

Making space for those things that confound us, we are able to find our footing, to walk with confidence and something like grace.

Like the mud that clung to my sneakers with considerable tenacity, the content of this experience has clung to my soul and my spirit. It suffuses the stuff of my day with glimmers of grace and hints of hope. I would like to provide you the opportunity to engage in a brief Sunday afternoon retreat. On March 10, 2024 following worship, you are invited to share in a meal and a time of spiritual renewal. All are welcome! 
