## RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Bucket Babies Show is open to any youth between the ages of 5-8 as of September 30, 2024.
- 2. Animals permitted are calves (under 300 pounds), llamas, alpacas, lambs and goat kids. All lambs and goats <u>MUST</u> comply with the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines. All animals will be health checked.
- 3. NO intact animals will be allowed. All calves, lambs, and goats must be properly castrated.
- 4. ALL ANIMALS BEING BROUGHT FROM HOME MUST BE PRE-APPROVED AND DESIGNATED ON THE ENTRY FORM. THEN, THEY MUST BE CHECKED IN WITH THE SHOW CHAIRMAN AND HEALTH CHECKED PRIOR TO UNLOADING AND COMING INTO THE BARN THE DAY OF THE SHOW.
- 5. Exhibitors may show only one animal.
- 6. There is no entry fee.
- 7. All entries must be submitted by June 8, 2024 All entry information will be on our web site <a href="https://www.cmrfarmshow.com">www.cmrfarmshow.com</a> The Secretary will be available at the Culpeper Agriculture Enterprises on Saturday June 8th 10:00 am 12:00 pm for assistance with entries.
- 8. Entries will NOT be accepted on the day of show.
- 9. Cloverbud exhibitors are not permitted to exercise single control of the animal at any time during the show. Please ask a junior or senior 4-H exhibitor to assist with the animal you have brought/chosen.
- 10. All exhibitors must choose/bring their own animals prior to the show. You must make arrangements for the animal you will show prior to filling out registration. On your registration, you will designate if you plan on bringing one from home, or borrow/use one already on the grounds.
- 11. All animals must be in good condition. CMR Farm Show reserves the right to refuse animals deemed unfit. Animals brought must be removed from the grounds the day of show.
- 12. Youth will not be in competition with each other and will receive a ribbon for participation.
