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The Editors Corner:

It appears that Amtrak is on a roll. Last year it collected \$2 billion in revenue. This past October they announced they have reached cost sharing agreements with 18 States. Those states will pay a portion of operating costs on the short haul routes within their borders. In August this year, those short lines carried 1,469,990 riders, a 5% increase over last year. This would appear to be a boon for both Amtrak and those states that are participating. For Amtrak it's a shot in the arm to increase revenue in addition to helping with the bottom line making them less dependent on federal funding which congress recently reduced. For the states it means less stress on already overloaded and deteriorating highways, an answer to the airlines reducing the number of short distance flights, and less pollution as a result of fewer cars on the road. The usual short haul takes roughly the same or less time as driving between the same destinations. Unfortunately, while Indiana is, Ohio and Kentucky are not among the states farsighted enough to take part.

December 2013 Car Projects Report

Our 2013 Division 7 car project, Merchants Despatch Transportation's 40' ice reefers, by Accurail, in wood or all-steel versions, are offered in two numbers for each type of reefer, priced at \$18 for singles, and \$70 for a four-car set, plus Ohio tax. We have sold 175 cars during the first 5-1/2 months, and have 328 car kits available. Our announcement with photograph appeared in the November issues of The NMRA Magazine and Railroad Model Craftsman.

Our 2012 car project, Allegheny Midland 41'-6" steel gondolas, by Accurail, are offered in three numbers, priced at \$18 for singles, and \$51 for a three-car set, plus Ohio sales tax. We have sold 219 cars during the first 17-1/2 months. We have 172 car kits available. We anticipate breaking even after the sale of 7 more car kits.

Our company store has plenty of AM gondolas and MDT reefers, as well as a limited number of colorful Virginian & Ohio reefers for sale. We also have a few beautiful N&SS outside-braced 40' boxcars.

Annual Holiday Train Show

(south of Oxford) Admission is &10.00 for adults and \$5.00 for children. All proceeds go to charity and i n the first 6 years they have raised over \$50,000. The layout consists of over 1 ½ miles of track above a 21 car garage. According to Trains Magazine, it is the largest private collection and is capable of running 43 trains at a time thru the towns and villages. If you go, parking is at Marshall school immediately to the north.






