## THOUGHTS ON FIND OF THE MONTH VOTING by Bill Bogynska

There was some confusion at September's meeting about when ballot votes are not tallied which I would like to clear up. I will also give some observations on voting.

To clarify, when there is a voting error in a category, we only disregard the votes in that category and do not throw out the whole ballot.

The example I gave was where somebody voted for the same item \# for both first and second place. We recognize that people vote for themselves, but it would not be fair to vote for yourself more than once in the same category. So that category's votes were thrown out, not the whole ballot.

The most common situation in which we throw out a category's vote is when somebody doesn't vote for all three places, which would skew the voting results. This has been announced numerous times at the meetings.

Another example of when we throw out a category's vote is when there is a nonsensical vote. Suppose gold only has three entries and somebody votes for \#6. Then the vote for that category gets thrown out.

I believe this might happen when people get off a line in their voting. We see ballots with wild voting results, so it appears this is not an uncommon occurrence. Please be careful when you vote.

As I have announced many, many times, please write so that we can read your writing. This is an ongoing problem. We often have trouble with 1's, 7's and 9's and 3's and 8's. At September's meeting, we had a ballot where somebody wrote one number over the top of another number, and we couldn't figure out which one they wanted. Note that at September's meeting, new ballots were introduced which have wider lines to write your votes in. (Thank you Tim for doing these.)

Note that the oldest and most valuable coins are not voted on as these speak for themselves.
I strongly believe that we would get much better voting results if more people voted. More votes gives a better representation of the best items. At September's meeting, we had seventeen ballots, so only about half the people at the meeting voted. We had fifteen people enter finds. So if many of those people are voting for themselves, the results are decided by the second and third place votes and the two people who didn't enter.

This often results in some very close results and winning items that you wouldn't think should win. This is especially true in the token, silver and jewelry categories, where the votes are often really spread out among entries.

For example, at September's meeting, there was a clear winner in the token category with 32 points. Second place had 14 points and third place had 12 points. And, there were three tokens tied for fourth place with 10 points each. So one or two more ballots could have completely changed the second and third place results.

I have not voted in the Find of the Month for years, other than to break ties (which I generally do not believe in). After considering the above, my vote is important and I will start voting in 2017. I tend to vote for older relic type items over newer items, and more valuable items over blingy items. For example, in artifact, I would vote for an old military button over a Mexico bottle opener or a Mickey Mouse keychain.

The golden rule of voting should be to vote for the item that you think is best or you would most want to find. If this is your item, that is fine. But it's ridiculous to see a wheat penny entered in US coin with one first place vote. This situation happens in every category every month.

It's frustrating when you have an item that you feel should win that doesn't. It happens to everybody. As you can see from the above, it's often close and many factors can come into play. But the other side of this is that sometimes you might win with an item that maybe really shouldn't. It happens. In the long run it tends to even out.
