## **Getting to Know...** by Deb Chilcote



**Grace Grimsley** – Grace has been quilting about 28 years. She had wanted to learn for a few years when the Strawberry Stitchery moved close to her area and she finally decided that was the time. She joined the guild several years later after retiring from Ft. Walton Beach Medical Center, and while she dabbled in all sorts of crafts, none stuck until she tried quilting. Grace was involved in several jobs in the guild, from Parliamentarian to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Presidents. She also taught a number of classes both at

guild meetings and at the retreats. Grace is currently, and has been, in charge of collecting the jelly roll strips for our monthly Strips Club drawings.



**Kaye Joachim** – Kaye was born in a small town in Ohio. She and her husband, Larry, moved to Toledo, Ohio where they raised their daughters until moving to Houston. Kaye has worked for various manufacturers and accounting firms all her adult life, but also squeezed in time to get her real estate license, and sell real estate before temporarily moving to Qatar with her husband. Linda has been a member of the guild for two years and have enjoyed it tremendously! Linda served on the Bylaws/SOPP committee in 2023 and is currently the coordinator for the Mystery Block of the Month program. Everyone in her family has a quilt. Her family and her fur babies are most important in her life.

# <u>Quilts of Valor in Conjunction</u> <u>with Homes for Our Troops:</u> Barbi Ouellette

On Saturday, April 6, 2024, I was asked to present a quilt to SPC Tyler Smith who was receiving the keys to his new home provided by Homes for our Troops (HFOT) in Pensacola.



On Mar 28, 2012, during his first deployment, Specialist Joseph "Tyler" Smith, an IT specialist, was serving with the 3rd Squadron, 73rd Cavalry Regiment 1st Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division in Ghazni, Afghanistan, when he had an aneurysm. Tyler lost the use of his right leg, and experiences right-hand peripheral neuropathy as well as other symptoms affecting his emotions.

The independence and financial stability of receiving a donated home will give Tyler more time for the things he loves, including spending time outdoors, building computers, and playing video games. He looks forward to traveling and paying it forward by helping others.

The ceremony included several speakers from the Community Engagement Coordinator, Krystina Goroshko, a Quilt of Valor presented by Barbi Ouellette and Anne Marie Wilkerson, a letter from US Senator Marco Rubio, Sen John Gaetz (father of Rep Matt Gaetz), Jackson Smith who is Tyler's' mentor and friend, Cindy Baptiste, CFO of HFOT, with Tyler speaking through many tears.

There was also a flag raising and ribbon cutting ceremony along with a tour of Tyler's new home. The home is designed to accommodate Tyler's disabilities for years to come.

# From the Kitchen of...

#### **Coconut Pecan Gooey Butter Cake**

#### Shared at the April meeting by Penny Maus

Recipe from The Cake Mix Doctor by Anne Byrn

prep time: 15 minutes bake time: 45-47 minutes

serves: 20

#### **CRUST:**

18.25 oz plain yellow cake mix

1 stick butter, melted

1 large egg

1 cup finely chopped pecans (I used candied pecans)

1 cup unsweetened grated coconut

#### FILLING:

8 oz cream cheese at room temperature

2 large eggs

1 tsp pure vanilla extract

1 stick butter, melted

3¾ cup confectioner's' sugar

Preheat oven to 350\*. Set aside an ungreased 9x13" pan.

For the crust... Place cake mix, one stick melted butter, egg, pecans, and coconut in large mixing bowl. Blend on low speed for two minutes or until batter comes together in a ball. Pat batter—using fingertips—evenly over bottom of pan. Set aside. For the filling... Use the same mixing bowl and beaters to blend the cream cheese on low speed for 30 seconds or until fluffy. Add eggs, vanilla, plus remaining stick of melted butter and beat on medium speed for one minute. Scrape sides of bowl, and add confectioner's sugar. Continue to beat on medium speed for one more minute. Pour filling onto crust and spread evenly so that filling covers entire surface and reaches sides of pan. Bake until cake is well-browned but center still jiggles—about 45 to 47 minutes. Remove from oven and place on wire rack to cool. Store cake covered in aluminum foil at room temperature for up to 4 days, or in the refrigerator 1 week, or freeze for up to 6 months.

### Board Meeting Minutes, April 4, 2024: Theresa Atkinson

Meeting called to order at 9:00 am by Kerry Kastl, President.

#### Agenda:

- 1. Anne Johnson moved, and Sherri Hayes seconded that the minutes of the March 7<sup>th</sup> board meeting be approved. Unanimously approved by the board.
- 2. Sherri Hayes presented the Treasurer's report stating there is \$34,876.89 in the guild account.
- 3. Anne Johnson has been looking into replacing the sound system. Unfortunately, the first one purchased had to be returned, and the guild was fully refunded for the cost. A new system has been found, and thoroughly researched, for a price of \$549 with an additional fee for a wireless mic. The updated information will be shared with the membership. A motion was made and seconded that the guild purchase the system. Unanimously approved.
- 4. Donna Gross presented the benefits of joining the Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce. As a nonmember of the Chamber, she has already been able to obtain a free table for the guild at Military Appreciation Day, April 20, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., at The Landing, located at 139 Brooks Street. Barbi has the opportunity to put a team together to sell tickets for the Quilt for Veterans opportunity quilt. We also have space at the International Food Festival on April 21 from 11:00 am to 7:00 pm at The Landing. Sherri Hayes made the motion to join the Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce, and Anne Johnson made the second. The Board approved becoming members of the Chamber. The cost is \$225 per year.
- 5. Linda Weiss has been speaking with the TDC director who is now her point person on the Quilt Show. Linda will know soon if the pipe and drape will be included in our contract, or if we will need to pay for the pipe and drape from another company. Linda has a firm quilt show date of March 7 & 8, 2025.
- 6. Anne Johnson discussed upcoming programs for the next few months.
- 7. Konnie Glaze discussed upcoming workshops as well as ideas for the 2024 mystery trip.

