According to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, the last time a solar eclipse was visible in Ohio was in 1806. The next time a solar eclipse will happen in Ohio is 2099. A total solar eclipse happens when the moon passes between the sun and earth, completely blocking the face of the sun. In the earlier stages of the eclipse; green clothing may seem to appear a bit brighter, and red clothing may seem to fade to a shade of gray.
