In seeking the Lord together, Grace Community Presbyterian is not merely preparing for the arrival of a new pastor, but preparing for the next season of faithful following where the Lord God might be leading in love and service in Jesus name. No doubt, now and in the near future, it will mean wrestling with assessment of our past and its traditions along with discovering the new opportunities that God might just be placing in our paths.

It is my hope that I might be able to contribute in some small way to help us all hear the voice of God not only in who the Lord has called us to be, but what the Lord has called us to do together. I ask you to join with me in prayer, in reflection upon God's Word, in conversation together as a means of taking the opportunity to prepare. To prepare for what God may be doing in this place at this time.





Botswana is a land-locked country, about the size of France, located to the north of South Africa and is home to 2.3 million people. About 70% of its territory is the Kalahari desert with the rest being river plains. Formerly called Bechuanaland, Botswana gained independence from the United Kingdom in 1964 and has main industries of mining (diamond, copper, nickel) and tourism. Botswana has a democratic government and over the past fifty years has developed one of the

higher per-capita incomes among sub-Saharan Africa. Tswana is the major ethnic group and Setswana is the major language; about 79% of the Botswana people are Christians. Below is a picture of children in Botswana receiving shoebox gifts in 2022. Thank you for showing God's love to these children!
