

I feel it my responsibility to offer a public apology to six Division 7 members who showed up at Harmony Lodge for John Wissinger's Scenery Clinic on March 13th not knowing the clinic had been moved. Although we tried to make the venue change known as best we could, in retrospect we could have put a note on the door at Harmony informing anyone who showed up there that the clinic had been moved but, unfortunately we didn't think of that. 15 found the new meeting place but 6 did not. Not a good average. The Web site and Electronic Oil Can contained the correct information but the mailed Oil Can, due to publication timing, did not. This leads me to my next item.

Communications:

We are a Division of 295 members. None of us receive our daily news in exactly the same way. Some use the Internet exclusively while others still prefer the newspaper. Still others get all their news from the radio while most prefer a mixture of the three. Individual communications are either by e-mail, telephone or by US Mail. Some pay bills on-line while others still prefer to use Uncle Sam's 44-cent stamp.

So how do we communicate amongst the membership within Division? Currently, it is a "mixed bag". Email is the medium of choice among the Officers, Trustees and Committee Chairs. But with regard to the entire roster, only 72% have listed an email and of those many are sadly out of date... making email an "iffy" thing with respect to effectively getting the word out to all. Yes, we have home addresses for everyone but the US Mail is a relatively time restrictive [slow] and, as you will see, expensive option.

Now let us consider the Division 7 Web Site. There it is! One single place to find all the Division information fit to print! Even the Oil Can E-Version is posted there on or about the first of every month. The beauty of the Web Site and the E-Oil Can is that we can update and correct almost instantly. Sure, we do pay someone to do that, about \$50 per month. However, the cost of publishing the 8 page mailed Oil Can at \$1.55 per recipient ten times a year times 207 recipients is \$3,209 per year! In comparison, the Web Site and the E-Oil Can is a true bargain. Have you figured out where I might be headed with this?

12 out 15 Mid-Central Divisions now offer their newsletter only as an attachment to an email or on their respective Web Sites. Like it or not, low-cost and immediate electronic communication is the wave of the future. Your BOD is currently considering of a "blend" of monthly postcards and 100% electronic. Will a program like that be popular with everyone? Probably not. There will likely be some resistance, but rest assured that we are working on a way to make such a significant change into a happy experience for everyone. More information will be coming soon.

We will be creating a separate Web Site for the fall "Cincinnati Model Train Show". (Please note the name change... cool, huh?) Dayton swears by their dedicated Show Web-Site as an effective and popular tool for attracting the public. We are looking for a Division 7 Member who has experience with designing or maintaining Web Sites. If that is you... we need to talk. Who knows? Maybe there is another Committee Chair position there. "E-Communications Chair"???

2011 Car Projects Report

Eleven Allegheny Midland hoppers were sold in February and March, bringing the total sold to 466 with sales of \$7,711, generating a net income of \$2,138 for Division 7. 120 AM kits have been converted to V&O kits by changing out the car bodies and re-labeling the boxes. We have 11 AM kits remaining in inventory, plus 8 kits in our company store's inventory. If we sell 7 more kits, we should achieve a net profit of \$2,230 for the AM project.

Ninety V&O hoppers were sold in the past month, bringing the total sold to 254 (83%) of 307 kits. Sales totaled \$4,248 with a net income of \$1,198. We have 23 V&O kits in inventory. If all V&O kita are sold, Division 7 should achieve a net profit of \$2,200 for this project.

Announcements of the V&O car project appeared in the March issue of NMRA Magazine, the April issue of Model Railroader, Railroad model Craftsman, and Model Railroad News. Hopefully, both car projects will have sold out by May, and we can initiate a new project.
