The 12 Tribes In The Last Days: Genesis 49 Explained

- Malachi 4:4-6 (Since the time of John the Baptist and birth of Christ we have been living in the last days. Remember Jesus was crucified in the middle of the week or 7,000. Since his death we have been in the latter half of the thousand year=day period.)

- 4. Genesis 37:1-11 (The twelve tribes of Israel are the physical embodiment of a spiritual concept I.E. the church. Physical Israel [Israelites a Black people cursed, in captivity, and scattered to the four corners of the earth] and Spiritual Israel [body of Christ].Spiritual Israel must put themselves under the banner of the Israelites the Priests of God.)

- 9. Genesis 49:1-4 (Reuben. Reuben physically defiled his father's bed but this also has a spiritual meaning for the church.Remember Jacob is prophesying here meaning he is saying what thus declareth the Lord.So it is the Lord talking. Jacob is merely the vessel.)

- 11. Exodus 4:22-23 (The Israelites as a nation are Yah's firstborn son just like Reuben is Jacob's.)

- 13. Psalm 147:19-20 (Israelites job is to priest unto all the sons of Adam)
- 14. Exodus 19:1-7 This was probably around pentecost
- 15. Ephesians 5:22-32 (The church is Christ's wife/bride)

- 17. Deuteronomy 4:1-2\_5-8\_13\_15-19\_23 (Israel Yah's firstborn defiled Yah's bed or wife which is the church but not teaching mankind to keep Yah's commandments.)

- 19. Genesis 49:5-7 (This is physically referring to when they took vengeance on behalf of their sister. Also Levi was given no inheritance and was dispersed among the Israelites while Simeon's allotment was within Judah's. Also many of the tribe of Simeon became scribes and school teachers and thus were also dispersed among the Israelites. The spiritual meaning is referring to the scribes and pharisees crucifying Jesus. Digged a wall should read killed a bull. The KJV translates Strong's H7794 in the following manner: ox (62x), bullock (12x), cow (2x), bull (1x), wall (1x). Outline of Biblical Usage: ox, bull, a head of cattle for plowing, for food, as sacrifice. The showr, shore; from H7788; a bullock (as a traveller):—bull(-ock), cow, ox, wall (by mistake for H7791). The KJV translators did not follow the Masoretic vowel pointing which has the Cholem above the Vav, which renders the word as ""uir" (oxen). The LXX has "raῦpov" (bull) which agrees with the Masoretic rendering. The Dead Sea Scrolls have this portion in fragment 4QGene but is of no use to our current discussion because vowels do not appear in the Dead Sea Scrolls (though some English translations of the Dead Sea Scrolls might render the

phrase as "hamstrung oxen"). The KJV translators saw the Vav as a Shureq, rendering the word as "שוּר" (wall))

The prophecy concerning Issachar is referring to Christ's millennial reign when all nations/peoples shall receive rest.)
- 36. Joshua 19:10-11 (Zebulon's allotment near sea)
- 37. Matthew 4:12-17 (Area near Zebulon became a haven for Gentiles)

- 41. Genesis 49:16-20 (Dan literally judged Israel with Samson and in the wilderness being the most rearward of the camp. The spiritual meaning behind Dan, Aser, and Gad is prophesying about Christ first and second comings)

- 44. Luke 2:25-35 (I have waited for thy salvation, O Lord. Dan shall be a serpent by the way, an adder in the path, that biteth the horse heels, so that his rider shall fall backward.)
