding time. So, a 100-mile ride would take two hours, a 200-mile ride would take four hours, etc. This is a comfortable pace that allows for breaks and meals along the way.

When you return, your Pillion partner will either be ready for longer rides, or decide that motorcycle adventures are not for him/her.

Fellow Riders

Fellow riders are another category. The right riding partner can really enhance your motorcycle trips. Conversely, they can ruin the best of trips, so choose wisely, Grasshopper.

Something to consider: you and your riding partner should share common interests. You both should be considerate of the other person's ideas and suggestions about the trip. Plan on being patient during stressful

times, and expect your riding partner to do the same. Being friends goes a long way toward being riding partners.

Having said that, I will confess to being picky about who rides with me. Here are some *disqualifiers* that I look for on an initial day ride.

- He takes unnecessary risks (unsafe passing, aggressive riding)
- Poor safety habits (novelty helmet, minimal safety apparel)
- Inflexible (insists on favorite gas station, restaurant, photo stops)
- Unreliable; doesn't show for the ride, cancels at the last minute or leaves unexpectedly during the ride.
- Drug or alcohol use (uses either and still rides)

And some *qualifiers* that get an invitation to ride with me again.

- Plans ride route together (destination, stops along the way)
- Is reliable; shows up on time, ready to ride.
- Keeps motorcycle in good condition (no loud exhaust, good tire tread, etc.)
- Doesn't make me worry about riding ability (I don't have to watch him in my mirrors)
- Saves libation until after the ride is done for the day.

Once you find good riding partners, your motorcycle adventures can begin. On my rides all over America and much of Europe, my partners have helped me with mechanical problems and physical illness. I have done the same for them. Having someone trustworthy with you when you break down or get too sick to ride is invaluable. After you find the partner(s) that are a good fit, enjoy the horizons...


The above items are immediately available from the Quarter Master. Contact Arturo at the monthly meetings or by email.
