Thought for Meditation

In this parable Jesus spoke about two kinds of sheepfolds. In the villages and towns themselves there were communal sheep-folds where all the village flocks were sheltered when they returned home at night. These folds were protected by a strong door of which only the guardian of the door held the key. It was to that kind of fold Jesus referred in John 10:2-3. But when the sheep were out on the hills in the warm season and did not return at night to the village at all, they were collected into sheepfolds on the hillside. These hillside sheepfolds were just open spaces enclosed by a wall. In them there was an opening by which the sheep came in and went out; but there was no door of any kind. What happened was that at night the shepherd himself lay down across the opening and no sheep could get out or in except over his body. In the most literal sense, the shepherd was the door. That is what Jesus was thinking of when he said: "I am the door." Through him, and through him alone, [we] find access to God. "William Barclay

WEAR RED ON PENTECOST! As we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit everyone is encouraged to wear something RED to church on Sunday, May 19. Red signifies the "tongues of flame" that appeared and the disciples at Pentecost, 50 days after the Passover.

TODAY'S MUSIC: Ray Palmer wrote "**My Faith Looks up to Thee**" in 1830, shortly after his graduation from Yale University, while working as a tutor at a New York school. He kept it to himself until meeting composer Lowell Mason on a street in Boston. When Mason asked him to write something for a new hymnal, Palmer dug out his old notes and produced these lyrics, written two years earlier. After taking the lyrics home and reading them, Mason composed the tune, a tune that he named "**Olivet**" (the basis for today's prelude).

Well educated and the product of a Christian home, Joseph Hart was a London school teacher who lapsed into dissolute ways and agnostic thought. In 1757, he was converted at the Moravian Chapel in London. Two years later "Come, Ye Sinners, Poor and Needy" (#486 in our hymnal) was included in his *Hymns Composed on Various Subjects*.

In Hart's picturesque words, a direct invitation is addressed to sinners. In the final stanza comes this insight: "If you tarry till you're better, you will never come at all." That strikes at the root of a common misconception: that we are responsible to somehow patch ourselves up, and improve ourselves to the point where God will accept us. We do not have that power. Only Jesus does. Only by his grace can we be redeemed and transformed.

Karolina (Lina) Wilhelmina Sandell-Berg (1832-1903) is known as the "Fanny Crosby of Sweden." Probably written as a teenager, "Children of the Heavenly Father" (the original title was "no one can be safer") was published when she was 23 or 24. Tragically, the year that saw its publication also saw a string of tragedies in the young woman's life. The loss of several members of her family to disease was followed by the drowning death of her father three years later.

Despite these blows, or perhaps because of them, she continued to write. Many of her hymns were used in Swedish revival services, and a number of them gained popularity during her lifetime, aided by by gospel singer Oskar Ahnfelt. The "Swedish Nightingale" Jenny Lind also promoted Sandell's hymns by singing them in concert and financing their publication.
