Jim's intent was to continue handling the research needed for the car projects, while someone else was handling the "back-end" work. Frank Koch offered the services of the Cincinnati Model Railway Club to take on shipping / handling duties. Frank felt that this would allow the effort to be shared by more than one person.

With Jim's resignation, the Cincinnati Model Railway Club will also assume responsibilities for finalizing the details of the MVR / V & O box cars, and handling the order fulfillment for the current car projects. Again, I thank Jim for his efforts in making the car projects successful for so many years.

Congratulations to Roy Hord for his reception of an "NMRA President's Award for Service to the Division" at the Orlando convention banquet. This award is part of an NMRA National program to recognize one person from each Region who has done outstanding, "beyond-the-call-of-duty" work to make his or her local division effective, engaging, and welcoming to members. These are the people who work tirelessly behind the scenes to get the things done that keep the division running. Roy's work on our train shows and conventions and other efforts through the years certainly put him in this category.

Our August meeting on the 13th was held at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Kenwood. Ed Swain gave a clinic on "Building with Styrene" in which he showed how to create a structure from drawings and photos using basic styrene shapes and sheet. After the meeting we visited Gerry Albers' Virginian layout and Pat Homan's Burlington steam layout.

Looking ahead:

On September 10th, we will be out on the southeast side at the Anderson Senior Center. Ron Pearson will be our clinician. His presentation will be on "The Coal Mines on the East Broad Top". Layout visits following the meeting will be to John Listermann's HO Baltimore & Ohio and to Rick Crumrine's HO Waynesburg & Washington (Pennsylvania).

In October (10/8), we will have our annual Northern Kentucky meeting at the Kenton County Library in Erlanger. Our clinician will be Dan Finfrock. His subject is the B&O branch from New Miami to Middletown "A Railroad You Can Model". Afterwards, we will visit Tom Vogt's HO layout in Fort Wright and Perry Simpson's HO L&N.

In November, on the 12th, we will venture well up north for a joint meeting with Dayton Division 3. The meeting will be at the Sycamore Medical Center, which is just west of Dayton Mall in Miamisburg. Our clinician for this joint meeting is Stephen Priest, MMR and the editor of *Railroad Model Craftman*. Layout visits will include Bob Lawson's and Greg Simpson's (from our Division) and Wes Reece's (from Dayton).

We will end our year as we usually do with a December meeting on the west side at Westwood United Methodist Church. This will be the traditional pot luck slide/digital photo/ video show and snackfest. In January, we will be back again in Kenwood on the 14th at Good Shepherd Lutheran. In February, we will be at West Chester library. And in March, we will have our annual Flea Market at Lakota West Freshman School.

Before last month's meeting, I had the chance to attend the national NMRA convention in Orlando. This turned out to be something of an adventure as my car broke down and I actually arrived at the hotel by tow truck! But I still managed to salvage most of the time at the convention and the National Train Show that followed. I spent two days doing layout tours, which I always enjoy; but it took a lot more riding on a bus to see layouts in Florida than we have to do here. One day we went almost half way down the east coast (so a little north of West Palm) and worked our way back. The next day we went to the west coast to the Tampa area. Since most homes in Florida do not have basements, we saw several creative layout spaces. The most unusual was a home with TWO sheds in the back yard that housed the layout. One shed had the staging yards and dispatchers office, and the other had the two deck layout. Connecting the buildings was a deck/walkway with an insulated tube about railing height through which the trains ran.

On the other days I attended a number of clinics, including two "Modeling with the Masters" clinics where several MMRs (Master Model Railroaders) led the group through hands-on projects. As a result, I now have a new railroad structure made from a laser kit and several weathered cars. The convention banquet speaker was Todd Stennis of Amtrak, who talked about Amtrak and specifically about the Auto Train. Did you know that the Auto Train is the longest passenger train in the world? The typical train is 16 passenger cars and up to 30 autoracks. Since it's so successful, why don't they add more cars? Answer – this is the maximum that the locomotives can supply electrical power for. [Actually, a recent refit of the cars with LED lighting may allow the addition of an additional car. [If CSX will agree to the change.] Why don't they lengthen the run (currently Lorton, VA to Sanford, FL) on to New York and into Orlando? Answer – it would mess up the logisitics for daily service. The current run allows enough time for loading and unloading, and servicing; plus the 17 hour trip. A longer run would either not allow enough time for the "turnaround" steps at each end; or would require four sets of equipment instead of two and twice the crew; but would not use them as efficiently.

I hope to see you in Anderson on September the 10th.


