

HEADLIGHTS

We had our August monthly meeting, again via Zoom, on Sunday the 8th. Our clinician was model railroad author and manufacturer Bernard Kempinski whose topic was "Railroads of the Civil War" featuring photos of his own O scale layout depicting the military railroad that existed near where he lives in Alexandria, Virginia during the war. This was part civil war history lesson, part modeling clinic, and part railroad history. As both a model railroader AND a Civil War buff, it was interesting to hear Bernie's discussion of the role that railroads played in the War. I especially gleaned that the often stated disadvantage to the South of having railroads of different gauges is not really true. The South was actually more standardized than the North. The disadvantage was that the Southern railroads generally did not connect to each other or allow interchange, while both of these things had begun to be true in the North. This meant that long distance moves of both freight and troops was more practical in the North.

I was also struck by the statistics on *what* was hauled. From our century, we assume it was either troops or guns and ammo. The reality is that a major part of the capacity was used to supply the fodder for the horses (and mules) that were needed to move anything more than a few miles from any railroad terminal or port. And horses eat a lot. I also found it interesting that the Northern railroads (with a couple of exceptions like the B&O) primarily continued to haul commerce during the war, with only a minority part devoted to military goods.

In September, we return to in-person meetings. The A/V volunteers have had their training/ practice session and we are (mostly) ready to make this a "simulcast" event. If for any reason you cannot, or do not want to, attend in person; the meeting will be available on *Zoom* as well. As this will be our first live attempt at doing this, I think it is quite likely that it will not go perfectly. Please bear with us, and please *please* do not criticize the folks learning how to do this for any problems that arise. We will do our best, and try to do better in October etc.

For example, during the practice, we had trouble getting the *Zoom* meeting going on the host computer. Even though we had tested the wifi speed at the hotel previously, it was not very good on the day we practiced. Maybe the room was just a poor location, or maybe a large group in the ball-room that afternoon caused it to slow down. Or maybe we just had the second computer misconfigured. We worked through it, but it took time. So one potential issue discovered and avoided.

I hope most of you will be able to attend in person. Please stay tuned to the latest on the news about any government requirements for indoor activities and comply with whatever the Marriott's policies are. We have a good relationship with this hotel and want to be "good" customers.

At the moment, we still plan on having our huge Cincinnati Model Train and Trade Show at Lakota West HS on October 9 and 10. The September meeting will be the last chance to pick up street signs to help with the advertising of the event. Please see John Burchnall before or after the meeting. There will also be the normal signup sheets for the other volunteer assignments.

I am really happy to finally be able to add the following. I look forward to seeing all of you <u>in-</u><u>person</u> at the September meeting on Sunday the 12th.



Officer Nominations & Election Process

Cincinnati Division 7, MCR, NMRA

Per our Regulations, elections for our Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent occurs in the second half of each odd-numbered year. The first step in this process has taken place, with the establishment of the 2021 Nominating Committee consisting of Randy Kerka (Chair), John Burchnall and Peter Weiglin. That committee has also appointed Bob Shreve as Teller.

Our Regulations provide four ways for members to be nominated for either of these offices -

- Members can proactively contact one of the Nominating Committee members and express interest in being a candidate
- The Nominating Committee deliberates, identifies and approaches prospects, and then publishes their initial slate in the October Oil Can
- Nominations may also be made by a petition signed by two members and submitted to the Nominating Committee before the end of the October membership meeting
- Nominations from the floor, if any, will be accepted during the October membership meeting

Each nominee must agree to being a candidate. All valid nominations from the last three steps are included in the ballot. The ballot and candidate-provided biographical sketches will be published in either the November Oil Can or on similar timing via a special mailing, emailing, electronic voting or other means. The voting means will be determined by the BOD.

Marked ballots must be received by the Teller by the specified deadline, typically a few days before the end of November. The Teller will also accept physical ballots, if used, at the November membership meeting. After the voting deadline, the Teller tallies the votes, notifies each candidate, and reports the results to the BOD at the December BOD meeting. Results are verbally reported at the December membership meeting and published in the January Oil Can. The newly elected officers take office at the end of the January membership meeting.




