It's Holiday time again! Time for the wonderful Train Display in Oxford, Ohio that raises money to change people's lives. Over the past 3 years, we have raised \$30,000. We have purchased Walk Aides, Scooters, helped save a home from foreclosure, provided emergency food and purchased Christmas gifts for children. These wonderful blessings would not have been possible without everyone helping to spread the word about this display.

Located at 3088 Oxford Millville Road (Rt 27) in Oxford, it is for one weekend only, Saturday Dec. 4th and Sunday Dec. 5th from 9am to 5pm. There is free parking and shuttle service next door at Marshall Elementary School. The cost is \$7 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under.

This display is over 4,000 square feet with 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles of track, 43 trains, 200 motorized interactive displays, 1500 stationary cars and trucks, 1100 illuminated houses and took over 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ years to complete! In addition we will have home tours showing an extensive modern art collection and 5 rooms of sports memorabilia. A free game room for kids to challenge their parents! There will also be a bake sale and a raffle for donated prizes.

All proceeds benefit Multiple Sclerosis Families and the Christian Cooperative Nursery School. This display is up one flight of stairs and is not handicap accessible. Hope to see you there.

Mid central Region BOD Meeting

The Mid-Central Region Board of Directors met on Sunday-Oct. 24th for their Fall B.O.D. meeting. As has become custom, the meeting place was Schmidt's German Restaurant in Columbus, Oh.

There are eleven Divisions now in the Mid Central Region with all Superintendents or their representatives in attendance. President Dick Briggs called the meeting to order with reports given by various Region officers including the Secretary's Report, Membership, Webmaster, V.P., Division reports, and reports on upcoming annual Region Conventions. Some highlights of the reports and discussion included learning that the MCR website is now getting over 2,100 hits per week and Members in the MCR Divisions have earned approximately 21 Merit awards and 12 certificates in the Achievement program. The MCR "Clinician Database" now has over 100 clinic listings that Region Superintendents can access for planning monthly programs.

The 2011 MCR Annual Spring convention will be hosted by Division 5 who will be celebrating 50 years as a Division and will present their "**Rails of the Ages Convention**" to be held **April 28th-May 1, 2011** at the Lodge and Conference Center at Geneva-on-the-Lake in the Ashtabula, Oh. area.

Informative clinics, prototype and layout tours, auction, as well as contests will all be part of the convention activities. This convention will also feature "Shortline Clinics" which will be brief presentations of 10-15 minutes duration featuring "how-to" or "bring and brag" type themes for various model rr subjects.

Upcoming conventions in the following years are: Div 2-Pittsburgh in 2012 No venue for 2013 yet, but the 2014 N.M.R.A. National Convention will be held in Cleveland, Oh sponsored by Div.4.


Lebanon Sub Meeting






