

Net and Field Committee

- Check condition of the Goals- if issues contact Scott Sjurson with the City.
- Give Game Schedule to Scott Sjurson prior to season
 - Let Scott know when season is starting- the city will paint the fields if they are asked- don't assume they will do it or that it is their job- they paint as a courtesy for soccer. They like to mow before painting fields, prior to putting nets on (doesn't always work out) so coordinate with Scott early.
- Set date and time to put nets on and take down nets end of season (Ask parents to help; nice to have 2-3 people per net).
- Check supplies for nets- cable ties (get assorted package)- get from Ace Hardware (we have charge account there).
- Ladders- 2 in the soccer building to use; ask helpers to bring ladder too; goes faster if more ladders.
- Check the nets for holes and repair (usually repair with small zip ties).
- New nets were just ordered in 2023. If nets are needed, order nets that have depth, e.g., 8x24x4x8 and order at least 3mm or 4mm.
- Check the nets throughout the season, cable ties do come loose and check the fields for any debris, garbage or other issues.
- Check metal goal posts throughout the season that they are intact. Sometimes the mower can catch an edge and break it loose.
- Check the corner field flags especially on U10 and U12 fields. If orange triangle flags are faded, replace them from equipment tote.
- Give Scott Sjurson a call if paint is fading on the fields.
- Benches are stored on the east side of soccer building. At start of season, ask parents to help place the benches on the field. Benches can be left on the fields until the end of the season.
- Consider keeping one set of U6 nets up for kids to play throughout summer.
