HEADLIGHTS

Our April meeting was at Harmony Lodge, hosted by the O scale Cincinnati Model Railway Club. Thank you to Georgia Dahlberg for a hands-on clinic demonstrating a number of techniques around modeling with styrene. Technically, this was done in HO; but the techniques apply to any scale. In fact, did you notice that this was sort of our non-HO meeting. We visited the club there at Harmony – in O Scale – and then visited Larry Bonhaus' Pennsylvania (Laurence and St. Andrews) – in N Scale. Not to worry, there's plenty of HO action in the coming months based on the schedule that Chuck has laid out; along with prototype clinics as well. (See Chuck's article in the following pages for details).

Speaking of plenty of HO action, and O, and N, and prototype, and non-rail, etc.: Have you heard that we have a convention coming up this month? If for some reason, you have not registered; Do It Now! I'll wait..... I'm not kidding. Don't read on until you have registered.

.....). OK, now that we've got that straight, who else do you know that is not planning to go? Talk to them! Convince them that this is not one to miss. Yes, they have to join the NMRA (which is actually a good thing anyway, especially with all we have to offer here in Division 7); but there is the great Railpass offer that will give non-members a really cost effective way to try us out starting with this great convention. (Check for this on the NMRA website, under "Membership").

So far, ALL of the planned events at our convention are a "go", meaning that our guests are signing up for the great selection of events that the convention committee has been putting together. Some of the most popular op sessions and layout tours have actually sold out more than a month in advance. The final clinic schedule is now available on-line. We have national clinicians like Gerry Leone and Charlie Getz from the NMRA, Hal Miller from Model Railroader, MR photographer Lou Sassi, John Forsythe of TCS, and a total of 6 MMRs including Allen McClelland. You are bound to find a topic you want to know more about.

Since this is "our" convention, that also means we still need everyone's help in pulling this off. Randy Kerka has the master list of volunteers. If you have signed up to help, please double check with him for what and when you are scheduled --- so we are not left short. And if you have not done so, find a place to volunteer. Randy can help you fit your available time to our volunteer slots. Frank Koch will be running our famous White Elephant sale as we do at the Flea Market and the Fall Show. If you have stuff that needs to be moved along (to make space for the great new things hitting the stores), then go to the website and get the e-form, and fill it out for Frank, and bring your stuff to the hotel to hopefully find new owners. There is no trade show with this convention, so there should be a lot of potential captive buyers wanting to spend their money.

I'm personally looking forward to the prototype tour to the Tropicana facility in Springdale. This is the Midwest terminal for the famous "Juice Train" that runs out of Florida. The other one, serving the Northeast, is in New Jersey. It is likely you have seen either the prototype cars, the large white or orange refrigerator cars with the Tropicana name in billboard letters on the side; or have seen (and maybe even own) the models. But you likely did not know the Cincinnati connection. My interest is actually less about the train operations and more about the juice business because in my former P&G life I worked on Citrus Hill Orange Juice for about 10 years, and had my own experiences with rail transport in the juice business. I know some of the Tropicana business model; but would never have been allowed in their facility back then; so this is a neat chance for me to see what I still kind of think of as "the competition." (no conflict now – P&G got out of this business years ago).

That's about it for this month. Since there is no regular meeting, I expect to see you at the Cincinnati Express Convention between May 17th and 20th.





Well, this is it! The month we have been awaiting 3 years for. In just 17 days, Division 7 will host a spectacular Regional Convention, "*The Cincinnati Express*". The Convention Committee and many volunteers have been working diligently to make this convention the benchmark all other divisions will aspire to. Several of our members will be conducting interesting clinics and dozens have been preparing their impressive layouts for a plethora of tours, op sessions and open houses.

The committee has also done a great job in securing famous outside clinicians, fantastic prototype tours, wonderful non-rail and general interest programs, and 4 terrific food events – Thursday pizza dinner reception at EnterTrainment Junction, Thursday night Meet & Greet with Wine Tasting, Saturday Ladies Luncheon and Saturday night's banquet. Add to that the raffle, white elephant sale, company store, in-hotel and EnterTrainment Junction layouts, Train Control Systems/LCC booth, photo/model/arts/crafts contest, registration/tour desk, convention office, hospitality rooms, free parking and the beautifully renovated Cincinnati Marriott North hotel and you have the makings for an outstanding convention.

I urge those members who haven't volunteered to do so immediately by contacting Randy Kerka. You will still have time to enjoy the convention and your involvement will only enhance your experience. Even if you are helping one or more layout owners host their sessions you should still have time to come to the hotel and enjoy the clinics and other activities. Rail clinics start at 8 am on Friday and Saturday and run until 10 pm on Thursday, and 11 pm on Friday. There are no breaks for lunch, and only a short break for dinner. Make sure you also register with Roy Hord to fully partake in this rare opportunity. We likely won't host another convention until about 12 years from now!







2018 Cincinnati Express White Elephant Sales

This year's convention will again offer attendees the opportunity to dispose of surplus model railroading items (NO magazines) and to acquire some treasures from other attendees. The rules are simple:

- Prepare an inventory (electronic is preferred, but paper is fine as long as it is legible) showing your name, address and telephone number. For a printable electronic inventory form, please see <u>http://www.cincy-div7.org/convention.html</u>.
- List <u>each individual</u> item with a brief description and code so we can match it back to you and your <u>firm</u> asking price in <u>whole dollar amounts only with a \$5.00</u> <u>minimum price</u>. We will only sell at the marked price & will not negotiate pricing.
- Each individual item must be clearly marked and priced as shown below. The price on the item's sticker and the inventory must match. If there is more than one of an item, list them <u>separately</u>. If you have more than 25 items, just extend the sheet or add another sheet and continue the numbers.



- 4. Put all your items in a bag or box and bring them to the White Elephant room at any time it is open. A copy of the inventory sheet must accompany your items (and/or send it to me electronically before the convention starts)
- 5. We will log your items in, sell them, reconcile sales with left-over material, and calculate how much you earned. The Division will keep 10% of actual sales (whole dollar fee) and we will pay either with cash or by check depending on the amount since we will be accepting credit cards for sales (\$25 minimum sale).
- 6. You must pick up your unsold material and money on Saturday afternoon before we shut down for the night. If you do not claim your unsold material, it will be considered a donation to Cincinnati Division 7.
- 7. If you would like an electronic inventory form, go to our <u>http://www.cincy-div7.org/convention.html</u> webpage or send Frank Koch an e-mail at <u>fikoch@hotmail.com</u> with "elephant inventory" in the subject line. When you download the file, save it and substitute your last name for "MASTER" in the file name, i.e., sales inventory-KOCH, to identify it as your inventory. Email the file back to Frank at <u>fikoch@hotmail.com</u> and then make two printouts one for you and one to accompany your items.
