HEADLIGHTS

Our December virtual meeting featured a clinic by guest clinician and *Model Railroader* contributing editor Tony Koester, who talked about his current Nickel Plate model railway. Tony is justifiably famous for his modeling and for his writing about the hobby. It was a real treat to hear him describe his layout and the operations on it. But there was so much more throughout the talk. Tips on building multi-deck layouts, creating backdrops from photos, using interchange tracks to create lots of operating potential from a small space with almost no scenery/building construction, and on and on. I was especially struck by his scene of the high steel viaduct (and how he fit it into the multi-deck space). Many layouts have impressive bridges, and some really capture a real location; but Tony's scene also captures a moment in time from his family based on a family photo. Many of us probably are trying to capture the feel of a time we remember, often of trains seen around where we grew up, and this scene just takes that to the next level.

We have more great programs coming up. In both January and February we have guest clinicians from the St. Louis area. For January, Dave Ackmann will give a clinic entitled "3D Printing". Then in February, Gary Hoover will present a clinic entitled "1950's N&W HO Scale Layout with O. Winston Link Scenes." These are clinics that you would have had to go to the national convention in St Louis this summer to see. But of course, that fell victim to the pandemic. So we are taking advantage of what a relative few of us might have seen in St. Louis to bring these talks to everyone in Division 7. If you want a little preview, see Gary's article in the December *Model Railroader*.

As I write this, it is still a few days before Christmas. I am looking forward to spending some time with my new immediate family (in our socially correct small bubble of five). SECOND SECTION

At our December meeting, we were treated to a presentation by Tony Koester, describing his HO scale multideck Nickel Plate Ry. Along with a fantastic photo tour, Tony shared how to create custom backdrops using Photoshop Elements software, as well as several operational features. He's now writing a new book on multideck layouts that should be available in November of 2021.

We are often reminded why this is such a great hobby, as it is populated by many helpful and giving folks. The following is such an example. When ordering Grandt Line details, now owned by the San Juan Model Co., I discovered that you should place your order on the San Juan website rather than "grandtline.com". After waiting 3 weeks for my parts, I gave them a call. They were very courteous and spent many minutes searching for my order. When it was ascertained that I ordered incorrectly, they took my order and explained that the mail had left for the day (Friday) and it would be sent out on Monday. When I explained my urgent need for the parts to finish a Christmas gift, one of the owner's wives heard, and said she would make a special trip to the post office to help me out. Kudos and many thanks to Doug Junda, Bob Stears, and their dedicated staff to please a customer! The great thing is that there are many other suppliers of modeling merchandise who go out of their way to please, including our local Cincinnati area hobby shops.

Another example of outstanding people in our hobby is Mike Tylick, MMR. Mike has presented clinics for us both in person and most recently on Zoom. While ordering some custom decals from Mike, he wrote that he would add some "NER" decals to fill out the sheet. I didn't know what those were about and asked for further information. The following is paraphrased from his email:

"I guess I will give you the long version of the NERX reefer story, and maybe you can help pass it around. To no one's surprise, the in-person fall Northeast Region convention was cancelled. Instead, we did a four-evening virtual convention, NERx, using the same production crew that does NMRAx. They were excellent in case you are thinking along those lines. The convention website is still up, at www.millcity2020.org URL. Among the items on it is a virtual convention car. The convention name, NERX, sounded like the reporting marks of a private owner reefer. So, I drew up a set of decals, all black. They were made for a specific car (see directions I sent) but were also made to allow many variations as to car and even scale. The artwork is such that people can use it in many different ways for many different cars, which is encouraged. Download the artwork .pdf and print on clear decal film, seal if necessary. One sheet can do as many as nine cars of different types. So far, it seems to be popular and I would enjoy passing it around everywhere. Needless to say, this was my idea to begin with so I like to see my baby grow.







An NP A-3 4-8-4 with Gray boiler arrived from BLI. This is a hybrid with DCC and smoke. Nicely detailed. James Hill (GN president) owned stock in NP and tried to merge GN and NP along with SP&S and Burlington but the ICC nixed it. Amazing that Congress nixed the draconian ICC around 1980 as, once a government agency exist, it keeps growing and never dies! Pizza at 6:30-7:00.

Being retired, I spend the bulk of my time in the basement so visitors are always welcomed. Thanks.

New arrivals and updates:

PRR K-4 streamlined, 4-6-2

C&O K-4 2-8-4 and H-6 2-6-6-2 painted, lighted, new motors and decoder installed.

The N&W Y-3 2-8-8-2 was painted with a new motor, decoder and lights installed.

Ditto for the Texas & Pacific 2-10-4.

A DM&IR S-7 0-10-2 arrived. One of the few engines that I've been looking to purchase.

C&O M-1 steam turbine: very unusual engine 2-D-2 + 2-D-2. I've installed a decoder in the engine so it has the turbine sound. Also, added extra weight and, so far, it easily pulled 30 cars.

UP M-10,000 4 car set. The first streamline diesel train set. Two decoders were installed in this engine. One front(sound) and one rear (no sound).

ACL 4-8-4: A two tone black and grey.

I've moved all my vintage metal Athearn/Varney and wood Silver Streak/Ambroid freight cars to Seattle, so freight drags will dominate, plus passenger trains of your

NEW PROJECTS:

Installed decoders in several more engines. A selection of 45 engines can now be done. Began installing hardware needed to, remotely, control turnouts via the track schematic on the PC's monitor screen: Along with the signaling system, this is also LCC.

Most testing done with passenger trains seems to be ending, as the longer passenger cars are about twice the length of a regular freight car and pose different problems, but they seem to be finally resolved.

New vintage metal Athearn/Varney and wood Silver Streak/Ambroid freight cars have been tested, and are working well over the mainline.

Finished adding the last tunnel portals that I failed to do, 40 years ago.

Got to do some PM on 3-4 engines.

New passenger yard completed.

The signaling system using LCC is complete along with monitor showing train positions on the layout.

Mission Statement: Main theme of my railroad (besides modeling the Great Northern Railway): when building the railroad, I wanted to model mainline running with big time steam and 'scale like' trains of 25-45 cars on single track mainline with passing sidings.

The GNRW has been updated to handle DCC operations.

As I used to do in the 80's and 90's, should you have a DCC engine, you may bring it to operate on the GNRW.
