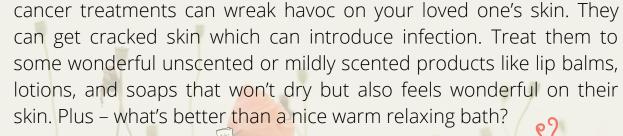
cards

are a wonderful way to help with nausea, fatigue, or just to relax after a crazy day.



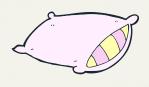
