

Dear Grace Family,

It is finished! The last of the shoeboxes left Grace Church the Monday before Thanksgiving. In all, 1,647 shoeboxes were collected here during National Collection Week (- 1%), Thank you to all who helped staff the drop-off

center and load the truck, including our Puckety Church volunteers. Special thanks to Jack and Shirley Trinclisti for providing a U-haul truck to transport the cartons to Greensburg. A total of 14,825 shoeboxes were collected in Westmoreland County (+4%). From there they went to one of eight processing centers, most likely Baltimore, MD.

400 of the shoeboxes were packed right here at Grace Church -352 of which were packed at our packing party on November 5^{th} . From the picture below, we had a great turnout and lots of fun. We had originally thought there was shipping for only 352 shoeboxes, so that is what we packed at the packing party. But funds were there to reach 400



shoeboxes, and the remaining shoeboxes were assembled during National Collection week. Thank you to all who made this possible.

During collection week, Don and Sharon Andree, the Area Coordinators for Westmoreland County OCC, presented Grace Church an award recognizing our church for being a Drop-off Location for 15 years! It is a beautiful reminder of what all of us do year round for the children of the world who are in the greatest need of God's love. The statue will be in the Narthex for you to see, and please pay particular attention to the children's faces and feet. In those 16 OCC Collection Weeks, 20,588 shoeboxes have been safely transported from our church to Greensburg!





Hosting Coffee Fellowship Changes for 2024