Anne Johnson made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Theresa Atkinson made a second and the meeting was adjourned at 9:37 am.

Minutes taken by Theresa Atkinson, secretary. Due to an injury, Theresa was unable to finish the minutes. Kaye Joachim typed up and submitted the minutes with the help of the Board.

#### FNQG General Meeting Minutes, April 11, 2024: Theresa Atkinson

The meeting was called to order at 9:59 am by Kerry Kastl, President.

Prayer was led by Linda Weiss followed by the Pledge of Allegiance with a "God Bless America" by Sandra Congelton.

#### Officer's Report:

**Treasurer**, Sherri Hayes, reported that the guild was in good financial condition and had reported to the board.

1<sup>st</sup> VP, Anne Johnson, talked about the May social. Names A-K are to bring food to share and we will be playing left, right center. Bring a spool of thread, a notion, and a fat quarter if you want to play. The program this month was Diane Roberson's Let's Define Modern Quilting." She and Laraine Acosta put on a slide show presentation of some of the quilts from Quilt Con and also brought some of their own modern quilts for a trunk show to demonstrate the various methods of modern quilting. Anne said she would give Kaye the slide show presentation to put on the website under the members only page.

**2**<sup>nd</sup> **VP**, Konnie Glaze, talked about the upcoming "Let's Define Modern Quilting" for the month of April workshop which coincides with the program for today. The May workshop is Abstract Landscaping led by Anne Johnson she will teach improv and curved piecing (a new technique). June's workshop led by Deb Chilcote is a Mystery workshop but will be approximately 32" x 32" when completed. You can make this scrappy if you like.

#### **Business Reported by Kerry Kastl:**

We have zoned in on a Fender Passport Conference S2 Portable PA System Bundle with Compact Speaker Stands, XLR Cable, and Instrument Cable. The Board voted unanimously to make the purchase. The new system will cost \$549 plus the cost of an additional wireless mic. This is newer technology, takes up less space and is lighter and less cumbersome in general. The current system is over 10 years old and needed to be replaced. Kerry said that she would like to donate the current system to a guest member at the church.

Kerry shared that Donna Gross presented the benefits of joining the Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce to the board. As a nonmember of the Chamber, she has already been able to obtain a free table for the guild at Military Appreciation Day, April 20, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., at The Landing, located at 139 Brooks Street. Barbi will be selling tickets for the Quilt for Veterans opportunity quilt. We also have space at the International Food Festival on April 21 from 11:00 am to 7:00 pm at The Landing. The cost for membership is \$225 per year. This is a great way for sponsorship for things like the quilt show, etc. The Board voted to join the Fort Walton Beach Chamber.

#### **Member Services:**

**Community Service** – Jeanie Donnelly and Janie Morris visited a lady from the Meridian at Westwood in FWB who had contacted the guild about donating her fabric as she is no longer able to quilt. Jeanie made several kits from her fabrics and made a challenge to the guild to take home a kit and make a quilt for community service. Next community service workshop (April 18<sup>th</sup>) will be a potluck.

**Membership** – Lisa Lydston stated we had 60 members at the meeting and 2 guest, Nina Hopwood, Diane's cousin, and Laraine Acosta, a friend of Diane's and also one of the presenters for today's program. There were no new members joining this month.

**Hospitality** – Mary Ann was home today taking care of her husband after a surgery. In her place manning the kitchen were Linda Van Hoesen and Mary Weathersby.

**Food Pantry** – Gail Menard stated that the church was restocking their pantry.

**Sunshine and Shadows** – Ruthie Reynoso stated she was really busy this month so far sending out 7-8 cards.

**Newsletter** – Peggy Murrell stated that if you want anything in the newsletter for May, the deadline is April 18<sup>th</sup>.

**December Block** – Deb Chilcote said there is still time to sign up for the December block. The first set of blocks are due in June and the second set of blocks are due in November. The pattern can be found on the website.

**QOV** – Barbi stated that there would be a QOV award program set at the Eglin Air Armament this Saturday at 12:30. Members are invited to attend and wrap veterans in quilts. She will need at least 6 volunteers for April 20 & 21 at The FWB Landing. She wants to have 3 shifts of 2 each to sell QOV opportunity tickets. Barbi stated that 34 veterans are on the list to receive a quilt; with 8 coming up soon. Barbi talked about a program called Home for Our Troops which is out of Boston, MA. We have donated to date 1,400 quilts for QOV. Barbi recognized Doris Olig for donating 105 quilts to QOV. Barbi also told the guild that Tabitha Smith from Camilla Palms stated she would donate \$100 to FNQG's QOV for every booking she receives for a retreat in the month of May. Barbi is presenting a QOV to Tabitha's son.

**UFO Program** – Robin Easter-Neubauer said the next UFO is due June 13.

**BOM** – Linda Hudson is going to have sashing and at least 2 borders to pass out at the end of the Mystery quilt for those participating. You can use them if you like.


<u>Kaye Joachim</u> finished a couple retreat class projects: the woolie "All Around Summer"
