Wow, December again. Where did the time go? It seems like only yesterday I was making a New Year's resolution that this was the year I would get the layout started. Well, I did do more layout planning, re-planning, re-re-planning... well you get the picture. I also was able to clear out some of the accumulated junk in the basement and clear some floor space, so there is hope.

We were saddened to learn of the passing of division Secretary Bruce Knapp's wife on November 6<sup>th</sup>. Margaret and Bruce were together over 50 years. Our thoughts and prayers are with Bruce and his family.

In early November, I made the trek up to Springfield for the Division 3 train show. I got there about 1:00 on Saturday and the parking lot was packed. The show was held in a different store front than last year's show and the venue was much better. Most of the interior walls which normally break up a large store into different departments had been removed so it was one large room (unlike last year). There was enough room to have the various modular layouts in the same area as the vendors. In 2018, the show will be moving to the New Montgomery County Fairgrounds. The fairgrounds will be about 4 miles west of Downtown Dayton on Rt 35. This will be the fourth venue for their show in four years, and hopefully its new long time home.

Rick Crumrine, John Burchnall, and the rest of the 2018 convention committee are putting the finishing touches on the convention registration package that will be sent out towards the end of December. Remember, people who have pre-registered for the convention will receive the registration packet prior to its general distribution to all of the MCR members. The pre-registration count is up in the 70's as of early November. Space on the tours and Op sessions is limited, so it will be important to send in your final registration form with your extra-fare selections as early as you can. I've been involved with the creation of this package. Until I read through the descriptions of all of the planned activities, I didn't realize what a full weekend we're planning for the convention attendees. This is going to be an incredible event you will not want to miss.

One thing we will need to make the convention successful is volunteers. We're counting on the many members of Division 7 to step up and help make the convention a success. Randy Kerka has created a chart listing all of the various jobs and time slots across the 4 days of the convention. He is bringing the chart to each meeting so people can peruse the available jobs and put their name in the selected time slot(s)

For the first time in a while, there will be two candidates running for one of the offices up for election this year. This year's division election will be implemented using a software program called *Election Buddy*. Division 7 members for whom we have a valid Email address will receive a message containing an individual ID number you will use to record your vote electronically. Roy Hord organized a test case election for some of the BOD members to check the process. The software worked fine and was very easy to use. Members who have not provided an Email address will receive a paper ballot. The Email addresses we will be using are those on file with the NMRA national office.

If you do not receive the *Oil Can* by email but rather have to go online to read it, we don't have your correct email address, and you will not receive an electronic ballot. We need your correct email address for this to work! A quick email to NMRA HQ at <u>mmrahq@aol.com</u> will give us your correct address for future electronic mailings. Elsewhere in this issue of the *Oil Can* the nominating committee has published the slate of nominees for the upcoming election, along with biographical information of each candidate. Please read the information provided and take the time to vote.

The next Division 7 BOD meeting will be held on December 1<sup>st</sup> at 7 pm. The location is Harmony Lodge in Spring Grove Village.

Remember to bring your appetites to the December meeting where John Shields and I will be providing the snacks and you bring the pictures in electronic format to share with everybody. See you in Westwood on December 10<sup>th</sup>.

# **SECOND SECTION**

Our November meeting on the 12<sup>th</sup> was held at the Washington Township Recreation Center on the south edge of Dayton. This was a joint meeting with Dayton Division 3. Our special clinician for this joint meeting was Stephen Priest, MMR and the editor of *Railroad Model Craftsman*. His topic was "Working with Manufacturers, How Models Get from Concept to your Basement". He made the points that manufacturers want to find and do new projects, but they are not usually the experts on any of the items they reproduce. So the more information that a modeler can provide to them, the more likely they are to do a requested project. If you do the research, and get pictures and drawings that they can use, the less they would need to do and the faster they can turn a project around, which saves them time and money. Afterward the meeting, we had three layouts to visit. From the Division 3 side, we visited Wes Reece's HO Virginian Southern in Miamisburg. Then on our side, we returned to Bob Lawson's HO Southern RR and made a first ever visit to Todd Smalley's HO C&O.

Looking ahead:

Our December meeting will be on December the 10th at the Westwood United Methodist Church. We will be doing our traditional pot luck slide/digital photo/ video show and snackfest. Layouts open after the meeting will be Michael Shannon's HO layout and Randy Seiler's HO Penn Central / B&O west from Cincinnati layout. Bring your appetite and bring some slides to share.

