If you looked around the show some more, it was hard to find your way back to where you were before. I was talking to Rick Lach, the Division 3 Superintendent on Sunday afternoon. He said the attendance was about what they were hoping for. Apparently, the owners of the mall were also quite happy since the show brought more people to the mall than had been there for quite some time.


Jim MacKnight reported at the November meeting that our latest car project, the V & O boxcars with DF markings, has passed the break-even point in sales in just over four months. The AM gondolas are almost sold out, and the C & O boxcars are still selling. Check the division web site for pricing information. Each of these car kits is available from the company store at our monthly meetings.

Jim puts a lot of effort into these car projects. He does the background research, interfaces with the kit manufacturer, and does all the packing and shipping to fill the orders. Each year, the car projects provide a source of income the division can use for their community service projects. Jim's work on the car projects provides a great service to Division 7 and we are very lucky to have him in this role.

Speaking of Community Service, each year, Division 7 sponsors a series of clinics for the local Boy Scout councils to provide training for the Model Railroading merit badge. These clinics run for several Saturdays in February or March, depending on location. Several people who have helped present these clinics in the past will not be able to help in 2017, so we could use some help with this activity. It is necessary to complete a 'Youth Protection' training program before participating as a counselor for these clinics. Jim MacKnight is the contact person for this activity.

The next December 7 BOD meeting will be on December 9th at 7 pm, location to be determined. The major item for this meeting will be review and approval of the proposed 2017 division budget.

SECOND SECTION

Our November meeting was held for a final time at Partners in Prime in Hamilton on November 13th. Charles Bogart was our clinician, presenting a clinic entitled "The Tale of Two Cans" which followed the travels of two milk cans from farms in central Kentucky to the TriState Dairy in the West End of Cincinnati. One surprise to me was that one of these cans was picked up initially by interurban and then was transferred to the L&N to continue its journey. This makes sense, as a number of small towns that were not on the main rail lines had interurban service prior to WWI and some lasted into the 30s. As roads were improved, and trucks became available, deliveries would have shifted. Eventually, trucks replaced the cans and took over most of the deliveries directly to the dairies. Of course, cans had to be returned to the farm when empty, so milk shipments offer two opportunities for switching. In-bound had to be handled quickly; so it traveled on passenger trains. Returns could be made differently if the dairy so desired. Prior to, and following the meeting, the Whistle Stop Train Club in the basement of the senior center was open for viewing and to sell as much of their equipment and everything else as possible. The building has been sold to the Butler County school board, so the senior center is moving and the railroad club is disbanding as they have no place to move to. We also visited the six clubs at Ross Central.

Looking ahead:

Our December meeting will be at Westwood United Methodist Church on December 11th. In lieu of a clinic, we will have our traditional snackfest and digital slides event. Everyone is encouraged to bring some of their favorite railroad (model or prototype) pictures on a thumb drive and we will try to give everyone equal time. We will also have a presentation previewing the Mid-Central Region Convention in Louisville. The layout visits will be to Terry Judd's nearby N scale New Haven and to Jack Sibert's HO Clearview Valley Railroad.

And that will finish 2016. Moving on to January 2017, our January meeting will be on the third Sunday <u>January 15th</u>. The meeting location is Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Kenwood. Our clinician will be Terry Luginbuhl who will be presenting a clinic titled "DCC versus DC Basics". Some of you may have attended some of Terry's clinics at Tim's Trains in Northern Kentucky. We thought it would benefit our members to bring some of them to the whole group. We are starting with this "intro" topic and will then gauge what additional DCC related topics might work best for our members. The layout visits for January are Jim Stewart's HO Port Arthur Railway & Navigation Company and Dave Nenna's N scale ATSF/SP Tehachapi Subdivision. A photo of Dave's layout happens to be in the latest NMRA calendar!

In February, we will be back up north at the West Chester Library on Sunday February 12th, with a clinic by Mark Albert (of the Model Trolley Enthusiasts group you have seen at our shows) on modeling the iconic Crosley factory along I-75 (just south of I-74). Even if you don't need to model that building, this will help you with ideas on how to reproduce any prototype structure that you find you need to fully represent a certain time or place you are modeling.

There is no meeting in March because of the annual Flea Market at Lakota West Freshman School. It's not too early to mark your new 2017 calendar and block out time to volunteer for setup or tear down or the other jobs that are needed each year. The date of the Flea Market is Saturday March 11th and the time is 10:00am to 3:00pm.

On April 9th, we will be at Harmony Lodge in Spring Grove Village. Our clinician will be Michael Abraham who is the author of a new book called "Chasing the Powhatan Arrow". On May 7th, we will meet at St Mathias Catholic Church in Forest Park. This will be ahead of the Regional Convention "The Pan American" which runs May 18-21 in Louisville. In June, we will be on the east side at Anderson Senior Center. In July, we will up in Mason at St Susanna Church.

As I write this, it's a few days before Thanksgiving, but by the time you read it, Black Friday will have come and gone and the rush of the Christmas shopping season will be underway. You may be hoping for some special train related item to show up under your tree. To help your loved ones (who may not have much of a clue about any item you are looking for) I'd suggest you consider what my son has been doing for several years. He creates an email list of "suggestions" that includes a link to the on-line site where he has seen it advertised, often with a part number and a picture of just what the item is. I wouldn't have had any idea where to buy a drone with the right features he wanted. But with a "smart" shopping list I knew I was looking at the right thing. This also provides at least two related advantages. The site usually has related items that you can check out. Even if you are buying what was "directed", you can still add some surprise with additional items that were not on the list. The second is that you can get added to an email list from the supplier that can help you with future shopping (birthdays, etc.).

