



We're Baack! As promised, here is my report on the Amherst Society's Model Railroad Show in W. Springfield Massachusetts. At least five Division 7 members attended - Frank Koch, John Shields, John Burchnall, Mike Tener, and me. Only Frank was spared from what I call, "The Amtrak Ordeal." We four rendezvoused at Burchnall's home and Ruth Anne was kind enough to drive us to Cincinnati Union Terminal, arriving at 1:30am for a 3:30am departure on the east bound "Cardinal". Departure took place at 4:30am. A short sleep, breakfast, lunch, and a lot of card playing found us arriving in Washington D.C.'s Union Station at 6:45pm. 

The other three buildings come in at 2 to 3 acres each. There were over 330 vendors including dozens of major manufacturers. And guess what? They all take cash! I can't complain of a thinner wallet as I found some great and needed items. Spent a chunk of change and much time chatting with Bill of B&B Hobbies, the tool man who comes to our show (he's hoping to join us for our Fall Show). Two full days of walking, talking, shopping the vendors, meeting new and old friends can wear down even a hardy septuagenarian. And of course, the four of us bought enough "Had to Haves" to fill a large box which was shipped home via UPS. We also did a bit of railfanning with the prize seeing a double tracked skewed steel through-truss bridge amongst old masonry textile mills and a large canal/sluiceway.

The return trip was a near reversal of the trek out, save the times of day. We drove back to New Haven and took the Acela to D.C. but had a layover of over a day because the Cardinal doesn't operate every day. So, we filled that day by taking in the Spy Museum and the Smithsonian's American History Museum. Both were amazingly interesting and fun. Back on the train, we entertained ourselves with more card playing. Mike Tener exploited my naivety and inexperience in gambling. He left me begging for food money in the Café Car after fleecing me. The saving grace that atoned for Amtrak's microwaved airline food was the several outstanding dinners we enjoyed in both cities. We arrived at CUT at 1:30am and the dutiful and generous Mrs. Burchnall was waiting to take her wayward husband and his friends home. Overall, it was a fun adventure with 3 amigos. The only difficult part were those wee hours of the morning departures and arrivals. One must really like trains! Would I do it again? Introducing Cincinnati Division 7's Model Railroading Roundtable Program

The goal of the Model Railroading Roundtable (MRR) program is to allow a small group of like-interested folks to gather in a local home or meeting place and learn a new skill related directly to the model railroading hobby. Those that have mastered the skill will host a small group (size of the host's choosing, typically between four and eight folks) and then in a one-to-two hour session, assist fellow Division 7 members to develop that skill.

Most get-togethers are anticipated to take place in the host's home workshop, operating crew lounge, or layout room. Content, timeframe, and participants are solely the host's preference. Hosts will advertise the MRR event in *The Oil Can*, stating the specifics of the program, and providing an email address for responses. Attendee reservations will be filled on a first-come-first-serve basis. Hosts will confirm with attendees the day before the event and well before that reminder, distribute any information that attendees should become familiar with (or gather, should attendees need to bring certain items or supplies). Costs of supplies, refreshments, and the like are the responsibility of the host or participants (meaning there is currently not an allocation for this activity within Division 7 annual budget).

Currently there are <u>eight</u> hosts that have expressed interest in participating in the MRR program in 2024, with the following subjects:

- Planning/Building Structures and Scenes
- Scratchbuilding Rolling Stock
- Painting Backdrops
- Constructing Models in Styrene
- Installing Decoders, Motors, and Gears
- Building Structures from Photos
- Carving Rockwork from Foam Insulation
- Painting Details and Figures (HO and O)

Depending upon host and participant interest, the following topics will be investigated and scheduled to close out 2024 and subsequent months:

- Layout Planning for Operation
- Building Lightweight Benchwork
- Detailing Scenery (from ground cover to trees to modeling water)
- Painting Structures

Cincinnati Division 7's Car Project Committee is pleased to announce the availability of our latest, limited-edition car project!

Using Accurail's 2200 Series ACF 2-Bay Covered Hopper as the basis, we are offering it in a Norfolk & Western repaint scheme.

These cars are N&W class HC-46 and are from an original batch of fifty built in 1966 by ACF and were painted in the Round Herald paint scheme.

Sometime subsequent to that some cars went through a general maintenance program where they were repainted in the block N&W livery. Photos were found showing that at least three of these cars (road numbers 170753, 170768 and 170794) were reweighed at some later date because that area is "patched out" on the car with the new data displayed. Those same photos place these three cars as being in service in 1992 and 2004! It is these three, highly unique, road numbers that Cincinnati Division 7 is now offering for sale.

As with all Accurail cars, they are in kit form only.

Pricing is \$25 per car, or a 3-car set at \$70. Shipping (via USPS Priority) is \$9.20 for one car and \$16.25 for two to three cars.

Ohio residents, please add 7.8% sales tax on the total price of the kits and the shipping and handling fee.


