If you didn't make it out in June to see the trains running, the Cinder Sniffers have public operating days on the second Saturday of each month from May through October.

In my discussion last month of the MCR regional convention in Louisville, I neglected to include the information about the recipients of the Russ Wenderfer award for 2017. The Wenderfer award is sponsored by Division 7 and is given to honor a Mid Central Region member for their promotion of the hobby within the region. Each Division may nominate a candidate who by their actions, involvement with Division activities, and overall volunteer service has promoted the hobby of model railroading and promotion of the National Model Railroad Association. The MCR president selects the award winner based on the qualifications on the nomination forms and input from the region directors.

This year, MCR president Steve Kaplan chose to present two awards. One award was presented posthumously to Bob Orlando for his activities in Division 5. A second award was presented jointly to Gail Richardson and Dana Yarnall from Dayton Division 3. They have worked together over the past several years to ensure the success of the annual fall train show and other Division activities in the Miami Valley area. They were instrumental in finding the shopping mall location for their show last year when Hara Arena abruptly closed. Apparently they liked working together so well they got married shortly before the MCR convention. However, they did not include the convention in their honeymoon plans. Division 3 Superintendent Rick Lach accepted their award at the convention and presented it to them at the June 18<sup>th</sup> Division 3 meeting.

At the Division BOD meeting on June 9<sup>th</sup>, the board ratified the results of the recent election for the approval of the updated regulations. Division 7 began operating under the new regulations effective 9-June-2017. An electronic copy of the new regulations is available on the Division 7 website. Look for the link on the "Board of Directors" page.

Plans are shaping up for my attendance at the National Convention in Orlando at the end of July. This is going to be another Shreve family activity with my wife, kids, their spouses, and the grandchildren enjoying the theme parks while I do the convention thing. It's going to be interesting from both perspectives.

Remember to keep your Email address up to date (or supply one if you haven't done so previously) so you can receive all the latest information from both the national office and the local division. One of the changes in the new Division 7 regulations is to specifically include Email as a means of conducting division business such as ballots for elections. NMRA national elections and other information distribution will be increasingly conducted electronically instead of via physical mail. If the NMRA national office doesn't have your current Email address, you could be missing out on a lot of useful information.

In June, rather than a regular meeting, we visited the Cinder Sniffers large scale/live steam layout in Indiana. The weather was great and we had a pretty good turnout of members. Judging by the line, most decided that actually riding <u>on</u> a model train was an experience to have. At least one of the models was an actual coal burning steam engine. A couple burned some other fuels and several of the diesels were battery powered. It was interesting to see the range of scales and the ingenious track that accommodates seven different scales. And I thought duel gauge track and switches was complicated! The engineering on the bridges and trestles really impressed me. This is way beyond the skill and knowledge required to build in N or HO. I want to thank the Cinder Sniffers for agreeing to host our group and I trust our members had a good time.

Looking ahead:

Our July meeting will be on July the 9<sup>th</sup>. We will head up northeast to St Susanna Catholic Church in Mason. Our clinician will be Terry Luginbuhl, who will return with a second clinic on DCC, this time talking about "Consisting". Layout visits will include a return to Bob Bartizek's O scale Pennsylvania RR layout in Lebanon and a first visit to Jim Rollwage's HO Union Pacific layout near Wilmington. I know this is a slightly longer trek than we typically make, but I think you will appreciate getting to see these two fine layouts.

Between our July and August meetings is the NMRA National Convention in Orlando. The dates for this year are July 30<sup>th</sup> through August 6<sup>th</sup>. This is farther than Indy was, but I suspect Division 7 will be well represented again. After all, I know quite a few folks who go to Florida on a pretty regular basis *without* looking at any trains; so this is probably a no brainer.

In August (8/13), our meeting will be at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Kenwood. Ed Swain will be giving a clinic on building with styrene. Layout visits will be to Gerry Albers' HO Virginian and to Pat Homan's.

In September (9/10), we will be on the east side at the Anderson Senior Center. Our clinician will be Ron Pearson with a presentation on the Coal Mines on the East Broad Top. Layout visits will be to John Listermann's and to Rick Crumrine's. In October, we will be at the Kenton County Library in Erlanger. Our clinician will be Dan Finfrock. His subject is the B&O branch from New Miami to Middletown "A Railroad You Can Model". Afterwards, we will visit Tom Vogt's HO layout in Fort Wright.

We will be having a joint meeting with Dayton Division 3 in November. Layout visits will include Bob Lawson's and Greg Simpson's (from our Division) and hopefully one or two from Dayton. We will end our year with our annual pot luck slide show at Westwood United Methodist Church.

Our editor Dave was glad to hear that I was going to get my article in to him early this month. Not because I have suddenly gotten punctual, but because I will be out of town for a week and would have missed the deadline by more than usual. The National N Scale Convention is being held in Pittsburgh from June 20<sup>th</sup> to June 25<sup>th</sup>. I'll be traveling on Monday because I have a tour that leaves at 6:30am on Tuesday morning to Norfolk Southern's Horseshoe Curve and Altoona via Amtrak. There is also an historical tour of the city and layouts to see, besides the events at the hotel (in the old train station!), and the train show. This will be my second N Scale Convention. I went to one in Hershey, PA in 2011. The conventions are frequently on the west coast, because Microtrains is headquartered in Oregon.

I've been to Altoona before, but it's been ten years or more. It will be interesting to see what's running through there nowadays. I look forward to seeing NS black instead of Conrail blue. The tour visits the Juniata shops, which should be very interesting; as well as the Railroaders Museum. Of course, any excuse to ride a train is always a good idea. For me, this section is particularly meaningful because my father worked on this piece of the Pennsylvania. And Pittsburgh is meaningful because it was my mother's home.

I hope to see you in Indiana on July the 9<sup>th</sup>.
