

# HEADLIGHTS

Our February meeting on the 11<sup>th</sup> was held at the Marriott Hotel in West Chester where the convention will be in May. Bill Ford gave the clinic discussing the types of and use of "speeders" by the track crews, focused on the C&O, but including a lot of general information and thoughts on modeling. If a typical track crew was assigned to a 4 mile section of track, there would be a track gang shed/ speeder shed about every four miles along the right of way. That means there were more of these than interlocking towers or water towers or stations or coal docks, etc. along any given right of way. Do you have enough of these on your layout? There are kits for these and Walthers did a built-up in the past that included a speeder (not sure if it is currently available). If you have not built a laser kit, this is an excellent first project to try. Similarly, one of these little buildings would also be a great first scratch building project. Bill indicated that speeders are also available as 3D printed models; so this could introduce you to this growing source of models/parts if you have not tried this technology yet. Bill also left us with a signed copy of his book on this subject, which we will have in our always honest raffle in the near future.

After the meeting, we visited Noah Powers' and Curt LaRue's HO layouts. This was our first visit to Noah's layout. He demonstrates how to get a lot of layout (especially a lot of tree covered hillsides) into a fairly small space. A big thanks to Curt for hosting us on very short notice. Greg Simpson had to cancel due to the death of his daughter. Our thoughts are with Greg and his family.

Jim MacKnight reported on the completion of our book donation program from last year and the receipt of thank you notes from the libraries involved. Those were in Grant County and Boone County Kentucky and Hamilton Ohio this time. He also gave a status report on the Boy Scout merit badge programs currently under way in Fairfield and Sycamore. Thank you to all of you that are helping with the Boy Scout program.

Rick Crumrine, John Burchnall, and Peter Weiglin gave a presentation on our upcoming convention. This is the presentation they have been taking on the road to promote the convention to the other divisions around the region. All of the convention activities at the hotel are on the ground floor around the central atrium, or down the hall near the elevators; so it will be very convenient to all the attendees. We have a tremendous schedule of activities both at the hotel and offsite. It's not too late to register and get in on these events.

Randy Kerka reported that the volunteers list is filling up nicely, but if you are not already on the list, please consider calling Randy and volunteering to help with something. We want this convention to be full of well planned and executed events. As we saw in the presentation, the well planned part is mostly done. We need everyone's help with the execution part. And, of course, we also need the volunteers to help with the unplanned things that always come up. The dates for the convention are May 17 to May 20.

Speaking of volunteers, Peter Weiglin had his sign up lists for the needed volunteers for the Flea Market. We can always use more help with set up on Friday night and tear down Saturday afternoon. You should be receiving the usual postcard reminder since this event replaces the regular March monthly meeting in our schedule. The date is *Saturday* March 10. I know it was almost 80° just the other day, but it's not quite spring yet. That means there is still time to buy some model railroad bargains at the Flea Market and apply them to your model railroading before yard work and other activities start getting in the way. And, if you have some unneeded things, or just need to make space for the newer needed things; down load the White Elephant form from the website and bring the form and your things to the White Elephant table at the Flea Market and let the Division sell them to someone else. If you have an engine that is just not running right, bring it to the modelers' aid table and let Bruce Knapp or Pat Homan help diagnose the problem and help get it running.
