## **Lake Livingston**

**Size:** 90,000 acres

**Age:** Impounded in 1969

Location: Lies on the Trinity River about 70 miles north of Houston off U.S. Highway 190

in the counties of Walker, Polk, Trinity and San Jacinto.

**Description:** This is the second largest reservoir that lies totally within Texas. Nestled in mixed forest of pine and hardwoods, the lake provides public water supply for Houston and surrounding communities. The lake is 52 miles long, fairly turbid and fertile with a maximum depth of 90 feet.

**Fishing Regulations:** Channel catfish -- 50 per day, all at least nine inches long (14 inches for commercial fishermen). All others same as statewide.

## **Stocking History:**

Largemouth bass -- 1969 Florida bass -- 1975, 76, 77, 78 Channel catfish -- 1969, 70 Paddlefish -- 1990, 91 Blue catfish -- 1969

Striped bass -- 1977 - 80, 82 - 89

**Comments:** This is one of the most productive reservoirs in the state for catfish and white bass. What's more, TPWD fisheries crews use the river below the dam to gather much of their striped bass brood fish for the hatchery system. The area below the dam is also one of the top tailrace fisheries in the state.


