

In order to minimize such confusion in the future, I've changed the name of that particular category to "<u>Kit-Built</u>" instead of "Box Stock". As such, here's a snap-shot of all 3 of our model categories. For further details, please see the complete contest rules and regulations within the Contest page of our website.

- <u>Kit-Built</u> (formerly Box Stock) <u>Models you've assembled from a manu-facturer's kit</u>. Minor improvements such as different couplers, painted handrails, different trucks, etc. still come under this category. <u>Purchased or Ready to Run (RTR) models are not allowed</u>. An Athearn diesel locomotive would qualify for entry in this category if assembly of the handrails, horn, headlight glass, etc. was required.
- 2. <u>**Kit-Bashed**</u> Models you've built comprising at least 2 of these elements:Significant quantities and levels of super-details added by the modelerSplicing parts of 2 or more models to create one unique modelCustom painting and/or weathering
- 3. <u>Scratch-Built</u> Models you've built where the basic model is constructed from scratch. No splicing of commercial models can be incorporated. Commercially available wheels, mechanisms and detail parts can be used.

Division 7 Car Project (Limited Edition!)

Cincinnati Division 7's Car Project Committee is pleased to announce the availability of our latest, limited-edition car project!

Using Accurail's 2200 Series ACF 2-Bay Covered Hopper as the basis, we are offering it in a Norfolk & Western repaint scheme.

These cars are N&W class HC-46 and are from an original batch of fifty built by in 1966 by ACF and were painted in the Round Herald paint scheme.

Sometime subsequent to that some cars went through a general maintenance program where the were repainted in the block N&W livery. Photos were found showing that at least three of these cars (road numbers 170753, 170768 and 170794) were reweighed at some later date because that area is "patched out" on the car with the new data displayed. Those same photos place these three cars as being in service in 1992 and 2004! It is these three, highly unique, road numbers that Cincinnati Division 7 is now offering for sale.

As with all Accurail cars, they are in kit form only.

Pricing is \$25 per car, or a 3-car set at \$70. Shipping (via USPS Priority) is \$9.20 for one car and \$16.25 for two to three cars.

Ohio residents, please add 7.8% sales tax on the total price of the kits and the shipping and handling fee.

I only received these cars the week of 9/12 and as such they aren't even up on our Division 7 web site yet.

They will be for sale at our Fall Show.




How about that wonderful monthly raffle