In January, we will be back again in Kenwood on the 14<sup>th</sup> at Good Shepherd Lutheran. The clinician for this meeting will be Joe Ross, with a talk on the laying of continuous welded rail on Norfolk Southern. After the meeting, we will be doing a return visit to Jim Stewart's HO Port Arthur Railway and Navigation Co.

In February (2/11), we will return to West Chester library, with clinician Bill Ford giving a presentation on C&O Maintenance of Way Motorcars. After the meeting we will visit Greg Simpson's OO British layout (since he had to cancel for the November joint meeting).

There is no regular meeting in March. Rather on Saturday March 10th, we will have our annual Flea Market at Lakota West Freshman School. This will be our biggest ever, as we will have more space than in previous years. It's not too early to sort through your collection and see if you have items to dispose of. If you have a lot, consider buying a table. Otherwise, start planning on getting things listed so they can be sold on the Division's White Elephant table.

In April, we will meet on the 8<sup>th</sup> at Harmony Lodge. As usual, we will follow with a visit to the O scale Cincinnati Model Railway Club downstairs and at least one more.

There is no regular meeting in May either; because we (Division 7) will be hosting the Mid Central Regional Convention, the Cincinnati Express at the Marriott Hotel in West Chester. Needless to say, there will be LOTS of clinics, lots of layouts, and lots of other tours. If you have not registered yet, you should do so to get priority on any of the tours. We will also be looking for lots of volunteers to help with this event. The dates to block out are May 17 through May 20.

In spite of the rain later in the day, I thought the November meeting was really great. As best we could recall, it has been about 9 years since we did a joint meeting with Dayton. (I thought we had one more recently, but Bob Shreve did not remember planning one while he was Asst. Super; and it was not during my almost 4 years doing the planning job; so that makes it at least 8 years). The two divisions obviously support each other by attending each other's Train Shows, and there are other individual overlaps (not to mention the support we get from Allen McClelland on our car projects), but it was nice to have a planned joint activity. It makes it even easier to secure a well-known clinician like Stephen Priest when we can promise an audience as big as some Region's conventions. Having three great layouts to view just makes it even better.

I hope to see you in Westwood on December the 10<sup>th</sup>.

### **Statement from Superintendent Candidate John Shields:**

I am currently serving as your Assistant Superintendent, and ask for your support to be the next Division Superintendent.

I have been an NMRA Member since 1994. Past president and currently secretary/treasurer of the Queen City N-Gineers modular railroad club. Member of the B&O Railroad Historical Society and of the N&W Railway Historical Society. Modeler since ~1961, having started as an "assistant" to my Dad in the building and operating of his HO scale Queen & Crescent RR (which was on the home layout tours at the 1966 National Convention here in Cincinnati). Switched to N Scale in 1968. Primary modeling period – 1955-1960. Primary modeling interest – B&O.

Native Cincinnatian. Graduate of University of Cincinnati College of Engineering, retired from Procter and Gamble after 38 years in 2015. Married to Marsha W. Shields for 33 years. Marsha died in 2016. One son, Larry (33), graduate of Ohio University, former reporter for WCPO channel 9, and news operations manager at WXIX channel 19; now the communications director for the St. Vincent de Paul Society in Cincinnati.

After four years as secretary, and four years as assistant super; working diligently with Mr. Kerka and Mr. Shreve and the rest of the great leadership of your Division, I want to continue to improve the NMRA experience for you, the members; first by delivering a great MCR Convention, and then by continuing our traditional monthly and yearly events, and by finding new ways to promote our hobby in our area.

### Statement from Assistant-Superintendent Candidate Kevin Orcutt:

I am hoping to be the Division's next Assistant Superintendent. I'm a fourth generation model railroader. My Mother's Grandfather and my Father's Father were both some of the original/charter members of the New York Society of Model Engineers group. Some of my earliest memories are of Model Trains, dating back to Lionel trains in the basement, right alongside of my Dad's HO layout. That started a life-long fascination with Trains, both model and the 1:1 stuff that I enjoy railfanning.

The loop didn't last too long and I found out the Lionel and sandboxes don't mix too well... After we left that first basement, we moved to SC where our house didn't have a basement. After a while, Dad had an addition built onto the back of the house to host his layout. I remember helping him build the benchwork and other things. We moved again, this time up to Upstate New York. where We did have a basement to have fun in. Before either my Dad or I started anything downstairs, Dad acquired a 4x8 layout from someone at his work for me to start with. I did learn quite a bit on that one, especially in terms of electronics, needless to say, live 120v and aluminum control panels are a bad combination, ask me about it sometime! I finally started my own layout down in a corner of our basement. It had a couple of towns, along with a hidden staging yard, and a connection over to my Dad's larger layout. This one lasted me through the High School years. I do remember doing some modeling in college.

