The prototype appears to be matching what some of us have been modeling for years — CSX is installing new "Quiet Zone" crossing signals in Glendale to eliminate the need for train horns at two crossings! (A third crossing will be eliminated).

The \$700,000 project costs are being shared by Glendale and the railroads that use the tracks. Project commenced in 2016, Surveys taken in Glendale indicate mixed results regarding its need, as there must be a few railfans!

Our June meeting was held at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Kenwood. Our own Georgia Dalhberg MMR® was our clinician. She gave a clinic on early (think 20's and 30's) intermodal trailers. These are actually based on those made by a Cincinnati company and originated with the idea of moving LCL freight between Cincinnati freight stations. This same company originated the milk containers that eventually were associated with dairies in New England. Georgia not only had the photographic history of these early containers, but had a number of really nice models of them available for inspection as well. Thank you to Pat Homan and Gerry Albers for opening their HO layouts for us to see. A special thanks to Pat for providing hard hats as well.

Our next monthly meeting is not until July 21 to avoid conflicting with the National NMRA Convention, in Salt Lake City this year. See Chuck Endreola's column for details and/or the table for the whole year that John Burchnall and Chuck maintain on our Division 7 website (and, of course, the info at the end of this newsletter). As usual, look for the orange postcard in the mail to help you remember!

I am attending the convention in Salt Lake, so I will be able to give a report on it at the July meeting. I'll also pass on some pictures in the next <u>Oil Can</u>. Usually, I have focused on doing layout tours at the various conventions. While I am still trying to see a number of layouts, I am also signed up to operate on two layouts as part of the OpSIG effort. Of course, there are also prototype tours and I am doing two of those as well. In between these activities, I'll fill my time with clinics. It should be an eventful week. And then there is the National Train Show on the weekend.

However, that is not my next railroad activity. I'll be in Chicago from June 24 to June 30 at the N Scale Enthusiasts convention. This will be the third straight year that I have been able to go to this national N scale event – Pittsburgh in 2017 and Salt Lake in 2018 were my previous stops (I also made it to one in Hershey, PA back in 2012). Who says summer is the "off season" for our hobby? Sort of like the groundhog in February, summer is when model railroaders venture out of their basements (even if they see their shadows) to ride real trains and meet other modelers and often to get inspired for the next winter's modeling.



There are a number of railfanning spots around Cincinnati that do not require much time or money to enjoy. In my experience you may run into fellow train enthusiasts at these spots as well. One more option is the local tourist railroads. If you have kids, or especially grandkids, consider taking them to the Whitewater Valley RR or to the Lebanon, Mason, and Monroe RR. Thomas will be at the Whitewater Valley at the end of June and LM&M is hosting steam powered excursions on August 3, 4, 10, & 11.

Speaking of the prototype, I have it on good authority that our <u>Oil Can</u> editor is more than willing to share more pictures in our newsletter; and they do not have to be of model trains. If you do go railfanning at any of the local hotspots, send Dave some pictures! Even better, write a short description to go with them and encourage more of our members to consider these locations for train watching. If you travel out of the area to ride some of the other tourist railroads around the country, share some pictures of that as well (and make us all envious!).

The common thread in all of these activities and suggestions is "SHARE". Model railroading may be a fine "lone wolf" hobby; but if you have joined the NMRA you must at least suspect that it can be improved by associating with others who share your interest. At the local Division level, we try to create options for you to do that. And we are continuing to try to identify more joint activities that we can provide to you. But I want to encourage you to become more active as well by sharing your hobby with your fellow members, and even more importantly with non-members. To keep our hobby alive, we need to be passing our interest on to the next generation(s). Did your Dad (or someone else) cause you to become interested? Probably someone spurred your interest. You can help "pay it forward" as they say nowadays. Model Railroading is Fun. Pass it on!

We've Lost Another Gem

Local model railroaders have lost another great source of modeling products in the Cincinnati area. Recently, Alex Kolesnikov closed "DCC Trains" retail outlet in Anderson to concentrate on mail order business. And now, "Tim's Trains & Hobbies" in Latonia, KY., closed its doors on June 1st, 2019. Both will be missed.

After 10 years in business Owner/Operator Tim Cook, himself a fine model railroader, has decide to retire and spend more time chasing a little white ball. After retiring from CVG's Fire Dept., Tim ran "Johnny's Toys" train store for about 10 years. When that store closed, Tim acquired much of the inventory and found a location for his own shop. Although Tim stocked model autos, boats, planes and rockets, the emphasis was on model train sales and service. He carried a large inventory and you could usually find what you needed for that night's modeling session. An item not on the shelf? Tim was always able to have it within a week and with no shipping charges. His prices were very reasonable, and the staff was always friendly, knowledgeable and helpful.

A stalwart staff member, our own Raffle Chair, "Honest Russ Poynter" said, "Tim was great to work with. Always open to new ideas and items." One of the unique offerings to his customers was providing free modeling clinics during the fall, winter and early spring months. Several modelers would volunteer to conduct a clinic and share their knowledge, experiences, and techniques. A Thursday afternoon ritual was going to lunch with Tim and several of his customer friends, where the lively banter ranged from model railroading, to sports, to politics.

The business and property are for sale, perhaps there is an interested party out there to carry on. I lament the closing of yet another brick and mortar hobby shop. I will miss the hands-on examination of merchandise, convenience of having it today, and the accommodating staff that would answer all my questions. But even more, I will miss visiting with Tim and the many friends I've made there.











