



Proudly Working For You

Along with its own comments, KCA collected and submitted more than 175 producer comments regarding the EPA's Waters of the U.S. proposed rule. KCA addressed the overreach of the agency and its attempt to control private property. KCA is proud to stand up for producers against the iron fist of the EPA.

During a November visit to Washington D.C., the KCA Board of Directors and staff met with representatives from Senators Moran's and Roberts' offices. KCA addressed such topics and as support for COOL, the over regulation of the EPA, various water issues, price reporting, the need for competition in the marketplace, and the implementation and enforcement of the packers and stockyards act through the funding of GIPSA rules.

After the general elections, KCA reached out to all elected officials to offer its congratulations. As well, KCA is developing new relationships and expanding existing relationships with legislators. KCA staff is already preparing for the 2015 state legislative session and has already started working on legislative bills.



KCA Visits with USDA to Support Checkoff Reform

With word that USDA is making moves to create another beef checkoff program, earlier this month, Kansas Cattlemen's Association Board of Directors and executive staff went to Washington D.C. and had a sit down one on one meeting with Under Secretary Edward Avalos.

While other groups are blasting USDA for wanting to implement another checkoff, KCA took the time to have a genuine conversation to address the need for reform. Although KCA supports a mandatory yet refundable producer controlled program, there are many problems with the administration of the current system. does not have the authority to change the current beef checkoff system, as the only way to address the problems would be for more than 92,000 producers (operations) to sign a referendum to demand change. Many producers may not see the problems that exist, not because they do not want to know, but because much information is closely quarded. Therefore, if producers want to address the problems within the beef checkoff, the only way to go about it is to support a checkoff that takes the control out of the hands of lobbying groups and gives it back to the people that pay into it.

While in the meeting with Under Secretary Avalos, KCA addressed some of the current flaws in the system. State beef councils use producer money to buy Federation seats with checkoff funds. Yet, the Federation is a division of the policy group National Cattlemen's Beef Association Essentially, all producers are (NCBA). funding NCBA. Although monies can only be used for approved programs, research, and education, it provides leverage for the policy group which also lobbies against the interests of the producers paying into the checkoff. On a national level, both the Federation and the Cattlemen's Beef Board (CBB – an independent group of producers administering the checkoff on the national level) elect 10 members from their respective organizations to sit on the Beef Promotion Operating Committee (BPOC). This 20-member committee makes final national checkoff decisions. Although the Federation is given 50% of the decision making power, the Federation does not contribute 50% of the funds, and there is a clear conflict of interest with the fact that the Federation is a division of NCBA, and NCBA is the largest contractor, receiving almost 90% of checkoff funds; the Federation should not be given the power to direct programs to its own affiliate. Another major concern is that beef checkoff funds may be used to promote USA beef in foreign countries but not allowed to be used to promote USA beef within our own country. In the meeting with USDA, KCA addressed these issues to bring light to the need for reform.

On the state level, there are many flaws as well. With no state law to oversee any state beef checkoff, when trying to address administration of funds left in the state of Kansas, the Kansas legislature defers to the USDA. When addressing those same issues with USDA, producers have repeatedly been told that USDA defers to Kansas Livestock Association (KLA), the administrator of beef checkoff funds left at the state level. Kansas Beef Council (state qualifying beef council) bylaws indicate that the Kansas Livestock Association Executive Vice President appoints the Kansas Beef Council (KBC) members, with the exception that if you serve on CBB, you automatically receive a seat on the KBC. KBC by-laws indicate that all decisions by the Beef Council must be approved by the KLA Board of Directors. This creates an environment in which a policy organization dictates how checkoff funds and programs will be implemented, leaving no fire wall, biases, and even if checkoff funds are used appropriately, it creates an environment where a lobbying group may subsidize its budget with producer checkoff funds. Kansas Beef Council co-mingles its funds with the KLA. This is evidenced in the non-profit IRS form 990 in which the KBC does not file an independent form. As indicated by the 990, KLA supplements its revenue with checkoff funds by using staff, resources, and programs for both entities,. Although this may be legal, it also leverages the lobbying group to free up its own funds to lobby for policy that would not be advantageous for the producers that are paying into the checkoff. There is a lack of transparency at the state level in Kansas. According to USDA and the Kansas Attorney General, beef checkoff information is not subject to the open records act because it is held by a private entity. On multiple occasions, KCA has asked the Kansas Beef Council and KLA for more transparency as to where checkoff money is being used. The only information shared with other groups and producers is a pie chart indicating how much is being spent on promotion, research, education, and administration. KCA believes that true reform would provide more transparency and less leverage to any policy group.

Kansas Cattlemen's Association and thousands of producers across the great state of Kansas believe that cattle producers deserve better than a system that is easily corrupted. The current beef checkoff system has an \$11.20 return on investment. However, the producers paying into the program deserve that return, not any policy organization. In visiting with USDA, KCA expressed its wish for true reform. Although no details have been given as to how the program might be laid out, since the meeting, USDA has asked producers for comments regarding several beef checkoff questions. Comments will be accepted until December 10. KCA has put together a paper outlining its vision for a new beef checkoff program and will be submitting that by the December 10th deadline. All producers are encouraged to also share their support for true checkoff reform.




