
Ukrainian Film Event

Catalyst was honoured to screen Ukraine's entry to the 95th Academy Awards, **KLONDIKE**, 2022, Ukraine, Turkey Director Maryna Er Gorbach. A huge contingent of Ukrainians living in Limerick attended the film and pre-recorded interview with Director Maryna Er Gorbach and Award Winning Irish Cinematographer Kate McCullough, (*An Cáilín Ciúin*).

Panels

New Voices: New Industry Panel

Filmmaker and Catalyst Programme Assistant Aisha Bolaji moderated this panel of up-and-coming creatives within the Irish film industry.

The lineup included Actor Martin Mahon, Director Rehan Ali, Writer/Director Elizabeth Adewusi and Director Nell Hensey.

Putting the Screenwriter into the Picture Panel

In association with the Writers Guild of Ireland, this event highlighted the importance of the short film script as a calling card and how writers can break through into longer forms.

The importance of having writers from diverse backgrounds was also debated by the panel.

Meet the Film Critics Panel

This panel, comprised of respected film critics working nationally, reflected on whether critics are drawn from too small a pool. Internationally, they are primarily white, middle-class men. Is that true in Ireland? And does it impact the films reviewed and the perspective and taste of the reviewer? Organised by WFT in partnership.

2023 Programme Script Lab

Finalists for our 2023 Short Script Award finalists and promising new voices were invited to an intimate 2 hour Script Lab with Aisling Walsh in Engine, Limerick. Over 2 sessions, Aisling was able to give each writer the time to discuss their own work amongst their peers. Every writer gained invaluable insight from Aisling's own extraordinary career as a screenwriter and director.

Masterclass

Cinematographer Jaro Waldeck in conversation with award-winning director Aisling Walsh traversed the visual storytelling behind her two films Maudie and Song for a Raggy Boy. Together, they explored the themes of these films and offered an insight into the process of creating the visual concepts for each story. We welcomed students from the National Film School Dublin as well as most of our filmmakers and students from the area.

National Talent Academies Coffee Morning

Filmmakers were given the opportunity to meet and discuss their work with National Talent Academies Manager Eibh Collins at an informal Coffee Morning in The Belltable Cafe. Kindly sponsored by National Talent Academy.

Student Programme

Catalyst's 2023 Student Programme doubled its capacity on 2022. We began an extensive outreach campaign in December 2022 to ensure all Second Level Schools in the Munster area were made aware of the programme. Students attended our Interactive Masterclasses and the Shorts Programme, engagement was strong and all voted for 2023's Young Audience Award Winner (*Highs* by Louis Chan)

Catalyst increased its audience attendance from 2022 to 2023 by selecting a range of different venues and increasing its total events and screenings to 15. 2023 was the 4th year of the festival and only the 2nd time we've had an in-person festival due to Covid. With an overall increase in attendance from it is clear that there are audiences in the locally in the region and nationally. With secured infrastructure (in particular with regard to Outreach), Catalyst can further promote under-represented filmmaking and reach new audiences in the future.
