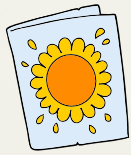


BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

scarf & headband

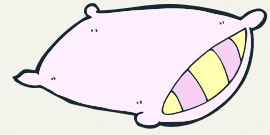
