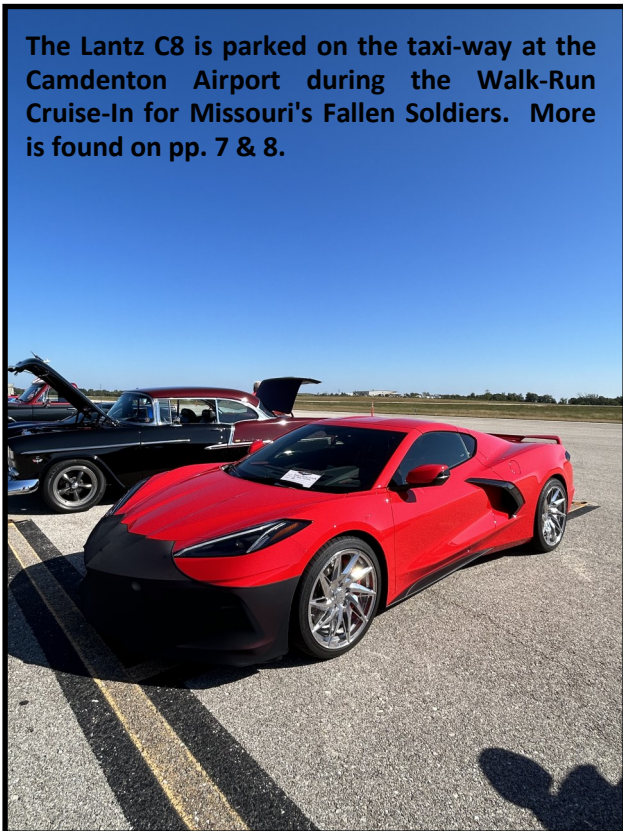

Honoring Veterans at Summer's End Hot Summer Nights

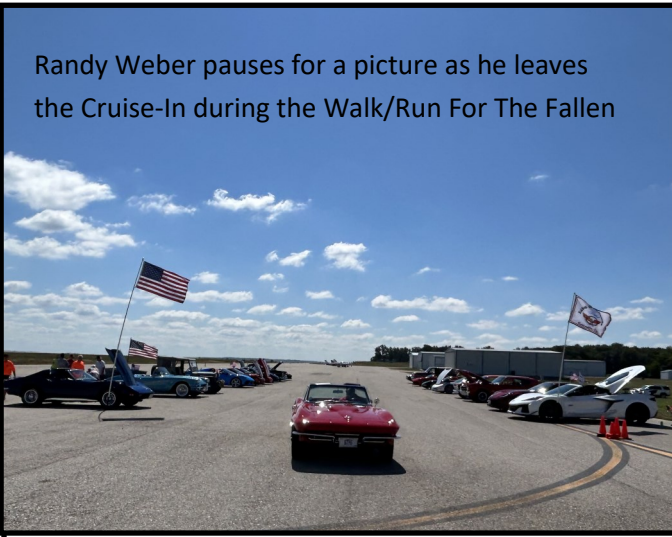

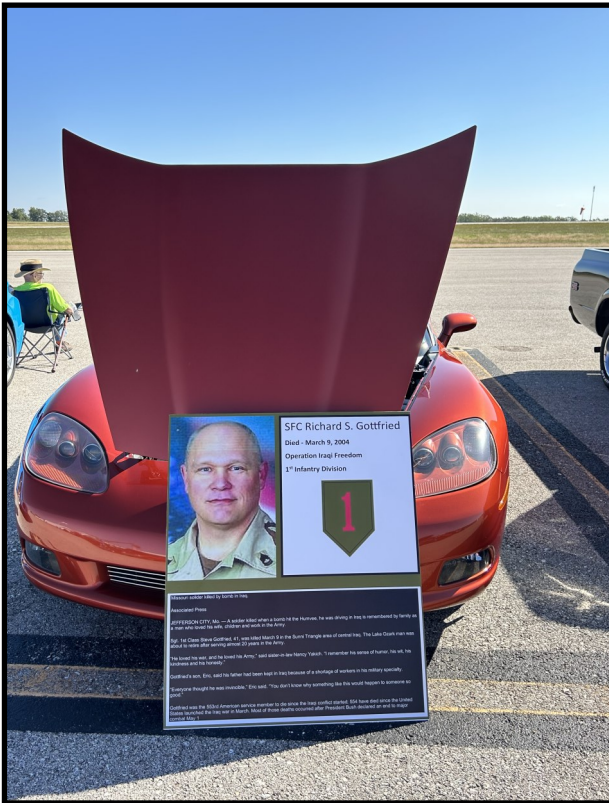

LOCC was invited to coordinate a cruise-in during the 2023 Walk/Run For The Fallen at the Camdenton Airport. The event brings walkers and runners from the local area to walk/run a mile in the name of a Missouri soldier who has made the ultimate sacrifice for our Country since 9/11/2001. LOCC invited car clubs from around the area and ultimately, 15 LOCC Corvettes and 15 additional cars parked on the taxi way at the airport after making a \$10 donation to enter the cruise-in. LOCC also managed a 50/50 drawing for the event which resulted in the winner donating back their winnings. Total, LOCC raised \$ 616 for the event which included a \$100 anonymous donation from one of the cruise-in participants. The money is being presented to the Camdenton Chamber of Commerce to go directly to support rides in one of the bombers at next year's air show, where LOCC will again have a presence on the taxi way. Prior to the walk/run, each of Missouri's fallen soldiers were honored with a solemn ceremony including their picture and home town.



Also, since September is Suicide Prevention Month, a representative from the Truman VA Hospital presented attendees with information regarding the suicide rates for Missouri veterans/soldiers. In 2020, 166 Missouri veterans have taken their own lives. Nationwide, 6100 committed suicide in 2020. The number to a nationwide lifeline is 988 for anyone needing assistance or if you know someone who may need assistance.

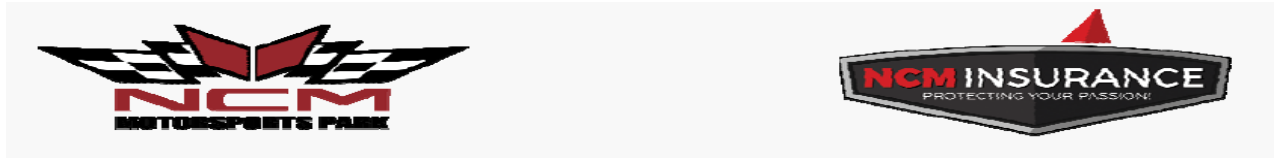