If you don't make it to the December meeting, I hope you have a happy and safe Holidays. Otherwise, I hope to see you in Westwood on December the 11th.

DIVISION 7 CAR PROJECT SALES REPORT- November 21, 2016

Our 2015 car project, Chesapeake & Ohio 40' USRA single-sheathed boxcars, in four numbers, have sold 299 cars (69%) in 14 months. We need more exposure to sell the remaining 132 cars. The car data and photos are being posted on the C&O Historical Society's Yahoo site.

Our 2012 car project, Allegheny Midland 41'6" steel gondolas, in three numbers, has been available for 53 months, with 98% of 391 cars sold. We have 7 cars available. This is a really fine kit from Accurail, with underbody brake details showing beneath the gondola body. It is easy to assemble, and looks great on any layout.

Our 2016 car project is Virginian & Ohio 40' steel, plug-door boxcars, in the traditional V&O blue, with damage-free loading symbols (DF-2). Four car numbers are available. Two cars are marked for paper lading only, and were built in 1951. Two other cars are marked for processed food loading only. These cars, built in 1948, were rebuilt in the V&O's shops in 1952 by adding plug doors and insulation.

These kits were manufactured in the USA by Accurail. We have sold 333 cars in 5 months (66%). Announcements have appeared in the NMRA Magazine's and Model Railroad News' October issues, and in Model Railroader's and Railroad Model Craftsman's November issues. We have 172 cars remaining in inventory.





Winter BOD meeting in Atlanta

The Winter Board of Directors meeting will once again be held in Atlanta, Georgia, on February 18, and 19, 2017 at the Drury Inn & Suites. The Budget and Operations meeting will begin at 2:00 PM on Friday, February 17, and the Board will be in caucus that evening. Both of those meetings are only open to invited guests. The regular, open session of the BOD meeting begins at 9:00 AM on Saturday, February 18. Because the agenda is not yet finalized, there's no way to tell if the meeting will continue on Sunday. All members are invited to attend the open sessions. Watch www.nmra.org for details.

News about the 2017 NMRA Elections

We are fast approaching the 2017 election. This election is different than the elections of the last two years. Those elections included worldwide positions that required ballots distributed though *NMRA Magazine*. The 2017 election has no worldwide positions and therefore there will be no ballot distributed in the magazine.

This election cycle has five positions under consideration. One of them is the Region Advisory Council Director, or RACD position. Each Region has a representative on the RAC and they are the only ones that are eligible to vote. There are three candidates for the RACD position. This election should be completed by Christmas.

Three of the positions in 2017 are the Canadian Director, NMRA Canada President, and NMRA Canada Vice-President. This election will be run by NMRA

Canada. Those of you who are members of NMRA Canada should be receiving your ballots sometime around February 1st.

The last position up for election is the Central District Director, or CDD. The Central District includes the states of Alabama, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Ohio, Tennessee, and Wisconsin. Only those members living within those states are eligible to vote for the CDD. In years past, the members have received a ballot in the mail. They then filled out the ballot and mailed it back to Headquarters.

This election cycle, we will be mailing ballots to the membership, but we are going to be offering the option of returning your ballot by voting electronically. We will be using a service called Election Buddy. This service has been used successfully by a couple of Regions. The service generates voting codes for each individual eligible to vote. The individual goes online and enters the voting code. They then view the ballot and vote. Once they complete the process, they can't use the voting code again. At the end of the voting window, we receive two reports. One report is the results of the election. The second report tells us who voted electronically. Using the two reports there is no way to know how a member has voted. In the meantime, some of you will have filled out your paper ballots and mailed them to headquarters. The second report will be checked against the paper ballots. If HQ receives a ballot from you and you have also voted electronically, the paper ballot will be declared invalid and your vote will be the electronic one.

The current plan is to mail the ballots in mid-January. The election window should be February 1 through February 28. Since we will still have to process some paper ballots, the election results will not be known until the end of March.

From Trains Magazine: Amtrak marks record performance in spite of gas prices

WASHINGTON — Dire predictions that falling gas prices might hurt Amtrak's patronage and pricing failed to materialize as the company's fiscal year drew to a close on Sept. 30, 2016. Yet other trends continue to impact the passenger railroad as President and CEO Wick Moorman settles into his new job.

Ridership rose to a record 31.2 million passengers while generating \$2.1 billion of ticket revenue — both slightly ahead of last year's numbers. But Amtrak had originally based its expense budget on almost 31.8 million riders and \$2.3 billion in ticket sales. In December 2015, with early returns showing weakness, management began cutting expenses based on revised forecasts that dropped passenger counts by 1.2 million and receipts by \$167 million.

Several *Northeast Regional* frequencies were cut (two were eliminated by dropping the New York-Savannah, Ga., *Palmetto*'s "receive only" southbound and "discharge only" northbound boarding restrictions), job vacancies weren't filled, and long-distance dining car patrons faced the same menu on every train all summer. As it turned out, the forecast was too pessimistic, though the original budget had been too optimistic.


