

When I was a little girl, one year in Sunday School we made silver bells out of Dixie cups and aluminum foil. We used small round ornaments for the ringers and strung the bells together with a combination of yarn and gift wrap ribbon. We would always hang them on the curtain rod right behind the Christmas tree, using of course a paper clip turned inside out and upside down. We would do this, ideally, before decorating the tree.

On more than one occasion through the years, those bells managed to escape our notice when we were un-decorating the house. Out of the direct line of sight until the tree came down, they were often forgotten, and quite honestly forlorn, without all of the other trappings of the season. Once they were discovered, we would hastily remove them and struggle to find a good place to tuck them for another year. After a while, it became somewhat of an inside joke.

But what if it wasn't so much of a joke? What if it was a subtle reminder that the true gift of Christmas lingers long after the tinsel and evergreen boughs are long forgotten? What if they were meant as place holders for the spirit of a season we are often too frantic to appreciate in full? What if they called to mind the familiar carols which herald angels sing?

In Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol, an altogether repentant Ebenezer Scrooge vows, "I will honor Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year. I will live in the Past, the Present, and the Future. The Spirits of all Three shall strive within me. I will not shut out the lessons that they teach." We would do well to do the same. In this new year, may we be ever mindful as our past and our present come together to influence our future. May we listen for the echoes of yesterday amid the cadence of today marching ever onward into tomorrow. May we keep Christmas in our hearts, and maybe in our living rooms, the whole year round!


