	Jennifer J: The OCDSB (English public) high school target opening date has been pushed back until Sept 2025 and construction should start spring of 2023. It will be located at the corner of Spratt & Earl Armstrong with 1516 student spaces, along with two childcare rooms with 39 licensed childcare spaces. The OCDSB has also purchased the land for the	

	future (but not yet funded) OCDSB elementary school on Ralph Hennessy. Spencer W: The OCSB (English Catholic) elementary school has a target opening date of Sept 2024. It will be located at the corner of Solarium & Brian Good with 507 pupil spaces and 2 childcare rooms for 39 childcare spaces. In coming months there will be a public consultation regarding the catchment area for the school (boundary review) and a chance to look at the design plans - the RSCA will share the details for the consultation meeting(s) when they are available.