Then came my Army years. My modeling dropped off a bit, but I still remember finding a hobby shop close by out in Monterey were I found a nice little building kit. It was one of my first wooden kits, and I still have it today. While overseas, I didn't do much modeling, but found it interesting to find an EMD SD7 serving the South Korean Railway system. When I came back, I was stationed at Ft Meade Maryland. While there I found out one of the premier Model Railroad shows around. The Timonium shows, held four times a year. Somehow I got hooked up with the Show's Organizer - Howard Zane. Found out that he was only about 10 minutes away from where I lived, so I soon became a regular member of his work crew. All I can say is "Wow." He is a great character, and that is some layout!

I worked on that for quite a few years before I moved to the Cincinnati area. I remember one night Howard gathered all of us around and said he had something for us. He then proceeded to hand out little bronze cards that granted us Lifetime pass to the Timonium shows. Just a few months before I moved out here, I came out and went with my Dad to my first NMRA National Convention up in Madison. I remember meeting Allen McClelland for the first time up there and becoming a V&O Historical Society member.

Once I moved out here, I think my Dad was Treasurer of the Division at the time, I quickly started attending meetings and started some of my volunteering with the Division. I remember helping Dad with the Monthly raffle when he ran it. I remember starting to help out with our Fall show. It was at the Cincinnati Gardens when I first came out here... I volunteered to help Rick Crumrine out on the Show's committee. That's when it moved over to the Kentucky Convention Center. I worked with Roy Hord and used a CAD program to arrange the tables. Great fun.

A little later on, I remember the BOD meeting in Gerry Albers' crew lounge where the Division decided to enter our bid to host the 2005 National. Just a short five years later, I enjoyed meeting every Saturday from January up to right before the Convention working with Roy again, Jim Hodde, Jim Stewart, and my Dad handling all of the Convention registration activities. I think it was some of the activities at our National Convention that got me really hooked onto the Operations side of things. I've really enjoyed operating on some of this area's finest layouts. More recently, picked up the Video lending Library for the Division. With all that, it may be time for me to serve in a more Official type of role. That's why I'm asking for your vote to allow me to serve as your next Assistant Superintendent.

### Statement from Assistant-Superintendent Candidate Chuck Endreola:

Most of you know me as the publisher of our Division's electronic Oil Can newsletter – I send you each edition in an email message every month. My active participation in our great hobby and the NMRA does not start or end there. I have also been a consistent volunteer at our annual Train Shows and Flea Markets, a model contest winner at Region and Division levels and a Regional Contest Judge. Even more importantly, I have extensive hands-on leadership experience in successfully dealing with people and running a business. I humbly seek your support in allowing me to serve you as your next Assistant Superintendent.

I was born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio, then attended the University of Cincinnati for two years before leaving school to join the family business, Carlo's Pizza. After my two daughters established careers in Cincinnati, my son and I decided to reunite the family by relocating to "The Queen City". I was no stranger to this town, having gone to UC and marrying a Cincinnati native. Today, I am presently employed part time as a manager of a Honey Baked Ham store. In 2011, I was very fortunate in having met Anne, my soulmate and life partner. Most importantly, she is very supportive of my passion and involvement in model railroading.

Although fascinated by model trains as a child, I never had a layout nor a "train set". As a teen and young adult, I modeled plastic auto and motorcycle kits, detailing and customizing them. One day I met a new friend that introduced me to an incredible model railroad empire in his basement. That was the first layout I ever saw, and I was hooked for life. An HO Consolidation pulled a drag freight through realistic scenery and over scratch built bridges, and spotted cars at industries. The carefully detailed models didn't just sit statically on a shelf collecting dust, they came alive and told a story!

I joined the NMRA while I was in Cleveland. Upon moving to Cincinnati, not knowing a soul here outside of family, I decided to see what Div. 7 was about. That decision has proven to be extremely rewarding. Being a member has not only increased my knowledge, it has led to a wealth of new friends. I am elated to contribute to one of the most active, successful and well-regarded divisions in the NMRA. It is a privilege to rub elbows with and learn from some of the most talented and respected modelers in the country.









