## Fernbank Park & Lodge

The following photos show what you will see when you come to the June 11<sup>th</sup> picnic. I hope this gives you a taste of the wonderful site for this year's picnic.

1. You get into the park off of Rt. 50 in Sayler Park (see also the map posted on our website). The Thornton Avenue entrance is shared by the Cabana On the River restaurant and 13 Below Brewery. So you first cross the railroad tracks used by CSX, IORY, and CIND. You will probably see some railcars parked on the tracks both east and west of Thornton Avenue.





2. Once across the tracks, you will need to go to the left onto Forbes Road to enter the park. There is no gate attendant nor entrance fee. If someone of authority questions you, just say you are attending a function at the Lodge.

# Peter C. Weiglin

## May 2, 1938 - March 31, 2023

It is with great sadness we report long-time Division 7 member Peter Weiglin passed away on Friday, March 31, 2023 at the age of 84. Peter was an accomplished author, teacher, broadcaster, producer, narrator, historian, speaker and railroad modeler. He had an MBA degree from the University of Pittsburgh, authored or co-authored at least 6 books on a variety of marketing, computing, arts and railroad topics, plus wrote, produced or narrated many TV or radio segments, including hosting the weekly radio show "Stage and Soundtrack" on WMKV at 8 to 9 pm every Sunday night (see <u>https://wmkvfm.org/programme/stage-and-soundtrack/</u>). Years ago, Peter helped revitalize the public transit industry and also taught management and marketing at the University of California at Berkeley Extension.

Peter was an avid model railroader and railroad enthusiast including a life membership since 1954 in the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA). He was an active trustee of our Cincinnati Division 7 of the NMRA and Chair of our annual Spring Flea Market. Peter's prior Division 7 roles included Superintendent, Nominating Committee Chair, and emcee at the 2018 Cincinnati Express regional convention banquet. He was also active in the NMRA when he lived in California, as well as the arts community there. Peter was also engaged in the Pennsylvania Railroad Technical & Historical Society and his HO scale model railroad reflected that interest.

See our Division 7 website for additional notices and perspectives on Peter's life. A memorial service and reception celebrating Peter's life was held on Saturday, April 29 at Faith United Methodist Church in Batavia, Ohio.

Our heartfelt condolences go to Peter's wife Jeanne, and all his friends and family.











## LAYOUT VISIT to Gary Ossenschmidt's HO-Scale Layout








## LAYOUT VISIT to Gary Ossenschmidt's HO-Scale Layout











# LAYOUT VISIT to Gary Ossenschmidt's N-Scale Layout

## Division 7 Car Project (Limited Edition!)

Cincinnati Division 7's Car Project Committee is pleased to announce the availability of our latest, limited-edition car project!

Using Accurail's 2200 Series ACF 2-Bay Covered Hopper as the basis, we are offering it in a Norfolk & Western repaint scheme.

These cars are N&W class HC-46 and are from an original batch of fifty built in 1966 by ACF and were painted in the Round Herald paint scheme.

Sometime subsequent to that some cars went through a general maintenance program where they were repainted in the block N&W livery. Photos were found showing that at least three of these cars (road numbers 170753, 170768 and 170794) were reweighed at some later date because that area is "patched out" on the car with the new data displayed. Those same photos place these three cars as being in service in 1992 and 2004! It is these three, highly unique, road numbers that Cincinnati Division 7 is now offering for sale.

As with all Accurail cars, they are in kit form only.

Pricing is \$25 per car, or a 3-car set at \$70. Shipping (via USPS Priority) is \$9.20 for one car and \$16.25 for two to three cars.

Ohio residents, please add 7.8% sales tax on the total price of the kits and the shipping and handling fee.

I received these cars the week of 9/12. Heritage and purchasing details are posted on our Division 7 web site.


