Monthly Contest Rules Clarification



We've had some questions recently about which models qualify for which of our 3 model contest categories. In particular, the "Box Stock" category seems to be a source of confusion. If you visit our official contest rules on our website, you'll see that category is for models you built from a kit, with or without minor improvements. Under no circumstances are ready-to-run models allowed, either built that way by a manufacturer or by another modeler.

In order to minimize such confusion in the future, I've changed the name of that particular category to "<u>Kit-Built</u>" instead of "Box Stock". As such, here's a snapshot of all 3 of our model categories. For further details, please see the complete contest rules and regulations within the Contest page of our website.

- <u>Kit-Built</u> (formerly Box Stock) <u>Models you've assembled from a</u> <u>manufacturer's kit</u>. Minor improvements such as different couplers, painted handrails, different trucks, etc. still come under this category. <u>Purchased or</u> <u>Ready to Run (RTR) models are not allowed</u>. An Athearn diesel locomotive would qualify for entry in this category if assembly of the handrails, horn, headlight glass, etc. was required.
- 2. <u>Kit-Bashed</u> Models you've built comprising at least 2 of these elements:
 - a) Significant quantities and levels of super-details added by the modeler
 - b) Splicing parts of 2 or more models to create one unique model
 - c) Custom painting and/or weathering
- Scratch-Built Models you've built where the basic model is constructed from scratch. No splicing of commercial models can be incorporated. Commercially available wheels, mechanisms and detail parts can be used.
