## Meeting & Workshop: Friday, February 17, 2023 <u>Presentation by Dr. Eric Ruple</u> "Not your Undergraduate Music History"

#### **Workshop description**

When is the last time you looked at your notes from you undergraduate Music History class? (Hmm, they are around here somewhere, right?) When is the last time you even thought about the unchangeable truths about the four eras: Baroque; Classical; Romantic: Modern? What precipitated the changes from one era to the next? We will take a look at how world events over the past few years may be both ushering in a "new" musical era, and casting a new light on some of our old suppositions. This workshop should be a time for fun and creative ideas. Who says history is dead?!

#### **Biography**

Steinway Artist Eric Ruple joined the piano faculty at James Madison University in 1987. He enjoys an active career as a solo and chamber musician, including several performances at the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC, Steinway Hall in New York, and he is also pianist for the Virginia Symphony Orchestra, including principal keyboard role in the ongoing "Harry Potter Live" concerts. He was also featured in Bernstein's "Prelude, Fugue and Riffs" with the VSO Jazz Ensemble. His recording "Musica Incognito" with hornist Ian Zook has earned unanimously positive reviews from several national and international publications. He is an active member of the American Liszt Society and is a regular adjudicator in Hong Kong. He received his doctoral degree from the University of Michigan.

#### **Directions:**

Practice your piece selected at your lesson with the metronome at least 5 times per day.

Start with a comfortable setting that you can play absolutely smoothly without mistakes or stumbling.

If you play through well, move your metronome setting up a notch or two and try the music at that new setting.

Try to use at least three different speeds each day. You can try more than three!

Make a note of which speed you ended on at the end of your practice session, and then begin the next day's practice with the previous day's last speed.



If you begin to stumble, that's okay, just move the metronome back down a notch or two.

Watch how magically you'll be able to increase your speed over the week! You must bring this chart with you to your lesson each week, having filled in the metronome speeds for each day of metronome practice in order to qualify for a prize. : )
